## **THE HAWKS**

- → SJU won its second straight by defeating Monmouth, 78-63, on Monday night at Hagan Arena. **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half to key the win. **Lamarr Kimble** added 19 points and **Pierfrancesco Oliva** had his second game with double-figure rebounds (10). **Lorenzo Edwards** scored a career-high 11 points off the bench
- → Saint Joseph's has won both games this year by 15-point margins and almost identical scores (79-64, 78-63)
- → The Hawks own a 7-9 record in early-season tournaments over the past five years. Last season SJU participated in the Wooden Legacy in Fullerton, Calif., and in 2016-17, was at the Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, V.I.
- → SJU is 2-0 for the first time since 2016-17
- → This season, the Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September (more on pg. 4)
- → SJU will play either UCF or Cal State Fullerton on Friday at 11 a.m. or 1 p.m

- The last meeting between the teams was during the Hawks' memorable 2003-04 season. SJU defeated Wake Forest, 84-80, in the NCAA East Regional Semifinals in East Rutherford, N.J., to advance to the Elite Eight
- The top-seeded Hawks erased a nine-point first half deficit to overtake the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons. The Hawks shot 50 percent from the field in the win, while also hitting 12-of-24 three-point attempts
- National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson scored 24 points, as did backcourt mate Delonte West.
   Pat Carroll chipped in 17 points in the victory, which was SJU's school-record 30th of the year
- The teams also met in the 1962 NCAA Tournament, in which Wake Forest scored a 96-85 overtime win in College Park, Md.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- Charlie Brown, Jr., scored 19 of his gamehigh 21 points in the second half as Saint Joseph's pulled away from Monmouth, 78-63, at Hagan Arena for its second win. Lamarr Kimble added 19 points and redshirt sophomore Lorenzo Edwards scored a career-high 11 points
- After playing just five first-half minutes after picking up two fouls, Brown scored eight straight to open the second half, giving SJU a 37-25 lead. That started a 14-5 run for the Hawks which saw them gain a 43-28 advantage in the first four minutes of the second
- Another 8-0 run by SJU, which included a three-point play from Brown, gave the Hawks a 19-point margin, 55-36, their biggest of the game at 11:26. Monmouth would come no closer than 13 points the rest of the way

## **FLYING START**

- SJU got the year off to a good start, defeating Old Dominion, 79-64. **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, had 20 points in his return to action after missing last season with a wrist injury, while **Pierfrancesco Oliva** posted the first double-double of his career
- Freshman **Jared Bynum** scored 14 points in his collegiate debut while backcourt mate **Lamarr Kimble** also had 14 as he was back on the court after a foot injury sidelined him last season

## WHEN WE LAST MET

- The last meeting between Saint Joseph's and Wake Forest was memorable for Hawk fans, as it vaulted SJU into the NCAA Elite Eight
- It came during SJU's magical run in 2003-04 which saw the Hawks go 27-0 during the regular season, earn the nation's top ranking for a week and receive the school's first-ever top seed in the NCAA Tournament
- Led by the Consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson, the Hawks defeated Wake Forest in the East Regional Semfinals, 84-80, to earn a date with Oklahoma State
- Saint Joseph's would fall two points short to Oklahoma State, 64-62, in its bid to reach the Final Four
- The Hawks finished the year at 30-2 and **Phil Martelli** was named the Consensus National Coach of the Year

## YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN

- Charlie Brown, Jr., has regained his form and already notched two games of 20-plus points. He scored 19 in the second half vs. Monmouth after sitting for all but five minutes in the first due to foul trouble (2 fouls)
- "That's what he can do. He can score baskets. The put-back on an air ball was a big play. You

have a guy that's going to score 21 points in 23 minutes; he did that in one of our scrimmages, so we know that. But we have to have balanced play in order for him to be a featured player," said **Phil Martelli** 

## **CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN**

- Redshirt junior **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** was voted team captain for the third consecutive season, becoming the only player in SJU history to serve as captain for three years
- As a sophomore, Kimble became just the third player in Hawk history to be named a captain in his second season
- Kimble's leadership is appreciated by **Phil Martelli**: "I'm glad he's on my team and I'm glad he's in my program because whatever I need... He's in charge of that locker room... 'Fresh' is just legit. He's one of those guys that embraces being a Philadelphian and playing in Philadelphia.... I'm a big 'Fresh' fan, forget the basketball playing. He is the epitome of a captain."

## **LOOK AT LORENZO**

- **Phil Martelli** stated in the preseason that redshirt sophomore **Lorenzo Edwards** was one player who had made the biggest strides over the summer
- Edwards gave a glimpse of that improvement as he came off the bench to score 11 points in 15 minutes vs. Monmouth, making 5-of-7 from the field

## THEY'RE BACK

- Two of SJU's leading scorers from two seasons ago Lamarr Kimble and Charlie Brown, Jr. are making their return to the court this season
- Kimble, who averaged 15.5 points per game in 2016-17, reinjured his left foot in the 2017-18 season opener and missed the remainder of the season. Kimble originally suffered the fracture in February of 2017 which caused him to miss the final seven games of the year
- Brown never got his 2017-18 season underway as he fractured his left wrist in preseason practice. He underwent surgery and was sidelined for the whole year. As a freshman, Brown averaged 12.8 points per game to earn a spot on the 2017 A-10 All-Rookie Team
- The duo showed no signs of rust in the opener as Brown scored a team-high 20 points, while hitting 4-of-6 from three-point range and Kimble tallied 14 points

#### **CHECK IT OUT**

- Pierfrancesco "Checco" Oliva had a stellar season debut, coming off the bench to record the first double-double of his career against ODU
- The redshirt junior scored 17 points and grabbed 14 rebounds, while shooting 6-of-9 from the field
- Phil Martelli said that although he doesn't like labels, "Oliva is the epitome of a point-forward". The coach also revealed that Oliva deferred his starting role to **Anthony Longpré** but is averaging 28 minutes off the bench

#### A GOOD SIGN

- The Hawks shot 77.3 percent from the foul against Old Dominion, making 17-of-22
- SJU struggled last year, converting 68.7 percent as a team

#### **PICKING THE HAWKS**

- Saint Joseph's is picked second in the A-10 Preseason Poll, which is the highest for the Hawks since the 2012-13, when they were tabbed first
- Last year's squad was picked third in the poll, and despite two key injuries, finished fourth in the league and reached the semifinals while posting a 16-16 overall record
- Lamarr Kimble and Charlie Brown, Jr., were each named to the 2018-19 Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Third Team

## **RETURNING CAST**

- Among the Hawks' other key returnees are:
- Taylor Funk (So.) Team's leading returning scorer from last season (11.8) and the leader in three-point field goals (84), setting a new SJU freshman record
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) Top rebounder with 6.8 average and 3.0 assists per game
- Chris Clover (Sr.) Starter in 28 games last year, averaging a career-best 8.2 points
- Anthony Longpré (So.) Played in all 32 games as a freshman

## **NEW TO THE FOLD**

- The Hawks welcome three scholarship newcomers in **Jared Bynum** (Fr.), **Troy Holston** (Gr. transfer) and **Ryan Daly** (Jr. transfer)
- Bynum, a point guard from Georgetown Prep averaged over 17 points and six assists last year. He was the IAC Player of the Year and an All-Met selection
- Holston joins the Hawks from South Florida, where he played two seasons while battling knee injuries. Holston, who received his bachelor's degree last spring, averaged 9.7 points in 2016-17. He has two years of eligibility at SJU, effective immediately

- Daly comes "home" to SJU, transferring from Delaware. A native of nearby Ardmore, Pa., Daly scored 1,000 points in two seasons at Delaware and earned All-CAA honors twice. SJU connections run in his family as both of his parents are alums and his late grandfather, Jim Boyle, was the Hawks' head coach from 1981 to 1990. Daly will have two years of eligibility at SJU after sitting out this season
- Junior **Greg Smith** also joins the Hawks as a walk-on this year

## **SEEING RED**

- SJU's roster is dotted with five players who have redshirted at least one season while on Hawk Hill. Although that number seems unusually high, it is actually tied for the fifth most in the nation. Four schools (CSU Bakersfield, Rider, UCF, Saint Mary's) lead with nine each while Colorado State, Florida Gulf Coast, Norfolk State and Wisconsin have eight redshirts on their active rosters
- Saint Joseph's redshirts are:
- Charlie Brown, Jr. (R-So.) missed the 2017-18 season with shoulder injury
- **Lorenzo Edwards** (R-So.) had shoulder surgery during this freshman year
- Lamarr Kimble (R-Jr.) reinjured his foot in the first game of 2017-18 and underwent surgery, missing all but one game
- Markell Lodge (R-Sr.) redshirted his first year to concentrate on academics
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) sat out his sophomore season after having surgery to correct a chronic knee condition

## **DEAN OF COACHES**

- **Phil Martelli** enters his 24th season as head coach and is the dean of the Atlantic 10's coaches. He owns an overall record of 432-309 and is SJU's all-time leader in victories
- Martelli owns a 212-164 record in Atlantic 10 play, which ranks second all-time and first among active coaches for conference wins
- Martelli is one of 25 active D-1 coaches who are their schools' all-time wins leaders

## FROM THE START

- Jared Bynum becomes the sixth freshman in six years to be in the starting lineup on opening day
- Previous freshman starters for SJU were: **Anthony Longpré** (2017-18), **Charlie Brown** (2016-17), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (2015-16), James Demery (2014-15) and current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bembry (2013-14)

## WISE BEYOND THEIR YEARS

• Phil Martelli has commented that the Hawks are an "older" team this year with five players who have redshirted previous seasons, including one graduate student (Troy Holston)

- Despite facing its second straight season with key injuries in 2017-18, the Hawks came on strong at the end of the year and finished with a 16-16 record
- SJU closed out the regular season winning three straight and six of its last seven to finish in fourth place with a 10-8 record
- The Hawks defeated George Mason in the A-10 Quarterfinals for their fourth straight win but were edged by top-seeded Rhode Island, 90-87, in the semifinals

#### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- One of the highlights of the schedule will be a date with 2018 NCAA Final Four team Loyola Chicago on December 22 at the historic Palestra
- The Hawks will also take on Big 5 rival nad defending national champion Villanova on December 8 in the Wildcats' new Finneran Pavilion
- SJU has four more opponents on its schedule which reached last year's NCAA Tournament Davidson, St. Bonaventure, Penn and Rhode Island. Possible Myrtle Beach Invitational opponents West Virginia and Cal State Fullerton also made the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18

## THE INJURY PLAGUE

- Last season was the second consecutive in which the Hawks faced significant injuries to key players
- In 2017-18, Lamarr Kimble (foot) and Charlie Brown, Jr., (wrist) were lost for the year. Kimble played in only the season opener and Brown was sidelined in the preseason
- The previous year saw four players miss time with injuries. They were, with games missed: Shavar Newkirk (19), Pierfrancesco Oliva (entire season), Lorenzo Edwards (all but one game) and Lamarr Kimble (7)

## **HONORING THE COACH**

- The Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September
- McKinney was head coach at Saint Joseph's for eight seasons, from 1966 to 1974. He compiled a 144-77 record and owns the third best all-time winning percentage (65.2 pct) among SJU coaches
- McKinney took the Hawks to postseason play five times in his eight years, which included four NCAA Tournament appearances
- He went on to coach in the NBA, although a serious accident cut short his season with the Lakers in 1979. He rebounded to earn NBA Coach of the Year honors with the Indiana Pacers in 1981

#### HAWKS IN THE NBA

- Saint Joseph's is represented in the NBA by two players:
- Langston Galloway (Pistons) was undrafted in 2014 but made the Knicks' squad as a free agent; played for the Pelicans and Kings before joining the Pistons in 2017-18
- DeAndre' Bembry (Hawks) 21st overall draft pick in 2016 by Atlanta, who was the 33rd SJU player to be drafted, and the sixth to be taken in the first round

## **HOME AT HAGAN**

• This marks the 10th season of the Hawks'

- home, Hagan Arena, after Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse underwent a renovation and expansion in 2008-09
- SJU is 83-43 at Hagan but owns an all-time record of 402-125 in 68 years on campus
- The Hawks went 10-3 at home in 2017-18 and are 2-0 this year

## **BACK TO BROOKLYN**

• The Hawks are happy about the return to the Barclays Center for the A-10 Championship as the arena has been good to them in the past. Saint Joseph's last two Atlantic 10 titles have been won on that court, in 2014 and 2016

#### **CRADLE OF COACHES**

- The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven SJU graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates.

# PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach 24th Season - 432-309

With the 2018-19 season marking his 24th as the head basketball coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coach-

es in the school's storied history and is one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 432-309. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in his 23 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 212-164 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

#### Martelli Highlights:

- He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last seven years, and 13 times in the 23 seasons previous to this one, while winning three Atlantic 10 Championships (1997, 2014, 2016)
- Martelli's 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history
- Despite injuries to two key players, his 2017-18 squad won seven of its last nine games, to finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 and reach the conference semifinals
- His 2015-16 team compiled a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team, won its second Atlantic 10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004
- Four of his players have been named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year, with the most recent being DeAndre' Bembry in 2015-16
- In 2013-14, his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé as SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut in overtime
- Seven players have reached the NBA, including first round draft picks DeAndre' Bembry (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) and a second-round selection, Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2015. Galloway (Detroit) and Bembry (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA
- In 2003-04, he guided a squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball the Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, were the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Elite Eight
- Joined with Jameer Nelson to sweep the National Coach and Player of the Year awards in 2004, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school
- Current member of the NCAA Division I Basketball Oversight Committee; previously served the game as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors, and the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition
- Is very involved with Coaches vs. Cancer, is the past chair of the National Council, and the co-chair of the Philadelphia chapter, which is one of the largest fundraising groups in this effort in the nation
- Was the co-recipient of the Circle of Honor Award given by the American Cancer Society in 2017, honored along with Temple's Fran Dunphy
- Has spent a total of 34 years with the Hawks' program, serving as an assistant coach for 10 years prior to attaining the top job in July, 1995

## THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk is in its 63rd year in 2018-19.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The stu-



dent government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

**Domenic Godshall** will serve as the Saint Joseph's University Hawk mascot for the 2018-19 season, becoming the 39th student to represent the University in this role. He is a senior sports marketing major from Lititz, Pa.

## **ON THE AIR**

**TV/VIDEO:** Saint Joseph's fans will be able to watch all 31 men's basketball regular-season games either on television or through digital media. A total of 21 Hawks' games this season will be televised nationally while 10 will be streamed digitally. Nine games will appear on the subscription-based ESPN+.

**RADIO:** All 31 Saint Joseph's men's basketball regular-season games will be broadcast on radio, with Talk Radio 1210 WPHT airing the majority of games. It marks the second consecutive year of a partnership with the station. The Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of Matt Martucci and Lunardi will return for their 10th season together, with Lunardi marking his 29th year as the Hawks' color analyst. Also calling play-by-play on selected games for the second straight year is Pat McCarthy. (Schedule on pg. 2)

**INTERNET:** Information for Saint Joseph's basketball is found at SJU's athletics website, **www.SJUHawks.com** with statistics, updated game notes, and live in-game statistics for all Hawk home games, and selected road games. Through Hawks All-Access, fans can follow every home game through audio streaming, along with video features and highlights.

**PHIL MARTELLI'S HAWKTALK RADIO SHOW:** Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" Radio Show takes place every Monday from 7 to 8 p.m., with the broadcast live from JD McGillicuddy's in Havertown, Pa. Live streaming audio is on SJUHawks.com while the show will also be podcast on Talk Radio 1210's website for listening anytime.
