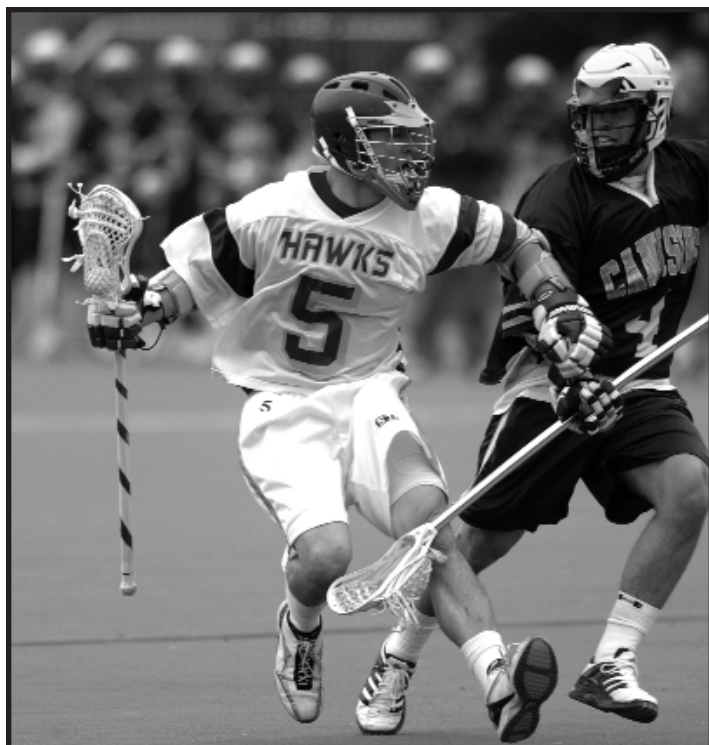

SEASON PREVIEW

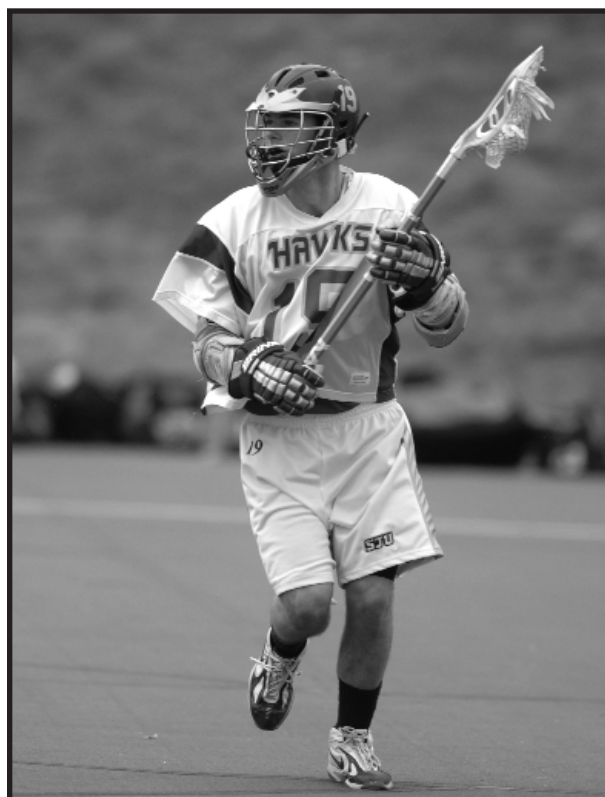
Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse head coach **Pat Cullinan** welcomes back seven starters and an experienced squad in 2007 as the Hawks look to improve on last season's fourth place finish in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. Cullinan's charges have shown improvement over his first two seasons at the helm, and the 2006 MAAC Coach of the Year has no reason to expect this trend to change.

The Hawks will be led by three captains in 2007. Senior midfielder **Alex McColough**, senior attacker **Mike O'Neill**, and junior defenseman **Pat Maxey** will fill the crucial leadership roles vacated by the graduation of All-MAAC Second Team selections Andrew Four and Keegan Wilkinson. O'Neill, a Second Team honoree last season, has been named to the Preseason All-MAAC squad by the league's coaches.

The Hawk attack should be a fearsome one, as the squad returns five of its top seven scorers from 2006. O'Neill was second on the team with 31 points (19 goals, 12 assists), and he should be able to improve on those numbers this season after recovering from an injury that sidelined him for last season's final three games. Junior attacker **Steve Varga** also returns, looking to follow up on his 27-goal performance in 2006 with another solid campaign. McColough, the fourth Hawk named to the All-MAAC Second Team, added 25 points of his own (16G, 9A), while junior midfielder **Steve O'Brien** (7G, 9A) and sophomore attack **Alex Lopes** (6G, 4A) round out the quintet. Sophomore midfielder **Ryan Tessler** is the top returning face-off man, winning 41 draws in 2006. Midfielder **Zach Charles** appeared in 13 games last season, and is one of just five seniors/graduate students on the roster. Adding depth to the Hawk rotation will be junior attackmen **Sean Kelly** and **Patrick McEvoy** as well as sophomore attacker **Chris O'Neill**.

Defensively, the Hawks have been a stingy bunch under Cullinan's tutelage, and that shouldn't change during the 2007 season. Returning to the lineup after a year studying abroad will be senior **Kyle Hofstaedter**. Hofstaedter participated in the 2006 World Lacrosse Championships, playing for the Netherlands. He will be joined on the Hawk backline by Maxey, the junior co-captain. Maxey started all 15 games for the Hawks in 2006, and was second on the team with 32 ground balls. Also returning is sophomore **Pat Williams**, who started 12 games and picked up 26 ground balls. Sophomore defenseman **Tom Wengenosky** played in 10 games last season, starting eight, and will add size and strength to the defensive corps. In goal, the Hawks return sophomore **Erik Hotaling**. Hotaling started all 15 games between the pipes for SJU and set a single-season school record with a goals-against average of 8.06 for the year. He also led the squad with 38 ground balls. Hotaling was rewarded for his performance when he was the lone Hawk named to the All-MAAC First Team.

This season, Saint Joseph's will face four high-profile opponents in the non-conference portion of its schedule. The Hawks will open with back-to-back road tilts against perennial powers Delaware and Navy. SJU will also travel to Durham, NC to take on Duke, a team ranked sixth in the Inside Lacrosse preseason poll. The schedule concludes with a trip to State College, PA for a matchup with another top-notch squad, Penn State. The non-conference schedule also features a home game with Drexel and road games at Quinnipiac, Villanova, and Lehigh. During the conference slate, the Hawks will host Manhattan, Marist, VMI, and Wagner while traveling to Providence, Canisius, Mount St. Mary's, and Siena.

Lebanon Valley '79 - 3rd Season

Pat Cullinan enters his third season as the head coach of the Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse program and his fourth year overall at SJU. He previously spent 15 years at West Chester, the final four as the Rams head coach, twice earning New York Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors.

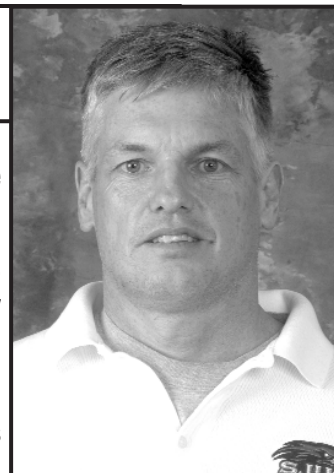
While at West Chester, Cullinan led the Golden Rams to the ECAC Division II Championship game in 1999 and 2002 and finished the 2003 season ranked ninth in the nation. He also was the director of the Golden Ram Boy's Lacrosse Camp and organized both a coaches and players clinic for the Chester County Youth Lacrosse Association.

Prior to taking over as head coach at WCU in 1999, he spent a decade (1989-99) as a Ram assistant. He was instrumental in guiding West Chester to a pair of ECAC Division II titles in 1994 and 1998.

Before making the move to the collegiate level, Cullinan started the lacrosse program at Glen Mills High School and was the head coach for six years (1981-87).

Cullinan is a 1979 graduate of Lebanon Valley College, where he was a two-sport standout in lacrosse and football. An alternate to the North-South College All-Star team as a senior, he was a four-year starter in the lacrosse midfield and two-time captain. Still an active player, he has competed in the Philadelphia based Central Atlantic Lacrosse League since 1980, earning All-Conference honors five times.

He resides in West Chester, PA with his wife Donna and four children, Sean, Meghan, Scott and Sarah.

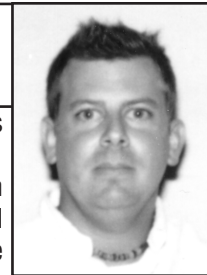
Joining Cullinan's coaching staff in 2007 is TC Behm. Behm will serve as the goalie coach and assistant defensive coordinator for the 2007 season.

FINNESEY FIELD

Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk men's lacrosse since its inception in 1993.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the men's lacrosse team, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, women's lacrosse and both men's and women's soccer. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

SJU's men's lacrosse team has compiled a record of 46-56 on the field since 1993. The team played its first Finnesey Field game on March 3, 1993, with a 2-9 loss to Wesley.

The first men's lacrosse victory on Finnesey Field came later that season on March 31, 1993 as they defeated Bloomfield, 11-3.

Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site. Several war-era relics, in fact, were discovered during landscaping work in 1939.

DIRECTIONS TO FINNESEY FIELD

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for half a century, celebrating its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.

HAWKS SOAR INTERNATIONALLY

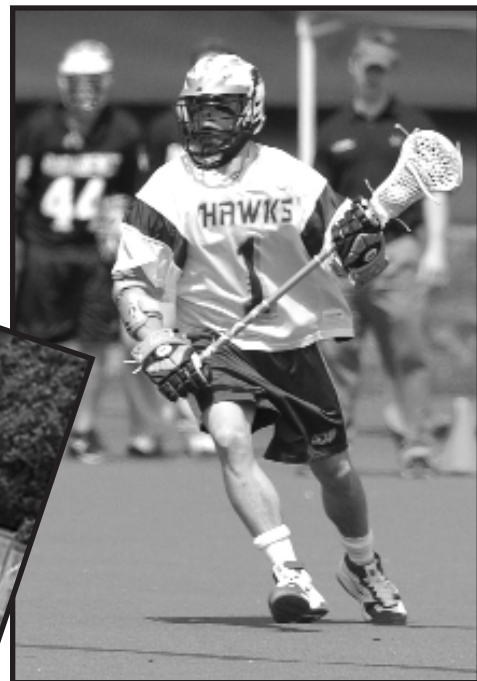
Saint Joseph's University watched proudly as two of its own took part in the 2006 World Lacrosse Championships in London, Ontario, Canada. 2005 graduate Kevin McGrann, a native of Washington, DC, played for the Italian team. He was eligible because his mother and grandparents hold Italian citizenship. One current Hawk, senior defender Kyle Hofstaedter, also participated in the Championships, which are held every four years. Hofstaedter, hailing from Perkasi, PA, holds dual citizenship with the Netherlands, and brought a strong defensive presence to the Dutch squad.

McGrann was named to the starting attack group for Team Italy at the start of the tournament, and he performed splendidly. He scored 15 goals and added eight assists for 23 points. He helped lead Italy to a 4-3 record and a 10th-place finish in the 23-nation competition. Italy's top-10 finish marked the nation's best-ever performance at the Championships.

Hofstaedter did not play for Saint Joseph's in 2006, as he spent the semester studying abroad in Europe. When he took the field for the Netherlands, he immediately took over a starting defensive slot and was a key component for the Dutch national team in their first international lacrosse competition. Hofstaedter also played on the man-up unit, scoring two goals in the tournament. The Netherlands won their first international game over South Korea, and placed 12th in the field. After his stellar performance, Hofstaedter has already been invited to participate in the 2008 European Cup competition.

2006 YEAR IN REVIEW

It proved to be a tale of two seasons for the Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse team in 2006. Entering the year with high hopes, the hard-luck Hawks opened the season 0-7 before engineering one of the most dramatic turnarounds in program history. Sparked by a school-record five All-Conference performers, the Crimson and Gray rallied to win six of their final eight games, including a five game winning streak, and clinch fourth place in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Lacrosse League.

Named the MAAC Coach of the Year, head coach Pat Cullinan's steady hand served to direct SJU's fantastic finish. Having walked the Hawks through a rigorous offseason training program, the second-year Hawk mentor knew that his team had the capability to make a run at the MAAC title.

The Hawks' slow start was made even more difficult as it opened the year against a pair of nationally-ranked opponents. For the second straight year, SJU kicked off the NCAA schedule with a game against #16 Delaware on February 11. The team then followed up that game by clashing with sixth-ranked and NCAA Tournament qualifier Navy. The Crimson and Gray dropped both outings, but the contests served to notify SJU that it had the ability to play with the nation's best, but also that it needed to play more consistently.

The ensuing weeks watched SJU steadily improve its overall performance, but the team would come away with little to show for it. Scuffling to secure its first victory, the Hawks would drop three games by a single goal.

A heart-wrenching double-overtime loss to eventual MAAC Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Providence in the league opener for both clubs proved to be the season's turning point.

The team responded to that setback by crushing Canisius for SJU's first victory of the season. All-MAAC picks senior Andrew Four and junior Alex McColough were the catalysts as each tallied hattricks in the rout.

SJU was clipped by Manhattan, but the team would then rattle off five straight victories. Putting together the team's longest winning streak since the 2000 season. A thrilling three-overtime shocker of Villanova kick-started the run, which culminated in the Hawks capturing fourth place in the MAAC Lacrosse League.

Despite earning the fourth overall seed, Saint Joseph's was declared ineligible to participate in the 2006 MAAC championship due to an inadvertent breach of the conference by-law limiting the number of athletic awards for a given academic year.

Individually, five Hawks captured All-MAAC honors. Freshman goaltender Erik Hotaling, fronted by a rugged defensive line that regularly featured seniors B.J. Fritts and Mike Kirlin, sophomore Pat Maxey and freshmen Pat Williams and Tom Wengenoski, played brilliantly in net. He was named to the All-MAAC First Team after setting an SJU single-season record with an 8.06 goals against average.

Four and McColough were joined on the All-Conference Second Team by senior Keegan Wilkinson and junior Mike O'Neill. Wilkinson topped the team in both points (38) and assists (22) for the third straight season and concluded his career second all-time in assists (83) and seventh in points. O'Neill, meanwhile had a breakout season, finishing second on the team in goals, assists and

points, despite missing the team's final three games with an injury.

Four and McColough each proved equally adept at putting the ball in the net or setting up their teammates out of the midfield. Four finished with 28 points, while McColough added 25.

Three other underclassmen made their mark finishing as double-figure scorers. Sophomore Steve Varga, who ranked among the conference leaders in goals per game, topped the team with 27 goals. Sophomore Steve O'Brien also added 16 points and freshman Alex Lopes tallied 10.

METRO ATLANTIC ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

With 10 institutions strongly bound by the sound principles of quality and integrity in academics and excellence in athletics, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference celebrates its 25th year of competition during the 2005-2006 academic year.

The MAAC was founded in 1980 by six charter members: the U.S. Military Academy, Fairfield University, Fordham University, Iona College, Manhattan College and Saint Peter's College. Competition followed one year later in the fall of 1981 with members competing in the sports of men's cross country and men's soccer. On January 2, 1982, Army traveled to Iona for the first MAAC men's basketball game and the MAAC story had begun.

Today, Conference members include: Canisius College, Fairfield University, Iona College, Loyola College (MD), Manhattan College, Marist College, Niagara University, Rider University, Saint Peter's College, and Siena College. In addition, associate members Duquesne University and LaSalle University compete in football. Le Moyne College competes in baseball and women's lacrosse, while Mount St. Mary's College, Providence College, Saint Joseph's University, Virginia Military Institute and Wagner College compete in men's lacrosse. St. Francis (NY) College, Villanova University and Wagner College are all associate members of the MAAC Women's Water Polo League. The MAAC will support 25 sports and conduct 24 championships during the 2005-2006 academic year.

The 2006 MAAC Basketball Tournament returns to the Pepsi Arena in Albany, NY, with Bridgeport's Arena at Harbor Yard preparing to host the 2007 championship. By having an excellent working relationship with these working facilities, the MAAC has been able to attract a number of NCAA Championship events. In 1995, the MAAC and Siena hosted the highly successful First and Second Rounds of the Division I Men's Basketball Tournament. In 2000, the MAAC, along with Canisius and Niagara, again received rave reviews as they hosted the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Basketball Tournament at the HSBC Arena in Buffalo, NY. The MAAC, Rider and Siena co-hosted the 2002 Division I Wrestling Championships at the Pepsi

Arena. Three years ago, the MAAC and Siena successfully hosted the 2003 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship East Regional at the Pepsi Arena. Additionally, the MAAC, Canisius and Niagara served as hosts for the 2003 Division I Men's Ice Hockey Championship, also at the HSBC Arena. In 2004, the MAAC, Canisius and Niagara once again successfully hosted the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds at the HSBC Arena. All three parties will host that event again in 2007, while the MAAC and Rider University will co-host the 2006 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton, New Jersey.

The MAAC prides itself on the accomplishments of its student-athletes in the classroom, as well as on the field. Mary Beth Riley, a 1991 graduate of Canisius, was the first recipient of the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. In the fall of 1998, Erin Whalen, a member of the Iona women's rowing team, was awarded one of the nation's 32 Rhodes Scholarships for academic achievement and civic leadership. Jose Vargas, a Loyola student, was also awarded a Rhodes Scholarship in 1999.

First-class facilities are the rule with MAAC schools, as teams regularly play in top-notch arenas, such as Madison Square Garden, the Continental Airlines Arena, HSBC Arena, Pepsi Arena, the Arena at Harbor Yard and Sovereign Bank Arena. The other MAAC championships boast their share of outstanding locales as well, such as Dutchess Stadium in Fishkill, NY, home of the baseball tournament, and the fabled Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx, where the cross country championships are contested. This year, the MAAC will take its Women's Soccer as well as Men's and Women's Golf Championships to Orlando, Florida, where it will conduct its post-season championships at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex. In 2006, the MAAC Volleyball Championships will be at Walt Disney World.

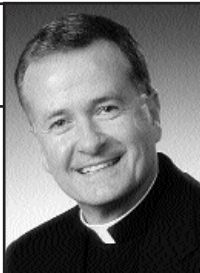


The 2005 Saint Joseph's Lacrosse team.

ADMINISTRATION



Timothy R. Lannon, SJ
University President



Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., is beginning his fourth year as president of Saint Joseph's University.

Fr. Lannon began his term as Saint Joseph's 26th president in July 2003. Since then he has led many significant University initiatives, most notably the agreement to purchase the 38-acre campus of the neighboring Episcopal Academy. Saint Joseph's anticipates taking possession of the property in 2008; the acquisition -- to be known as the Maguire Campus -- will provide unparalleled flexibility to enhance academic programs and facilities.

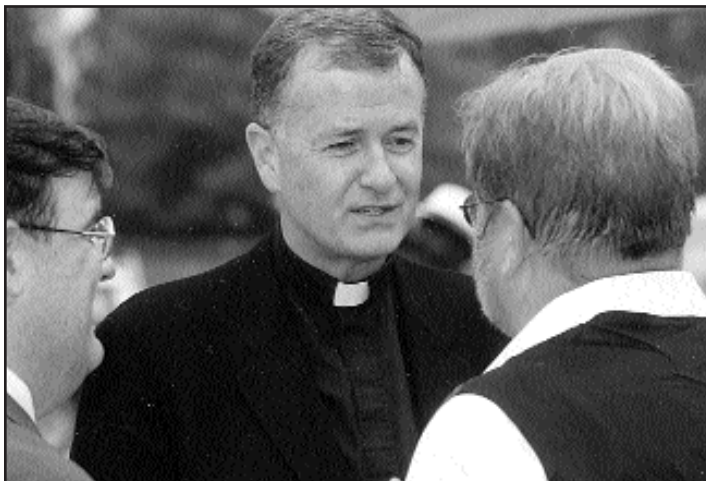
Under Fr. Lannon's stewardship, the University vastly upgraded student housing and parking options with the opening of the City Avenue Residence Halls in August 2004. Phase II of that initiative is currently underway and will result in additional parking and retail development along 54th Street.

Fr. Lannon has also played a major role in boosting Saint Joseph's academic profile, an effort which includes recently endowed faculty chairs and student scholarships as well as the opening of the Pedro Arrupe Center for Business Ethics. A major curricular-review initiative and the hiring of more than 50 new full-time faculty over a five-year period will serve to further strengthen the University's academic position. SJU has already equaled its best-ever U.S. News ranking (t-9th, Northeast) in the 2007 "America's Best Colleges" edition.

Fr. Lannon has worked tirelessly to re-engage the University in its mission and to foster expanded outreach efforts to alumni, governmental leaders, and other external constituencies. In the latter role, he serves as chair of the City Avenue Special Services District (CASSD). As a central tenet of his leadership, Fr. Lannon's has articulated a vision for Saint Joseph's to be recognized as the preeminent Catholic comprehensive university in the Northeast.

He previously was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president at Marquette University, and served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University. Fr. Lannon serves on the boards of Marquette University, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania.

Fr. Lannon has studied and written on Catholic identity at Jesuit universities. A native of Mason City, Iowa, he attended Creighton University as an undergraduate and was later president of Creighton Preparatory School. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1977 and was ordained in 1986.



Linda Lelii
Vice President/Student Life & Academic Development



Great strides have been made over the past decade to enhance the overall aspect of student life at Saint Joseph's University and at the heart of this growth and development is Vice President for Student Life and Academic Development Dr. Linda Lelii.

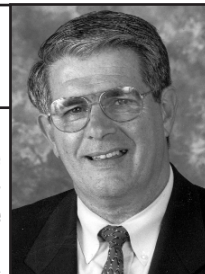
In her 13th year in this capacity, Dr. Lelii is responsible for Residence Life, Career Services, Counseling and Personal Development, Student Activities, Student Health, Academic Development, Advising to Students with Disabilities, Multicultural Life, Freshmen Orientation, and Athletics and Recreation.

Dr. Lelii came to Hawk Hill in 1987, when she accepted the position as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. In 1991, she was promoted to Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Lelii received her Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania in 1977 and her master's degree in psychology at Southern Methodist University in 1971.



Don DiJulia
Associate Vice President
Athletic Director



One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. The 61-year old DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an Assistant Vice President/Athletic Director on June 8, 1988.

Over the past 17 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs. During his tenure, five varsity programs have been added, a new weight training facility built, athletic facilities upgraded and athletic fund drives initiated. In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as Director of Athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become Commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the Commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

A two-sport athlete as an undergraduate at SJU, DiJulia was a member of the 1964-65 Hawk basketball team which compiled a 26-1 regular season record and a top 10 national ranking under head coach Dr. Jack Ramsay. He and his wife, Pat, are the parents of seven children and reside in Havertown, PA.



THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who seek to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,150. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

THE JESUIT TRADITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national and international opportunities for student service. From North



Philadelphia to Camden, N.J.; from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains, Saint Joseph's students embrace the Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

IDEAL CAMPUS LOCATION

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers. And with its many diverse student organizations, SJU offers ample opportunities to assume leadership positions.

An extensive on-campus recruitment program provides graduates with a head start in their employment search. Regular meetings with faculty advisors, along with advisory programs in the health professions and in pre-law, assist students who wish to further their schooling.

PHILADELPHIA

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia - only a short ride away.

SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers, as well. They visit the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts; the Franklin Institute Science Museum; the Academy of Music, which houses ballet and opera; and the new Kimmel Center, home to the Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition, SJU students know they always have a good time rooting for Philadelphia or other hometown teams in the four major professional sports.
