

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14university, 21-sport league that is hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The 14 member institutions of the A-10 are united and strengthened by their diversity. Each is extraordinary in its educational mission, whether of a Catholic faith, a private university or a land grant institution. The varied pursuits of each member prove that there are many threads that weave the fabric for a great conference.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions, in conjunction with Atlantic 10 Commissioner Bernadette V. McGlade, have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation a successful one. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its studentathletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized 1,199 student-athletes in the Fall 2009 while 1,181 were named to the Spring 2010 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes. In 2009-10, nearly 200 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition, while Xavier's Kelly Ruth and Charlotte's Adam Gross along with Lauren Olson and Whitney Roth of Saint Louis received postgraduate scholarship grants.

The Atlantic 10 has 59 of the 841 Division I sports teams being honored with public recognition awards for their latest multi-year Academic Progress Rate scores. This represents an increase of nine A-10 teams from last season and 25 two years ago. All 14 A-10 institutions had at least one program recognized, while twelve schools had multiple teams garner distinction. In addition, all 21 sports sponsored by the conference were represented by at least one A-10 program. Among the 31 Division I conferences, only the Atlantic 10, the Ivy Group and the Patriot League had each of its member institutions receive public recognition awards for one or more programs.

Among the 21 sports sponsored by the conference, women's tennis had a league-high six A-10 teams honored, while five teams earned distinction in both men's and women's outdoor track & field and men's indoor track & field. Overall, Fordham had a

league-best 11 teams recognized in conference-sponsored sports, followed by Saint Joseph's and Xavier with seven apiece.

The Atlantic 10 also boasts 65 teams with a perfect graduation rate according to the NCAA Graduation Success Report on Division I student-athletes. Moreover, five A-10 institutions enjoy average graduation rates of 90 percent or higher in league-sponsored sports, led by Dayton's average graduation rate of 97.38 percent. The Flyers are followed by George Washington (94.10), Xavier (93.23), La Salle (90.40) and Fordham (90.13). The A-10 features eight women's tennis and women's soccer programs that enjoy a 100 percent graduation rate, while six men's teams in both golf and tennis have a 100 percent graduation rate.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 74 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

SAINT JOSEPH'S SPORTS NETWORK



The Saint Joseph's Sports Network (SJSN) celebrates its 20th anniversary in 2010-11, as the first broadcasts of men's and women's basketball games took place in 1990. The first men's game aired on WCZN-AM on November 28, 1990 as the Hawks visited Drexel. The 1990-91 season also marked the first in school history in which every SJU men's game aired on Philadelphia-area commercial radio.

Since 1990, SJSN's coverage of Hawk athletics has grown and includes Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* radio program and the nationally-renowned *HawkTalk* television show.

In 2010-11, selected SJU games will be carried on 50,000-watt WNTP 990 AM, a station that has a long history of broadcasting college basketball in Philadelphia. (full schedule on www.sjuhawks.com) All of SJU's men's games can also be heard through audio streaming at the Hawks' official athletics site, www.sjuhawks.com, free of charge through Stretch Internet. Video streaming of non-televised games is also available on the site as part of the Hawks All-Access package.



Matt Martucci PLAY-BY-PLAY ANNOUNCER

Matt Martucci is in his second season as the Hawks' play-by-play announcer. He has been with the Saint Joseph's Sports Network since 2006 and had previously been the backup play-by-play announcer for men's basketball games. He has also

served as the announcer for women's basketball game broadcasts over the internet.

Martucci has worked as the producer for both Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* television and radio shows for the past three years while also developing video content for www.sjuhawks.com.

A 2006 graduate of Syracuse University's Newhouse School of Communications, he was the director of broadcasting/account executive for the minor league baseball team the Atlantic City Surf for two seasons. Martucci has broadcast college basketball and football for Lincoln University, Lock Haven University and Syracuse University, in addition to high school football in Williamsport, Pa.

Martucci began his broadcasting career with WAER at Syracuse University, and has also worked with ESPN Radio 1450 in Atlantic City.

A native of Brodheadsville, Pa., he is currently pursuing his master's in business administration from Saint Joseph's.





Joe Lunardi COLOR ANALYST

Joe Lunardi enters his 21st season on the Saint Joseph's Sports Network as radio color analyst. He also serves as the co-host of Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* radio and television shows.

Lunardi is the assistant vice president for marketing communications at Saint Joseph's where he oversees institutional marketing and branding, program advertising, web content, and other integrated communications initiatives.

A 1982 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Lunardi returned to his alma mater in 1987 as director of media relations. He has also served as director of external relations, director of university communications, and assistant vice president for university communications. He was named to his current post in August 2006.

Away from the University, Lunardi is the nationally-known "bracketologist" for ESPN, ESPN Radio, and ESPN.com. His ESPN.com bracketology site generates over 10 million hits per season. He correctly forecast 64 out of 65 NCAA Tournament teams last season and has covered over 800 Hawk games in his career.

In 1995 and 2004, Lunardi received the William J. Bennett Award for dedication and loyalty to the SJU men's basketball program. Lunardi and his wife, Pam, a 1984 SJU graduate, reside in Drexel Hill, Pa., with their daughters, Emily and Elizabeth.

PHIL MARTELLI'S HAWKTALK


The most unique coach's show in the nation, Phil Martelli's HawkTalk television show returns for its 15th year in 2010-11. Through the years, Martelli has continued to provide a different twist on the traditional coach's show, hosting a "Tonight Show" format. Some obligatory game highlights are included, but the emphasis is on jokes and lighthearted interviews. In 2001, The Sporting News called HawkTalk the "nation's best coach's show."

Martelli hosts the unscripted half-hour show, and in addition to trading barbs with co-host Joe Lunardi, he interviews guests ranging from Saint Joseph's students to family members to high-ranking politicians. Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell has been among the high-profile guests on <code>HawkTalk</code> over the past few years, along with former Philadelphia Eagles player Jon Runyan, author and <code>Washington Post</code> columnist John Feinstein, SJU coaching legend Jack Ramsay, former Philadelphia Phillies pitcher Mitch Williams and SJU alum Vince Papale, whose story was told in the 2006 major motion picture <code>Invincible</code>.

HawkTalk continues to be taped on campus and for five of the last seven years, the show was taped in front of a live studio audience consisting of SJU students, faculty and staff. It had a new look in 2009-10, with the set moving to the lobby of Hagan Arena.

The show airs weekly from January to March in the Philadelphia region on Comcast SportsNet.


HAWKS ON TV

Saint Joseph's will again have a presence on television in 2010-11, with at least seven games scheduled for regional/local coverage and three to be televised nationally.

The Hawks will take on rival Villanova on December 3 for an ESPNU telecast, while SJU's battle with Temple on January 29 from the Palestra will also be seen on the network.

Saint Joseph's will be part of ESPN's College Hoops Marathon on November 16 when the Hawks visit Penn State, with the game being streamed live on ESPN3.com.

This year's national television coverage is highlighted by the Atlantic 10's partnership with ESPN and its family of networks. Among the league contests that are scheduled to be televised nationally are games that will be carried on the CBS College Sports Network, while others will be part of CBS College Sports' syndication package.



Saint Joseph's will have four games that are part of CBS College Sports Network's syndication package. The Fordham, Xavier and Temple (Feb. 20) games will be televised on Comcast SportsNet in Philadelphia, while the Massachusetts contest (Feb. 23) will be seen on The Comcast Network.

In addition to regional broadcasts of Atlantic 10 Tournament games, the 2011 A-10 Men's Basketball Championship will be televised nationally on CBS for the second year in a row.

Why S-a-i-n-t Joseph's University?


The corporate title "S-a-i-n-t" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the public title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts.

The vast majority of academic and government publications have referred to Saint Joseph's University since at least 1986, as have most campus references with the exception of athletics. However, university-wide "image campaign" revealed the need to clarify this policy both internally and externally.

According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them – Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia – is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of Saint Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

Style information for print, electronic and digital media is available. It includes accepted abbreviations of the corporate name (e.g., "SJU" or "St. Joe's" in headlines or certain informal references) as well as prohibited usages (e.g., partial abbreviations such as "St. Joseph's" or "Saint Joe's").

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials for media covering Saint Joseph's at Hagan Arena in 2010-11 should be made at least 24 hours in advance by contacting Marie Wozniak.

Priority is given to daily newspapers, radio/TV stations and other media who cover Saint Joseph's and its opponents on a regular basis. Internet sites and agencies that will be considered for credentials include those of national cable networks or established publications. Internet sites representing local or regional media outlets will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. Websites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are able to post anonymous information are ineligible for consideration of credentials.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers attending Saint Joseph's home basketball games must be credentialed. Requests for credentials should be made in at least 24 hours in advance to Marie Wozniak. Due to space demands, access to freelance photographers is limited.

SCOUT CREDENTIALS

Credentials for NBA scouts must be requested in advance of the game by contacting Marie Wozniak.

RADIO POLICY

Radio stations designated as the primary visiting outlet can have access to phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line per game. (\$200 for ISDN), unless a reciprocal usage agreement exists. Visiting radio stations wishing to broadcast the game should contact Marie Wozniak at (610) 660-1727 or by email (mwozniak@sju.edu) to arrange phone lines.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Phil Martelli and the Saint Joseph's players must be arranged through Marie Wozniak. Advance notice of at least 24 hours is preferred, but every attempt will be made to accommodate all requests. Players will not be available for interviews on game day, except for post-game interviews.

The Atlantic 10 conducts a teleconference with each of its head men's basketball coaches every Monday beginning in January. Media members should contact the A-10 for the schedule of coaches and the call-in number.

PRESS ROW

Only accredited members of the media and accredited scouts will be issued credentials to cover Saint Joseph's basketball, and only those with passes will be permitted to sit in press seating. Members of the media are reminded that press row is a working area and cheering for either team will not be tolerated.

MEDIA SERVICES

Saint Joseph's and opponent's game notes, statistics, Atlantic 10 Conference notes and game programs will be available to working members of the media. Halftime statistics will be available in the media room at Hagan Arena and will also be distributed on press row. Final statistics will be distributed in the media room following completion of the game. Fax service is available at both locations.

Complete Saint Joseph's game notes will be available 24 hours prior to the game on SJUHawks.com.

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking is available at the ROTC Lot on 54th Street behind Hagan Arena. Media members desiring to be on the parking list must contact Marie Wozniak at least 24 hours in advance of the game.

POST-GAME


