SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2010 Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse team returns its three leading scorers, a trio that accounted for 75 percent of the scoring last season in hopes of capturing the programs second MAAC title in its final season in the league.

The 2009 contingent saw the departure of Hawk Hill mainstays such as goalkeeper Erik Hotaling, Alex Lopes, Tom Wengenosky, Pat Williams, Ryan Tessler, R.J. Bopf, Drew Mandela, and Chris O'Neill but the prosperity of talent that will be featured on Hawk Hill for head coach Pat Cullinan this spring is one capable of competing with the best.

Led by the top three leading scorers a season ago, senior captain **Sean Evans**, junior **Scott Cullinan**, and senior **Charlie Gorman**, the SJU offense will be one of its strongest in years.

Evans was named the team's 2009 Offensive Player of the Year, leading in goals (24), assists (13) and points (37).

Cullinan earned All-MAAC Second Team honors as a freshman and was named to the 2009 Inside Lacrosse Magazine All-MAAC Preseason Team, scoring 21 goals and dishing five assists.

Joining Evans and Cullinan in the attack will be Gorman, who was second on the team in points (29), tied for second in assists (12), and was third on the team in goals (17), while senior captain **Joey D'Avanzo** was fourth on the team in scoring (eight goals, four assists) from the midfield.

Contributing to the scoring will be senior **Geoff DeSoye**, sophomores **Matt Dougherty** and **Jack Spallone**, and freshman **Kyle Williams**.

Senior captains **Peter Slowik** and D'Avanzo will control the midfield, as the duo will provide vocal leadership and stabilization to the young group of midfielders.

Veterans junior **Kevin Wadach** and sophomores **Brendan Burke**, **Daniel Lieb**, **Pat Kenville**, and **Trevor Dougherty** worked hard in the off-season and look to be strong contributors in the midfield line.

Freshmen **Artie Marrapese** and **B** have been consistent in preseason workouts and will bolster the offensive side of the midfield while sophomores **Justin Rogers** and **Colin Roemer** and junior **Pat Carrigan** will hold the defensive midfield together.

The heart of the defense will revolve around a trio of juniors, captain **Rob Saraceni**, **Pat Harner** and **Keith Belson**, and sophomore **Matt Germain**.

In goal this season will be sophomore **Griffin Ferrigan** who saw action in six games last season and has improved significantly in the off-season. Backing up Ferrigan in goal will be senior **Chase Stewart**, sophomore **Brendan Tully**, and freshman **Chris Moffa**.

A group of newcomers, which includes two transfers sophomore midfielder **Mike Begg** (Stony Brook) and junior midfielder **Chris Moore** (Loyola), along with freshmen **Kyle Mahoney**, **Peter Ingrasci**, **Mark Anton**, **Keith Preston**, **Pat Dispirito**, **Shane Flannery**, **Mike Lutes**, **Chris Moffa**, and **Mike Ryan** look to crack the starting line-up and provide flexibility and depth to the coaching staff.

The Hawks face a challenging schedule as they host Delaware to start the season and play Lehigh and Bellarmine before hitting the road with difficult matches at Drexel, Rutgers, and Penn.

The Hawks return home to face Brown and then open MAAC play on Finnesey Field with a tough match against the 2009 conference champions Siena.

The squad then plays back-to-back weekends traveling to Marist, returning home to host Canisius and head back on the road to play VMI before a set of home games against new MAAC member Detroit and Mount St. Mary's.

The Hawks wrap up the MAAC slate and regular season play with trips to Manhattan and Wagner while the MAAC Championship is pair for May 7-9 at Marist in Poughkeepsie, N.Y.

With a returning veteran offense, a skilled midfield and a strong defense the Hawks are ready to compete for the ultimate prize, an MAAC title and the programs first berth in the NCAA Tournament.

HEAD COACH



Pat Cullinan
Lebanon Valley '79
Sixth Season

Pat Cullinan enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse program in 2010. He previously spent 15 years at West Chester University, the final four as the Rams' head coach, twice earning New York Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors.

At Saint Joseph's, Cullinan has compiled a 25-52 record including a MAAC Championship appearance in 2007, which left the Hawks one game short of their first NCAA Tournament appearance. SJU was 4-4 in the MAAC last season and 6-9 overall. In 2007, Cullinan led the Hawks to a 6-12 record (5-3 MAAC). For leading the program's turnaround from 2005 (3-11 overall/2-6 MAAC), Cullinan was named the 2006 Anaconda Sports MAAC Coach of the Year.

Cullinan was hired after serving one year as an assistant coach (2004) immediately following his five-year stint as the head man at West Chester (1999-2003).

While at West Chester, Cullinan guided the Golden Rams to the ECAC Division II Championship game both in 1999 and 2002 and to the nation's number-nine ranking in 2003 season. Cullinan also received NYCAC Coach of the Year honors for the 2002 and 2003 seasons. In addition to his on-

the-field achievements, Cullinan was also the director of the Golden Ram Boys' Lacrosse Camp and organized both a coaches and players clinic for the Chester County Youth Lacrosse Association.

Prior to taking over as head coach at WCU in 1999, he spent a decade (1989-99) as a Ram assistant. He was instrumental in guiding West Chester to a pair of ECAC Division II titles in 1994 and 1998.

Before making the move to the collegiate level, Cullinan started the lacrosse program at Glen Mills High School and was the head coach there for seven years (1981-87).

Cullinan is a 1979 graduate of Lebanon Valley College, where he was a two-sport standout in lacrosse and football. An alternate to the North-South College All-Star team as a senior, he was a four-year starter in the lacrosse midfield and two-time captain.

He currently resides in West Chester, Pa., with his wife Donna and four children: Sean, Meghan, Scott and Sarah. Sean is in his second year as an assistant coach and Scott is a junior on the team, while Meghan graduated from SJU's women's lacrosse team in 2009. Scott's twin, Sarah, is a junior on the Elizabethtown University women's lacrosse team.

Returning for his sixth season on the Saint Joseph's coaching staff in 2010 is **Jack Morrison**, who serves as the team's defensive coordinator. After spending three seasons working with head coach Pat Cullinan at West Chester he followed Cullinan to Hawk Hill.

The 2000 graduate of Whittier College in 2005 in California was a defensive standout and capped his career by playing in the prestigious North-South All-Star Game.

Morrison is a teacher at Twin Valley Middle School. The Delaware Valley native attended Ridley High School and resides in West Chester, Pa. with his wife Katie.

Returning to the coaching staff for his second season is **Sean Cullinan**, who anchored the Hawk midfield for three seasons.

He tallied 12 points in his career, scoring seven goals and dishing five assists, while playing 40 games.

A 2005 transfer from Nazareth College, Cullinan was a two-time All-League selection at West Chester East High School. He is the oldest of head coach Pat Cullinan's four children, all of whom play collegiaete lacrosse.

His younger sister Meghan was a defender for the Hawk women's team and graduated in 2009. Scott, his younger brother, is an attacker on the current SJU team and Scott's twin sister, Sarah, plays at Elizabethtown College.

Cullinan completed his marketing degree in May of 2009 and resides in Philadelphia, Pa.

THE HAWK



One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk has been flapping its wings for 54 years.

The Hawk, which celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06, is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its over 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook*, *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was nominated for the Mascot Hall of Fame in 2008.

FINNESEY FIELD



Finnesey Field, currently in its 81st year, has been home to 10 different varsity squads at Saint Joseph's. Opened in 1929 as home to the SJU football squad, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years and has been home to over a thousand SJU varsity games, matches and track meets.

The most recent upgrade happened in 2008 when the AstroTurf, laid down in 2001, was replaced with new, state-of-the-art TigerTurf.

Home to the men's and women's lacrosse teams, men's and women's soccer teams, the field has seen other modifications since its inception in 1929. The prospect of a 70,000-seat bowl stadium for football was dashed when the sport was discontinued following the 1939 season.

Baseball re-occupied the space in 1947, calling Finnesey home until 1959. Saint Joseph's men's soccer began in 1958 and played every season but one (1960) at Finnesey. In 1960, the original grandstand as well as the hillside seating near Overbrook Avenue were eliminated as Villiger (now Post) Hall and the Bluett Theatre were built. In the process of the 1960 construction, the field's elevation was raised five feet to its current location.

In 1990, artificial turf replaced the grass, making Finnesey a truly multi-purpose facility. In 1994 the installation of lights furthered the use of the grounds, while new bleachers in 2003 on the hill next to Mandeville Hall were another touch of renovation to a historic stadium.



The men's lacrosse team has compiled an overall 52-66 mark in 17 seasons, the best of which was a 6-2 campaign in 2000. SJU opened its playing grounds with a 9-2 loss to Wesley College on March 3, 1993.

The women's lacrosse squad is 55-74 in 17 seasons on Hawk Hill. The best season came in 2004 when the Hawks went 5-2 en route to an 8-6 campaign. The first game was played on March 23, 1993 when SJU defeated Gwynedd Mercy, 18-4.

The location has also been home to men's soccer since 1958 and women's soccer since 1996 and the field hockey team wrapped up its last season on Finnesey in 2007.

Overall, the site has seen 1,116 games entering 2010, and SJU teams put together a total record of 514-556-46 in 80 years.

2009 YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2009 Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse season saw a repeat of its 4-4 conference finish and an improvement on its overall record from 2008, finishing the season 6-9. The team's final record saw them just narrowly miss the MAAC playoffs for the second year in a row after their run to the 2007 championship game.

The season began with a rough start, as the Hawks only won two of their first seven matchups. As the season progressed, however, when it was time to face conference opponents, the Hawks found their game.

After a season-opening loss to Delaware, the team traveled to Lehigh to face off against a foe that would prove to be nearly their exact equal. Trailing by two with just over 10 minutes remaining, the Hawks rallied for three unanswered goals – including Sean Evans' fourth of the day with just 34 seconds remaining – and edged out a 9-8 victory.

A notable loss came on February 21st against Hobart, where a squad depleted by injuries kept the game within a goal through three periods. The goalkeeping of All-Conference performer Erik Hotaling was a major factor as the senior stopped 12 shots. By the final period, however, the Statesmen began to pull away to an eventual 12-7 win.

One of the Hawks' early victories was a milestone in the program's history. On the last weekend in February, SJU hosted a strong Rutgers team, playing them to a dead even 6-6 tie at the halfway point. But over the next two periods the Hawks controlled the gameplay and, led by a pair of goals from Charlie Gorman and assists from Alex Lopes, outshot and outscored their opponent for the decisive and historic victory. The 10-7 triumph marked the first time that SJU had ever defeated an ECAC program.

After defeating Rutgers, SJU lost three straight – two closely-fought battles with Drexel and Bellarmine and one tough loss to powerhouse Siena. They then traveled up to Buffalo, N.Y., to take on conference rival Canisius. From the

beginning, the Hawks played a tight game, holding on to a narrow lead from start to finish. Propelled by a Charlie Gorman hat trick, SJU held on to eke out a 7-6 win.

Days later the Hawks fought hard to defeat Virginia Military Institute with a 9-6 victory, but went on to drop three straight over the following weeks, including two heartbreakers to Providence and Mount St. Mary's. When Marist came to Finnesey Field on April 18th, the Hawks were in need of a victory to turn around their season and keep their conference tourney hopes alive. Hotaling proved his mettle again, stopping 13 shots and holding the Red Foxes scoreless in the fourth period. Sean Evans and Joey D'Avanzo combined for six points, leading a late comeback to defeat the Red Foxes, 9-7.

Riding on the coattails of that victory, SJU brought a full head of steam into its contest with Wagner, the next visitors to Hawk Hill. As though holding a monster back at the onset, the Hawks unleashed nine straight goals over the second and third periods to take what would prove to be an insurmountable 10-2 lead. Scott Cullinan led the way with four goals and an assist while Sean Evans added a hat trick to seal the most decisive victory of the year, a 14-6 win over the Seahawks.

Though they ultimately came up short in their run for the playoffs, the team nonetheless played well at home, and will again be contenders for a berth in the four-team MAAC Championship tournament in the spring.

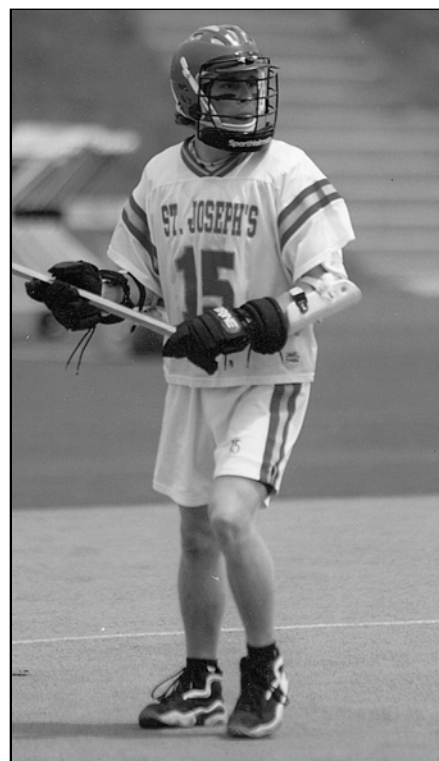

Saint Joseph's University remains dedicated to its student-athletes in line with the centuries-old Jesuit tradition of academic excellence. Janet Greder and Ken Krimmel seek to assist student-athletes in multiple facets of their education.

The office also assists student-athletes in career development and runs time management and study skills workshops throughout the academic year.

All freshman student-athletes, along with select upperclassmen, are required to attend study hall four nights a week. The office, located in Science Center 113, has eight individual study rooms, each equipped with a computer.

Coordinated through the Office of Educational Support Services for Student-Athletes, Saint Joseph's student-athletes utilize numerous support programs available through the University. Those programs include the Learning Resource Center, Career Services, the Counseling Center and the Writing Center. The services available to student-athletes; career choice assistance, academic skills workshops, individual tutoring and personal development, allow for success in the present while preparing for the future.

The office is aware of the challenges today's student-athletes face both on and off the playing field. To prepare them, the Office of Educational Support Services for Student-Athletes organizes and facilitates a Life Skills Program. This is designed to provide student-athletes with educational experiences that will assist them in bridging the gap from high school to college and from college to professional life. The program is designed to reach each student-athlete based on his or her individual needs. The Life Skills Program focuses on the individual as a whole—academically, athletically, and emotionally—and on the changing needs and skills of that individual in the years during and after college. Among the wide range of topics covered are time management, stress management, resume writing and interviewing, alcohol and drug awareness, and financial planning.

Greder and Krimmel also oversee the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), which acts as liaison between the University community and the student-athlete body. Members are selected by respective coaches or team members at the beginning of each academic year. SAAC works to encourage and promote student-athletes to be student leaders that represent individual varsity teams and the entire athletic department as a vocal, integral part of the greater Saint Joseph's community.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rte. 76 West towards Valley Forge. Follow Rte. 76 West to Exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.
