THE HAWKS

- → Although SJU lost its top two scorers from last season (Shavar Newkirk, James Demery), the Hawks welcome back two of the leaders from 2016-17 Lamarr Kimble and Charlie Brown, Jr.- who were both sidelined for the 2017-18
- → Saint Joseph's leading returning scorer from last year is sophomore **Taylor Funk** (11.8 ppg), while top rebounder **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (6.8 rpg) is also back
- → In 2017-18, SJU won seven of its last nine games to end the year at 16-16. The Hawks posted a 10-8 record in conference play to earn the fourth seed in the tournament, and reached the A-10 Semifinals, falling three points short of the championship game
- → Tonight's matchup features teams that were picked at the top of their respective conferences in preseason polls. The Hawks were voted second in the Atlantic 10's poll while Old Dominion was picked to finish third in Conference USA
- → Saint Joseph's is 10-3 in season openers in the past 13 years, winning five of the last seven. The Hawks lost at Toledo last season, and suffered an even bigger loss when guard **Lamarr Kimble** reinjured his foot and was subsequently sidelined for the rest of the year
- → This season, the Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September (more on pg. 4)

- SJU defeated the Monarchs in dramatic fashion in the last meeting at the 2015 Hall of Fame Tipoff consolation game at Mohegan Sun Arena. Shavar Newkirk took an inbounds pass from current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bembry and hit a short jumper with:01 left to lift the Hawks to the 66-64 win.
- That meeting was the first in 11 seasons for the two teams, after they had played almost every year in the late 1990's and early 2000's.

PICKING THE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's is picked second in the A-10 Preseason Poll, which is the highest for the Hawks since the 2012-13, when they were tabbed first
- Last year's squad was picked third in the poll, and despite two key injuries, finished fourth in the league and reached the semifinals while posting a 16-16 overall record
- Lamarr Kimble and Charlie Brown, Jr., were each named to the 2018-19 Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Third Team

THEY'RE BACK

- Two of SJU's leading scorers from two seasons ago Lamarr Kimble and Charlie Brown, Jr. will be making their return to the court this season
- Kimble, who averaged 15.5 points per game in 2016-17, reinjured his left foot in the 2017-18 season opener and missed the remainder of the season. Kimble originally suffered the fracture in February of 2017 which caused him to miss the final seven games of the year
- Brown never got his 2017-18 season underway as he fractured his left wrist in preseason practice. He underwent surgery and was sidelined for the whole year. As a freshman, Brown averaged 12.8 points per game to earn a spot on the 2017 A-10 All-Rookie Team

RETURNING CAST

- Among the Hawks' other key returnees are:
- Taylor Funk (So.) Team's leading returning scorer from last season (11.8) and the leader in three-point field goals (84), setting a new SJU freshman record
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) Top rebounder with 6.8 average and 3.0 assists per game
- Chris Clover (Sr.) Starter in 28 games last year, averaging a career-best 8.2 points
- Anthony Longpré (So.) Played in all 32 games as a freshman

NEW TO THE FOLD

- The Hawks welcome three scholarship newcomers in **Jared Bynum** (Fr.), **Troy Holston** (Gr. transfer) and **Ryan Daly** (Jr. transfer)
- Bynum, a point guard from Georgetown Prep averaged over 17 points and six assists last year. He was the IAC Player of the Year and an All-Met selection
- Holston joins the Hawks from South Florida, where he played two seasons while battling knee injuries. Holston, who received his bachelor's degree last spring, averaged 9.7 points in 2016-17. He has two years of eligibility at SJU, effective immediately
- Daly comes "home" to SJU, transferring from Delaware. A native of nearby Ardmore, Pa., Daly scored 1,000 points in two seasons at Delaware and earned All-CAA honors twice.

SJU connections run in his family as both of his parents are alums and his late grandfather, Jim Boyle, was the Hawks' head coach from 1981 to 1990. Daly will have two years of eligibility at SJU after sitting out this season

• Junior **Greg Smith** also joins the Hawks as a walk-on this year

SEEING RED

- SJU's roster is dotted with five players who have redshirted at least one season while on Hawk Hill. Although that number seems unusually high, it is actually tied for the fifth most in the nation. Four schools (CSU Bakersfield, Rider, UCF, Saint Mary's) lead with nine each while Colorado State, Florida Gulf Coast, Norfolk State and Wisconsin have eight redshirts on their active rosters
- Saint Joseph's redshirts are:
- **Charlie Brown, Jr.** (R-So.) missed the 2017-18 season with shoulder injury
- **Lorenzo Edwards** (R-So.) had shoulder surgery during this freshman year
- Lamarr Kimble (R-Jr.) reinjured his foot in the first game of 2017-18 and underwent surgery, missing all but one game
- **Markell Lodge** (R-Sr.) redshirted his first year to concentrate on academics
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) sat out his sophomore season after having surgery to correct a chronic knee condition

DEAN OF COACHES

- **Phil Martelli** enters his 24th season as head coach and is the dean of the Atlantic 10's coaches. He owns an overall record of 430-309 and is SJU's all-time leader in victories
- Martelli owns a 212-164 record in Atlantic 10 play, which ranks second all-time and first among active coaches for conference wins
- Martelli is one of 25 active D-1 coaches who are their schools' all-time wins leaders

FROM THE START

- **Jared Bynum** becomes the sixth freshman in six years to be in the starting lineup on opening day
- Previous freshman starters for SJU were: **Anthony Longpré** (2017-18), **Charlie Brown** (2016-17), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (2015-16), James Demery (2014-15) and current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bembry (2013-14)

WISE BEYOND THEIR YEARS

- **Phil Martelli** has commented that the Hawks are an "older" team this year with five players who have redshirted previous seasons, including one graduate student (**Troy Holston**)
- The average age of the Hawks' scholarship players is 21 years old
- Markell Lodge and Troy Holston are both

- 23, while **Pierfrancesco Oliva** and Lamarr Kimble are each 22 years old
- The following are the Hawks' "redshirts" with their respective seasons on campus:
 - Markell Lodge (5th)
 - Pierfrancesco Oliva (4th)
 - Lamarr Kimble (4th)
 - Lorenzo Edwards (3rd)
 - Charlie Brown (3rd)
- **Troy Holston** is in his first season at SJU after transferring from South Florida. He played two seasons with the Bulls while battling knee injuries
- Also waiting in the wings is transfer Ryan Daly, who played two years at Delaware and will be sitting out this season

STRONG FINISH

- Despite facing its second straight season with key injuries in 2017-18, the Hawks came on strong at the end of the year and finished with a 16-16 record
- SJU closed out the regular season winning three straight and six of its last seven to finish in fourth place with a 10-8 record
- The Hawks defeated George Mason in the A-10 Quarterfinals for their fourth straight win but were edged by top-seeded Rhode Island, 90-87, in the semifinals

PERENNIAL CAPTAIN

- Redshirt junior **Lamarr Kimble** was voted team captain for the third consecutive season
- As a sophomore, Kimble became just the third player in Hawk history to be named a captain in his second season
- He is the only player in program history to serve as captain for three years

EARLY-SEASON SLATE

- Saint Joseph's will take part in the inaugural Myrtle Beach Invitational from November 15-18 in Conway, S.C.
- The Hawks open play in the tournament against Wake Forest, marking the first time the schools will meet since the 2004 NCAA Sweet 16. Led by Jameer Nelson, SJU defeated Wake Forest, 84-80, for its 30th victory and advanced to the Elite Eight to meet Oklahoma State

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- One of the highlights of the schedule will be a date with 2018 NCAA Final Four team Loyola Chicago on December 22 at the historic Palestra
- The Hawks will also take on defending national champion Villanova on December 8 in the Wildcats' new Finneran Pavilion
- In addition to Villanova and Loyola Chicago, SJU has four opponents on its schedule which reached last year's NCAA Tournament -

Davidson, St. Bonaventure, Penn and Rhode Island. Possible Myrtle Beach Invitational opponents West Virginia and Cal State Fullerton also made the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18

THE INJURY PLAGUE

- Last season was the second consecutive in which the Hawks faced significant injuries to key players
- In 2017-18, **Lamarr Kimble** (foot) and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, (wrist) were lost for the year. Kimble played in only the season opener and Brown was sidelined in the preseason
- The previous year saw four players miss time with injuries. They were, with games missed: Shavar Newkirk (19), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (entire season), **Lorenzo Edwards** (all but one game) and **Lamarr Kimble** (7)

HONORING THE COACH

- The Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September
- McKinney was head coach at Saint Joseph's for eight seasons, from 1966 to 1974. He compiled a 144-77 record and owns the third best all-time winning percentage (65.2 pct) among SJU coaches
- McKinney took the Hawks to postseason play five times in his eight years, which included four NCAA Tournament appearances
- He went on to coach in the NBA, although a serious accident cut short his season with the Lakers in 1979. He rebounded to earn NBA Coach of the Year honors with the Indiana Pacers in 1981

HAWKS IN THE NBA

- Saint Joseph's is represented in the NBA by two players:
- Langston Galloway (Pistons) was undrafted in 2014 but made the Knicks' squad as a free agent; played for the Pelicans and Kings before joining the Pistons in 2017-18
- DeAndre' Bembry (Hawks) 21st overall draft pick in 2016 by Atlanta, who was the 33rd SJU player to be drafted, and the sixth to be taken in the first round

HOME AT HAGAN

- This marks the 10th season of the Hawks' home, Hagan Arena, after Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse underwent a renovation and expansion in 2008-09
- SJU is 81-43 at Hagan but owns an all-time record of 400-125 in 68 years on campus
- The Hawks went 10-3 at home in 2017-18

BACK TO BROOKLYN

• The Hawks are happy about the return to the Barclays Center for the A-10 Championship as

- The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven SJU graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates.

PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach 24th Season - 430-309

With the 2018-19 season marking his 24th as the head basketball coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coach-

es in the school's storied history and is one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 430-309. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in his 23 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 212-164 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

Martelli Highlights:

- He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last seven years, and 13 times in the 23 seasons previous to this one, while winning three Atlantic 10 Championships (1997, 2014, 2016)
- Martelli's 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history
- Despite injuries to two key players, his 2017-18 squad won seven of its last nine games, to finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 and reach the conference semifinals
- His 2015-16 team compiled a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team, won its second Atlantic 10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004
- Four of his players have been named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year, with the most recent being DeAndre' Bembry in 2015-16
- In 2013-14, his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé as SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut in overtime
- Seven players have reached the NBA, including first round draft picks DeAndre' Bembry (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) and a second-round selection, Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2015. Galloway (Detroit) and Bembry (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA
- In 2003-04, he guided a squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball the Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, were the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Elite Eight
- Joined with Jameer Nelson to sweep the National Coach and Player of the Year awards in 2004, marking one
 of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school
- Current member of the NCAA Division I Basketball Oversight Committee; previously served the game as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors, and the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition
- Is very involved with Coaches vs. Cancer, is the past chair of the National Council, and the co-chair of the Philadelphia chapter, which is one of the largest fundraising groups in this effort in the nation
- Was the co-recipient of the Circle of Honor Award given by the American Cancer Society in 2017, honored along with Temple's Fran Dunphy
- Has spent a total of 34 years with the Hawks' program, serving as an assistant coach for 10 years prior to attaining the top job in July, 1995

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk is in its 63rd year in 2018-19.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The stu-



dent government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Domenic Godshall will serve as the Saint Joseph's University Hawk mascot for the 2018-19 season, becoming the 39th student to represent the University in this role. He is a senior sports marketing major from Lititz, Pa.

ON THE AIR

TV/VIDEO: Saint Joseph's fans will be able to watch all 31 men's basketball regular-season games either on television or through digital media. A total of 21 Hawks' games this season will be televised nationally while 10 will be streamed digitally. Nine games will appear on the subscription-based ESPN+.

RADIO: All 31 Saint Joseph's men's basketball regular-season games will be broadcast on radio, with Talk Radio 1210 WPHT airing the majority of games. It marks the second consecutive year of a partnership with the station. The Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of Matt Martucci and Lunardi will return for their 10th season together, with Lunardi marking his 29th year as the Hawks' color analyst. Also calling play-by-play on selected games for the second straight year is Pat McCarthy. (Schedule on pg. 2)

INTERNET: Information for Saint Joseph's basketball is found at SJU's athletics website, **www.SJUHawks.com** with statistics, updated game notes, and live in-game statistics for all Hawk home games, and selected road games. Through Hawks All-Access, fans can follow every home game through audio streaming, along with video features and highlights.

PHIL MARTELLI'S HAWKTALK RADIO SHOW: Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" Radio Show takes place every Monday from 7 to 8 p.m., with the broadcast live from JD McGillicuddy's in Havertown, Pa.
