2006-07 PREVIEW

Youth will be served with the Saint Joseph's Hawks as veteran coach **Phil Martelli** puts one of his youngest groups ever on the floor in 2006-07. But despite the lack of experience, SJU will be suited for the challenge with an emerging and talented group of juniors and sophomores joining forces with one of the most highly-touted recruiting classes in Martelli's tenure.

Four starters and the team's top three leading scorers are gone from the 2005-06 squad which made another impressive late-season surge, falling just one point short of the Atlantic 10 title and a bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Hawks reached the postseason for the sixth straight year, but the run ended in the NIT second round with a two-point loss to Hofstra.

Martelli credited his seniors – Chet Stachitas, Dwayne Lee, Dave Mallon and Rob Sullivan – for the late-season success, as SJU went from 10-12 in February to win nine of the last 11, again showing that Martelli has his teams playing their best basketball when the games count. That effort was similar to 2004-05, when the Hawks won 21 games after January and came within two points of the NIT championship. The 19-14 record in '05-06 gave the Martelli and the Hawks an impressive 141-54 mark over the past six seasons, an average of 23 wins per year.

With those seniors gone, **Rob Ferguson**, **Ahmad Nivins** and **Pat Calathes** are the players who own the most actual game experience. The lone senior on the team is seldom-used center **Artur Surov**, while junior **Arvydas Lidzius** returns to court after redshirting 2005-06.

The lack of experience doesn't alarm Martelli, who has dealt with key personnel changes before, seeing three players go to the NBA in the last four years. "What you do is study the team that you have and the team that you're building. We know that we're going to be young on the perimeter but they've had remarkable high school careers, and winning experiences," said Martelli of the freshman class. "But you're also anticipating real breakthrough development by guys like Ahmad Nivins or Pat Calathes. The older guys now have to take on real leadership. Rob Ferguson has to be not only a different player but a different teammate than he's had to be in his first few years. And the same goes for Artur (Surov) and Arvydas (Lidzius). I think that you look for natural development and improvement and you have a shot here of real gifted

winning players who are going to have to be ready when the ball goes up."

The newcomers who will need to be ready are Pennsylvania All-State First Team guards **Darrin Govens**, **D.J. Rivera** and **Garrett Williamson**; Delaware's Player of the Year, **Jawan Carter**; and Virginia standout **Rockwell Moody**, who all come from successful high school programs. "They've all been in winning circumstances, and they all appreciate and love winning. Now we have to teach them the sacrifices they have to make to win at this level," said

the coach, now in his 12th season on Hawk Hill.

"Balance is going to be a needed strength for this team. We're going to need to be able to score the ball in and around the basket and we're going to have to develop some perimeter shooting. Defensively, we've always been able to rely on our older guys and in this case, this team may not have a lot of older guys on the floor. So I think that teaching and precise scouting reports are really going to be crucial to this team. Attention to detail is going to be important," stated Martelli, who needs 13 victories to surpass Hall of Famer Jack Ramsay for second place on SJU's all-time list.

FRONT COURT

Rob Ferguson, the lone starter from last year, is the team's leading returning scorer (10.3 ppg) after the transfer of Abdulai Jalloh (15.0 ppg) and will be counted on even more this season. The 6-8 junior, who redshirted 2003-04, has always possessed the offensive skills, but last year gained the confidence he needs to be considered among the conference's elite. Ferguson has good range, shooting 50 percent and 39 percent from behind the arc.

"I've always felt that Rob has All-League talent. He is going to have to be a guy that we should be able to identify as one of the best players in this league. I think that the way he carries himself is different now, and his self-confidence has really been boosted. There are going to be dark times where he will feel troubles but he's got to be able to overcome those because all eyes are on him now," said Martelli.

Atlantic 10 All-Rookie performer **Ahmad Nivins**, a 6-9 sophomore, joins Ferguson in the frontcourt and is another player who showed glimpses of his tremendous potential. Although he began his college career in the starting lineup, he finished the year in a reserve role as Martelli deferred to senior Dave Mallon's leadership on defense. Nivins wowed the SJU fans on many occasions with his athleticism and shot-blocking prowess. He averaged 6.1 points, 5.0 rebounds and 1.3 blocked shots, and his continued development will be one of the keys to the Hawks' success.

"When you're All-Rookie, that's a step in the right direction. But this is the season we look for the growth and the jump. My measuring stick is the jump that Delonte West made. He didn't play as much as a freshman, but sophomore year he was the most improved player in the city and the league, and first team All-League. That would be an attainable jump for Ahmad," said the coach.

Sophomore **Alvin Mofunanya** got a significant taste of the college game in his first year, even making two starts. The 6-8 forward has made the commitment to increase his strength and if he hones his skills, should see more playing time.

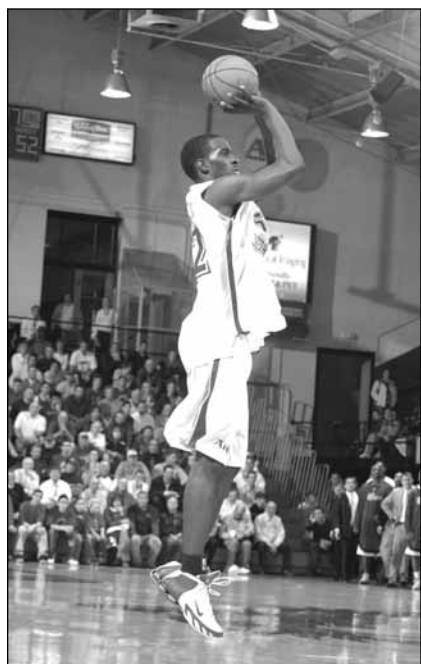
Rockwell Moody is a 6-9 forward from Bishop O'Connell High School in Virginia, who earned All-State honors. Moody is expected to be able help right away on defense and with the rebounding, while further developing his offensive skills.

A pair of international players are the upperclassmen and they will continue to challenge for playing time. Lidzius is a hard-nosed player whose toughness was missed by the Hawks last season, while Surov, a 7-1 center, has good touch around the hoop. Walk-on **Marcus Mitchell** will add depth.

BACK COURT

The Hawks have undoubtedly been a perimeter team over the past few years but that look could be different for at least for the early part of this season, as SJU will feature an untested backcourt. And in time, the backcourt should become an exciting one with a number of talented young players.

The most experienced guard is 6-10 junior **Pat Calathes** (4.8 ppg, 3.5 rpg), whose breakthrough became one of the bright spots in the latter part of the season. A point guard by nature, his height creates

matchup problems for the opponents, along with his ball-handling skills and ability to see over the defense. At the end of last season, Calathes showed a much-improved shooting stroke and an aggressiveness that helped him average 10.7 points, 5.1 rebounds and 2.4 assists down the stretch. Martelli is confident that the hard-working junior will continue his progress this season. "His growth in the back end of the year was due to his work in practice. Mark Bass deserves a lot of credit for that. He stayed with him. Pat didn't give up on himself and he clearly had a much better picture of what we were trying to do. I think with this team we'll be less reliant on his ball skills and more reliant on his running and creativity. What we need from him is growth defensively and continued growth and understanding," said the head coach.

The point guard duties will fall into the hands of two talented freshmen, **Jawan Carter** and **Darrin Govens**. Carter was the 2006 Delaware Player of the Year as he led the Tatnall School to the state title. The 6-0 guard averaged 29 points and seven assists while finishing his career as the state's all-time leading scorer with 2,464 points.

Govens hails from Chester High School, the same program as SJU great Jameer Nelson, and established his own legacy there. He was the Class 4A Pennsylvania Player of the Year for consecutive seasons, earned All-State First Team honors and helped Chester to the 2005 state title. As a senior, he averaged 17.9 points and 4.4 assists, and tallied 1,598 points in his career.

The coach prefers to stay away from labeling the guards. "With Darrin and Jawan, we're not going to get hung up on point guard or shooting guard – they're simply guards. And they will be successful here when they embrace that. But it will be unique to play two primary ball handlers."

Another highly-touted local product is 6-2 guard **D.J. Rivera**, who earned All-State and All-Catholic League honors in helping Neumann-Goretti High School to its second straight Catholic League title. He scored 17.7 points per game and is the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,122 points. Martelli points to his athleticism, toughness and ability to become a top-notch defender as the reasons to expect Rivera to contribute immediately.

Garrett Williamson is a 6-4 swing player who joined Govens and Rivera on the All-State team. He helped Lower Merion to its second consecutive state title and finished his career with 1,349 points, ranking second at the school to Kobe Bryant. Williamson possesses a solid knowledge of the game and strong passing skills.

Edwin Lashley is a sophomore who is expected to continue his development and challenge the newcomers for playing time. The 6-4 guard saw limited action last season, but possesses the long-range shooting skills the Hawks will need with the departure of players such as Stachitas, Lee and Jalloh.

Junior **Pete Kathopoulos** is a hard-working guard who adds depth, and consistently pushes the regulars in practice. SJU's practices will also be bolstered with the addition of Iowa State transfer **Tasheed Carr**. The 6-4 guard, who hails from Philadelphia, will sit out this season, but have two years of eligibility beginning in 2007-08.

THE SCHEDULE

Saint Joseph's schedule will again be strong as the Hawks face 10 teams that reached postseason play in 2006, including NCAA participants Bucknell, George Washington, Penn, Villanova and Xavier.

"The schedule is always set up for the challenges that you're going to face in the Atlantic 10. It does have a better balance of home and away than last year's. I think that's going to be important considering the youth of this team, to have a balance," said Martelli. "They will have experiences that they will remember – playing at Louisville, in Madison Square Garden, and an opportunity to compete against nationally-ranked teams like Xavier, George Washington and Villanova. I also

believe UMass is going to be a nationally-ranked team when all is said and done. We've always created the schedule to prepare us for the Atlantic 10 and also to create memories for these players that they can talk about in years to come."

Martelli said, "The expectations never change. I just want this team to be highly competitive and very well organized, which they will be, and at the end, for the players, for the coaches, and the staff, for the fans to be able to say that that team gave maximum effort. And this team will give maximum effort."

Preseason Notes

- **Phil Martelli** owns the most Atlantic 10 wins among active coaches with 114. His winning percentage in conference games (.647) is also the highest among active coaches who have been in the league for more than one season.

- With 13 wins this season, **Phil Martelli** can surpass Hall of Famer Jack Ramsay on SJU's list for coaching victories. Ramsay totalled 234 in 11 seasons (234-72 record from 1955-66) while Martelli's 11-year record currently stands at 222-125. Bill Ferguson owns the most wins in Saint Joseph's history with 309 over the course of 25 seasons. Martelli has also won the most postseason games of any SJU coach, with a 17-8 record, and has taken the Hawks to a postseason tournament eight times in 11 years.

- SJU has compiled a 141-54 record in the past six seasons, with six consecutive postseason berths.

- Saint Joseph's was the nation's top free-throw shooting team in 2005-06, hitting 79.9 percent. Among the returning players, **Rob Ferguson** converted 80.4 percent, **Pat Calathes** shot 89.5 percent and **Ahmad Nivins** made 70.6 percent of his attempts.

- Saint Joseph's will return to one of its favorite arenas, Madison Square Garden, to participate in the Holiday Festival with Hofstra, St. John's and Boston University. The Hawks have played at MSG in each of the last three years, posting a 3-1 mark during that time. In 2004, SJU opened the season vs. Gonzaga in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. The 2005 season ended in New York in the championship game of the NIT, with a last-second loss to South Carolina. The Hawks then played Kansas in the Jimmy V Classic last season, scoring a 70-67 win.

- Incoming freshmen - **Darrin Govens**, **D.J. Rivera** and **Garrett Williamson** - held three of the five spots on the Pennsylvania All-State 1st Team as chosen by *Associated Press*. Rounding out the highly-recognized class, **Jawan Carter** was an All-State honoree and Delaware's Player of the Year, while **Rockwell Moody** garnered Virginia Independent Schools All-State recognition. Four of the players were 1,000-point scorers in their scholastic careers- Carter (2,462); Govens (1,598), Williamson (1,349) Rivera (1,122). The four combined amassed a total of 6,531 points. SJU's recruits also come from successful high school programs. Carter (Tatnall School), Williamson (Lower Merion) and Moody (Bishop O'Connell) saw their teams each win state titles while Govens' Chester squad reached the title game (vs. Lower Merion) and Rivera's Neumann-Goretti team captured the Philadelphia Catholic League title.

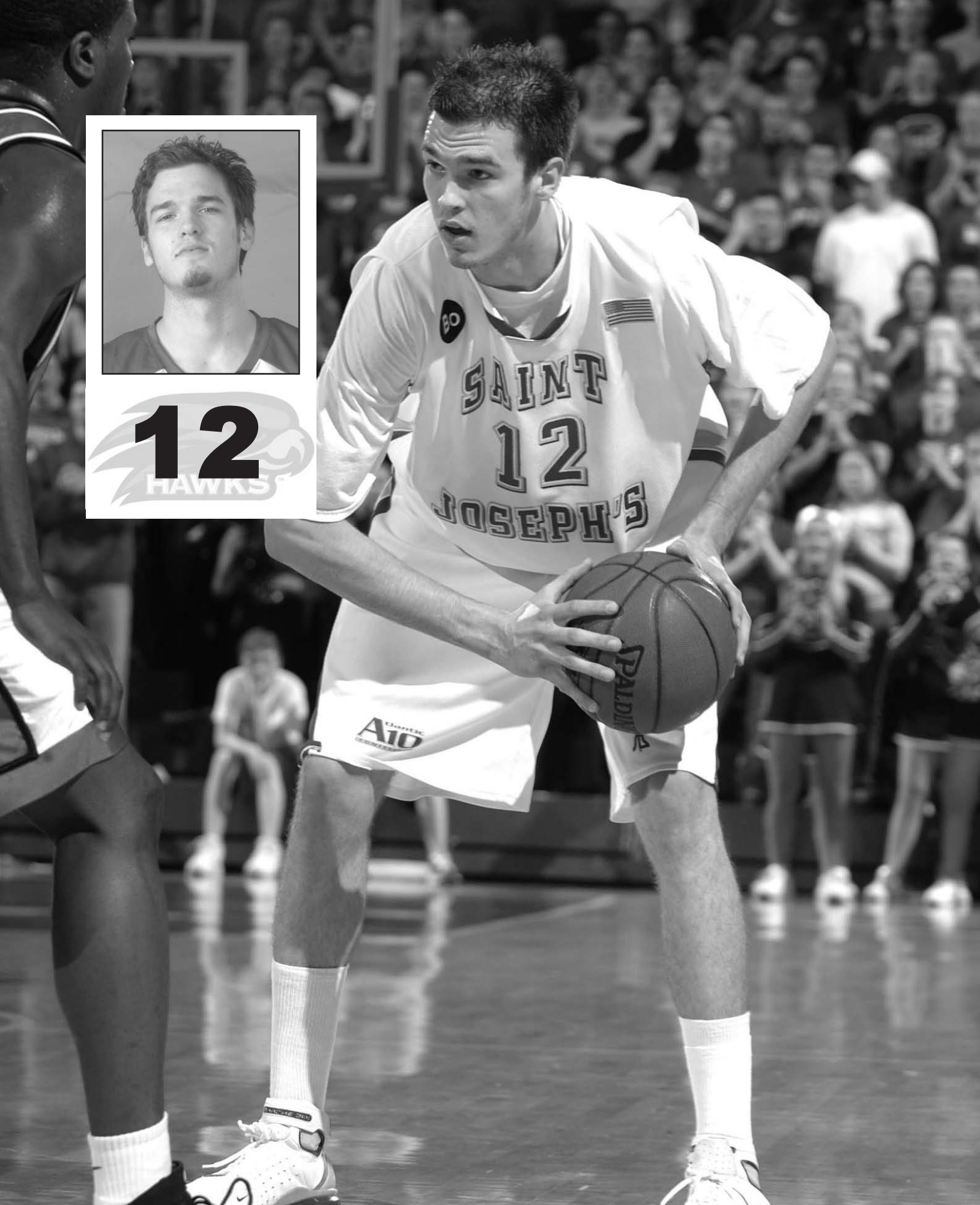

2005-06: Emerged as a key player down the stretch, averaging 10.7 points, 5.1 rebounds and 2.4 assists in final seven games... Had four double-figure scoring games, shot 48.2 percent (27-for-56) from the field and made 15 of 16 free throws during that span... Had a career-high 17 points at Duquesne while grabbing a personal best eight rebounds... Matched that career-high with 17 points against Hofstra in the NIT... Overall, averaged 4.8 points and 3.5 rebounds... Made the first start of his career against Kansas with a second career start at Temple... Appeared in all 33 games, seeing action at both guard spots.

2004-05: Played in 28 games, primarily as backup point guard... Tallied a career-high nine points at San Francisco... Handed out four assists against La Salle... Shot 2-for-3 from the field and had six points and three assists in first collegiate game at #2 Kansas... Saw the majority of his playing time in the first half of the season.

High School/Personal: All-State All-Central Florida First Team selection in 2004... Named the 2004 Seminole County Athletic Conference Player of the Year, and chosen to the All-County First Team... Averaged 20.5 points, 9.1 rebounds and 2.5 assists... Led the Lake Howell Silver Hawks to a 28-5 record and the runner-up spot in the Class 5A tournament... That team started three freshmen and posted the best season in school history, which included a 14-game winning streak and the Seminole Athletic Conference title... Helped team reach Florida 5A Final Four as a junior, averaging 12.4 points and 5.6 rebounds... Began high school as a 5-11 point guard and encountered a tremendous growth spurt to reach 6-10 his senior year... Played at Lake Howell with his twin brother, John Jr., and younger brother Nick, who will play for the University of Florida beginning in 2006-07... Marketing major... Born December 12, 1985.
