ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The 14 member institutions of the A-10 are united and strengthened by their diversity. Each is extraordinary in its educational mission, whether of a Catholic faith, a private university or a land grant institution. The varied pursuits of each member prove that there are many threads that weave the fabric for a great conference.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 74 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this year: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions, in conjunction with Atlantic 10 Commissioner Bernadette V. McGlade, have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation a successful one. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its studentathletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized 1,297 student-athletes in the Fall 2010, while 1,329 were named to the Spring 2011 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes.

The Atlantic 10 has 56 of the 909 Division I sports teams being honored with public recognition awards for their latest multi-year Academic Progress Rate scores. Twelve A-10 institutions had at least one program recognized, while 11 of those 12 schools had multiple teams garner distinction. In addition, all 21 sports sponsored by the conference were represented by at least one A-10 program. Among the 31 Division I conferences, the Atlantic 10 ranked fifth behind the Ivy Group (135), the Patriot League (82), the Big East (77) and the ACC (61).

In 2010-11, the Atlantic 10 also announced that the A-10 Council of Presidents adopted a


five-year Strategic Initiative Plan, comprised of four emphasis areas, including: 1) Conference Membership; 2) Student-Athlete Experience; 3) Competitive Operating Standards; 4) Conference Brand, Equity, and Revenue Resources. With the adoption of the Strategic Initiative Plan serving as the foundation for the future, the Atlantic 10 Conference is committed to providing quality competition while further strengthening its academic and athletic integrity as a premier Division I conference in the nation.

The Saint Joseph's Sports Network (SJSN) marks its 21st year of operation in 2011-12. Since its beginnings in 1990, SJSN's coverage of Hawk athletics has grown and included Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* radio program and the nationally-renowned *HawkTalk* television show, which ran for 15 years.

Saint Joseph's men's basketball will have a new radio home beginning in 2011-12, as every game will be broadcast on one of the top sports radio stations in the nation, SportsRadio 610 WIP. This marks the most comprehensive radio package for Hawk basketball since the 2005-06 season. The station will also be the home for Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* radio show, which will air on Monday evenings from January to March.

Hawk fans everywhere will be able to hear the broadcast of every game through audio streaming at the Hawks' official athletics site, www.SJUHawks.com, which is provided free of charge through Stretch Internet. (Broadcast schedule on page 2)





Matt Martucci

Matt Martucci is in his third season as the Hawks' play-by-play announcer. He has been with the Saint Joseph's Sports Network since 2006 and has also served as the announcer for women's bas-

ketball game and baseball broadcasts over the internet.

Martucci has worked as the producer for both Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* television and radio shows and currently serves as the on-air talent for audio and video features on Hawks' All-Access.

He has worked with 97.5 The Fanatic since March 2011 as the morning update anchor during ESPN's *Mike and Mike in the Morning*.

A 2006 graduate of Syracuse University's Newhouse School of Communications, he was the director of broadcasting/account executive for independent league baseball team Atlantic City Surf for two seasons. Martucci has broadcast college basketball and football for Lincoln University, Lock Haven University and Syracuse University, in addition to high school football in Williamsport, Pa.

Martucci began his broadcasting career with WAER at Syracuse University, and has also worked with ESPN Radio 1450 in Atlantic City.

A native of Brodheadsville, Pa., he is currently pursuing his master's in business administration from Saint Joseph's.



Joe Lunardi COLOR ANALYST

Joe Lunardi enters his 22nd season on the Saint Joseph's Sports Network as radio color analyst and has served as the co-host of Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk*, both on radio and television.

Lunardi is the assistant vice president for marketing communications at Saint Joseph's where he oversees institutional marketing and branding, program advertising, web content, and other integrated communications initiatives.

A 1982 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Lunardi returned to his alma mater in 1987 as director of media relations. He has also served as director of external relations, director of university communications, and assistant vice president for university communications. He was named to his current post in August 2006.

Away from the University, Lunardi is the nationally-known "bracketologist" for ESPN, ESPN Radio, and ESPN.com. His ESPN.com bracketology site generates over 10 million hits per season. He correctly forecast 64 out of 65 NCAA Tournament teams last season and has covered over 800 Hawk games in his career.

In 1995 and 2004, Lunardi received the William J. Bennett Award for dedication and loyalty to the SJU men's basketball program. Lunardi and his wife, Pam, a 1984 SJU graduate, reside in Drexel Hill, Pa., with their daughters, Emily and Elizabeth.

Phil Martelli's HawkTalk radio show is aired weekly from January through March on its new home, SportsRadio 610 WIP. The show will be broadcast live on Monday evenings from JD McGillicuddy's in Havertown, Pa. During the hour-long show, Martelli and co-host Joe Lunardi field questions from callers and the on-location audience.



Basketball was often the secondary topic on Phil Martelli's HawkTalk when the SJU coach and co-host Joe Lunardi got together on the most unique coach's show in the country. HawkTalk will air on SJUHawks.com this year, providing more SJU fans access to the show.

Phil Martelli's HawkTalk TV Show

For 15 seasons, **Phil Martelli** hosted the most unique coach's show in the nation with *HawkTalk*, which was televised in Philadelphia on Comcast SportsNet. The unscripted half-hour show provided a different twist on the traditional coach's show, with a "Tonight Show" format, putting the emphasis on jokes and lighthearted interviews. In 2001, *The Sporting News* called it the "nation's best coach's show."

Over the years, the guests ranged from Saint Joseph's students to Martelli family members to sports celebrities and politicians. Former Pennsylvania governor Ed Rendell was among the high-profile guests on *HawkTalk* along with former Philadelphia Eagles player Jon Runyan, author and *Washington Post* columnist John Feinstein, SJU greats Jack Ramsay and Jameer Nelson, former Philadelphia Phillies pitcher Mitch Williams, Philadelphia Flyers great Bernie Parent and SJU alum Vince Papale, whose story was told in the 2006 major motion picture *Invincible*.

In 2011-12, *HawkTalk* will be broadcast as part of Hawks' All-Access on SJUHawks.com. This internet version of the show will provide the opportunity for more SJU fans from around the world to view the show.

HAWKS ON TV

Saint Joseph's will again have a presence on television in 2011-12, with at least eight games scheduled for regional/local coverage and three to be broadcast nationally.

The Hawks' early-season battle with Georgia Tech at the Charleston Classic on November 17 will be seen on ESPN3.com and in Philadelphia on The Comcast Network (TCN). The rivalry game with Villanova on December 17 will also be televised nationally by CBS College Sports, while the meeting with Temple on February 25 can be seen on ESPNU.

This year's television coverage is highlighted by the Atlantic 10's partnership with ESPN and its family of networks. Among the league contests that are scheduled to be televised nationally are games that will be carried on the CBS College Sports Network, while others will be part of CBS College Sports' syndication package.



Saint Joseph's will have two games that are part of CBS College Sports Network's syndication package. The contest at Xavier will be shown locally on TCN as will the meeting with La Salle on February 4. Saint Joseph's has also secured a package of games with the following games airing on TCN: American (Dec. 4), Creighton (Dec. 10), Dayton (Jan. 25) and Saint Louis (Feb. 8). The George Washington (Feb. 18) game will air on Comcast SportsNet (Pa.)

In addition to regional broadcasts of all Atlantic 10 Tournament games from Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, the 2012 A-10 Men's Basketball Championship will be televised nationally on CBS for the third year in a row, on March 11 at 1 p.m.

Why S-a-i-n-t Joseph's University?

The corporate title "S-a-i-n-t" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the public title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts.

The vast majority of academic and government publications have referred to Saint Joseph's University since at least 1986, as have most campus references with the exception of athletics. However, university-wide "image campaign" revealed the need to clarify this policy both internally and externally.

According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them – Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia – is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of Saint Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

Style information for print, electronic and digital media is available. It includes accepted abbreviations of the corporate name (e.g., "SJU" or "St. Joe's" in headlines or certain informal references) as well as prohibited usages (e.g., partial abbreviations such as "St. Joseph's" or "Saint Joe's").

SCOUT CREDENTIALS

Credentials for NBA scouts must be requested in advance of the game by contacting Marie Wozniak.

RADIO POLICY

Radio stations designated as the primary visiting outlet can have access to phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line per game. (\$200 for ISDN), unless a reciprocal usage agreement exists. INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Phil Martelli and the Saint Joseph's players must be arranged through Marie Wozniak. Advance notice of at least 24 hours is preferred, but every attempt will be made to accommodate all requests. Players will not be available for interviews on game day, except for post-game interviews.

The Atlantic 10 conducts a teleconference with each of its head men's basketball coaches every Monday beginning in January. Media members should contact the A-10 for the schedule of coaches and the call-in number.

Media parking is available at the ROTC Lot on 54th Street behind Hagan Arena. Media members desiring to be on the parking list must contact Marie Wozniak at least 24 hours in advance of the game.
