SEASON PREVIEW

Excitement is high for the 2008 installment of Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse. Head coach **Pat Cullinan** will see 31 of his players return to Hawk Hill, including seven of his top nine scorers and eight starters from a team which was one game away from the NCAA Tournament.

Leading the charge are senior tri-captains **Pat Maxey**, **Steve O'Brien** and **Steve Varga**. Maxey is a stalwart in the back in charge of the defensive unit, while O'Brien and Varga are the best offensive threats on the squad.

In 2007, O'Brien's all-around offensive effort from the midfield earned him the team's Most Improved Player honors. He supplied 18 goals and 12 assists, good for 30 points. Varga was the team's leading scorer with 24 goals including two game-winners.

Complimenting the veteran offensive strength are junior **Alex Lopes** and sophomore **Peter Slowik**. Lopes led the team in assists with 19, while Slowik garnered the team's Rookie of the Year honor with his 10-goal, six-assist effort.

As important as the offense is to the team's success in 2008, the defense will be bolstered by 2006 All-MAAC selection **Erik Hotaling**. The leader in career goals against average, Hotaling backed up his stellar freshman year with a solid sophomore campaign. Although slowed by an injury, he still led the team in saves (131) and save percentage (.522).

While Hotaling was out, junior **R.J. Bopf** stepped up impressively for the Hawks. Bopf appeared in seven games, garnering a 10.12 goals against average. Bopf's play wasn't limited to the pipes either as he played midfield for SJU in eight other games, making him the most versatile player on the team.

The defense as a whole is very experienced with the services of Maxey, **Tom Wengenosky**, **Chris Cole**, **Matt Ryan**, **Pat Williams**, and **Ben Osborne**. The sextet accounted for 92 appearances, making 57 starts last season. The defensive unit, including the goalkeepers, picked up 204 of the team's 403 groundballs in 2007.

The midfield has notable experience as well with senior **Sante Faustini** and junior **Ryan Tessler** as the key face-off men. The duo split face-off duties, winning 130 of their face-offs.

In addition to Faustini and Tessler—**Sean Cullinan**, **Chad Dudley**, **Jeff Beall**, and **Laurent Dionot**—have veteran experience and skills, which include not only defensive duties but offensive capabilities as well. The four provided 17 points out of the midfield in 2007 and will continue to give the Hawks that added spark on both ends of the field.

Other important role players include attackmen **Chris O'Neill**, **Geoff DeSoye**, midfielder **Joe D'Avanzo**, and defensemen **Paul Crisafulli** and **Dan Marraccoli**.

The Hawks face a challenging schedule, including a visit to nationally-ranked Colgate in addition to hosting 2007 national semifinalist Delaware to open the season.

SJU will play an eight-game schedule in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with Siena, the MAAC Championship hosts, tabbed as the favorites.

Fourth Season

Pat Cullinan enters his fourth season as the head coach of the Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse program. He previously spent 15 years at West Chester University, the final four as the Rams head coach, twice earning New York Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors.

At Saint Joseph's, Cullinan has compiled a 15-32 record including a MAAC Championship appearance last year, which left the Hawks one game short of their first NCAA Tournament appearance. SJU was 5-3 in the MAAC last season, 6-12 overall. In 2006, Cullinan led the Hawks to a 6-9 record (5-3 MAAC). For leading the program's turnaround from 2005 (3-11 overall/2-6 MAAC), Cullinan was named the 2006 Anaconda Sports MAAC Coach of the Year.

Cullinan was hired after serving one year as an assistant coach (2004) immediately following his five-year stint at West Chester (1999-2003).

While at West Chester, Cullinan led the Golden Rams to the ECAC Division II Championship game in 1999 and 2002 and finished the 2003 season ranked ninth in the nation. Cullinan also received NYCAC Coach of the Year honors for the 2002 and 2003 seasons. In addition to his on-the-field achievements, Cullinan also was the director of the Golden Ram Boy's Lacrosse Camp and organized both a coaches and players clinic for the Chester County Youth Lacrosse Association.

Prior to taking over as head coach at WCU in 1999, he spent a decade (1989-99) as a Ram assistant. He was instrumental in guiding West Chester to a pair of ECAC Division II titles in 1994 and 1998.

Before making the move to the collegiate level, Cullinan started the lacrosse program at Glen Mills High School and was the head coach for seven years (1981-87).

Cullinan is a 1979 graduate of Lebanon Valley College, where he was a two-sport standout in lacrosse and football. An alternate to the North-South College All-Star team as a senior, he was a four-year starter in the lacrosse midfield and two-time captain. After college, Cullinan competed in the Philadelphia-based Central Atlantic Lacrosse League starting in 1980 and earned All-Conference honors five times.

He resides in West Chester, Pa., with his wife Donna and four children; Sean, Meghan, Scott and Sarah.

Sean and Scott both play under their father at Saint Joseph's while Meghan plays for SJU's women's lacrosse team. Scott's twin, Sarah, is a freshman on the Elizabethtown University women's

Marymount '01 – First Year

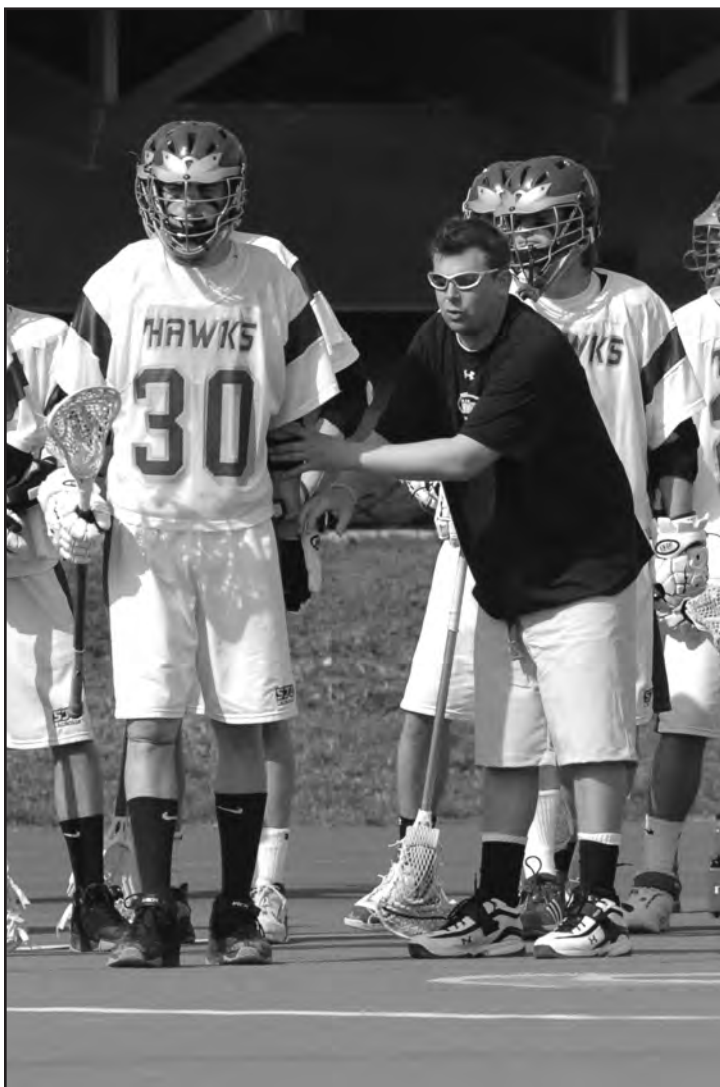
Milano joins the Hawks as a volunteer assistant coach specializing as the face-off coordinator.

FINNESEY FIELD



Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk men's lacrosse since its inception in 1993.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the men's lacrosse team, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, women's lacrosse and both men's and women's soccer. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

SJU's men's lacrosse team has compiled a record of 46-56 on the field since 1993. The team played its first Finnesey Field game on March 3, 1993, with a 9-2 loss to Wesley.

The first men's lacrosse victory on Finnesey Field came later that season on March 31, 1993 as they defeated Bloomfield, 11-3.

Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site. Several war-era relics, in fact, were discovered during landscaping work in 1939.

DIRECTIONS TO FINNESEY FIELD

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for half a century and celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 52-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.

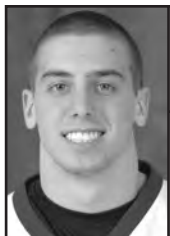

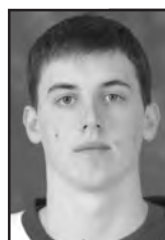

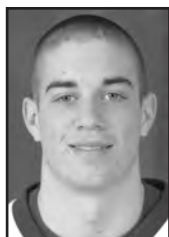

2007 YEAR-IN-REVIEW

The Saint Joseph's men's lacrosse team persevered through injuries and some hard losses to make it to the MAAC Championship game for the third time in program history. Much like the previous season, the Hawks opened the season with six straight losses before notching one in the win column near the end of March.

Saint Joseph's hard work early in the season against top teams such as Delaware, Navy and Duke helped to prepare it for conference play. Head coach Pat Cullinan managed to turn the losses into wins just in time for the Hawks' first MAAC matchup, defeating Marist at home, 6-5, in an overtime thriller. Junior Steve Varga scored two for the Hawks, including the game-winner, while sophomore Alex Lopes and senior Mike O'Neill each tallied a goal and an assist to help pace the Crimson and Gray.

Three days later, in their second conference game of the season, the Hawks pulled out another overtime win, this time beating Manhattan, 9-8, on Finnesey Field. Graduate student Alex McColough led SJU's scoring with three goals and Varga tallied two, netting the game-winner for the second straight game. SJU went on to win two more games to create a four-game winning streak after defeating Providence, 7-6, on the road and then VMI, 17-10, at home.

Getting back on the road for a four-game stretch, it seemed the Hawks had turned the season around, but their 12-2 loss at Lehigh marked the beginning of a four-game losing skid, including losses to Canisius, Mount St. Mary's and Siena.

The Hawks managed to pull out another win in their last home game of the season. It was a much-needed conference victory, downing Wagner, 11-3. Seven different Hawks scored in the win, with Chris O'Neill leading the pack with three goals and one assist. The win was enough to keep SJU's postseason hopes alive. The Hawks closed the regular season with a 12-9 loss at Penn State and two of their top players injured (Hotaling and McColough).

Finishing the regular season 5-3 in conference play, the Hawks tied for second place in the MAAC with Providence and Canisius. SJU garnered the third seed going into the conference championship and prepared to faceoff against second-seeded Canisius. The Hawks took down the Golden Griffins, 10-9, in the semifinals, with junior Steve O'Brien notching four goals, and Varga, O'Neill and McColough each adding two. Varga also tallied three assists, making it a five-point day for him.

Despite Varga putting the Hawks on the board first, SJU fell to fourth-seeded Providence, 9-4, in the MAAC title game. Hotaling played all 60 minutes in goal and made nine saves but a scoring drought in the second and third quarters put the Hawks too far behind to fully battle back.

Although SJU fell just a game short of the NCAA Tournament, the 6-12 season was a success. SJU started the season 0-6 and had another four-game losing streak in April. The Hawks were solid at home (4-1), and clutch in one-goal games (4-1). An experienced core of returners look to lead Saint Joseph's one step farther in the team's quest for its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT SERVICES



Janet Greder

Director of Educational Support Services for Student-Athletes

In her fourth year as the University's director of educational support services for student-athletes, Janet Greder directs a multi-faceted program of academic support that affords student-athletes the opportunity to succeed both in the classroom and on the field. In addition to overseeing the program for all of SJU's student-athletes, she works directly with the men's basketball program.

Greder came to SJU after three years as an academic coordinator at the University of Iowa. From 1997 to 2001, she was the assistant academic coordinator at Creighton University. A native of North Platte, Neb., she received her bachelor's degree in education from the University of Nebraska-Kearney in 1986 and a master of science degree in counseling from Nebraska-Omaha in 1997.



Chris Bagley

Assistant Director of Educational Support Services for Student-Athletes

Chris Bagley is in his fifth year as assistant director of academic services for student-athletes. A 2001 graduate of Penn State University, Bagley was a four-year standout on the swim team for the Nittany Lions. The Philadelphia native earned a master's degree in higher education administration in 2002 and currently resides in the Overbrook section of the city.

Greder and Bagley monitor academic progress of the student-athletes in compliance with SJU and NCAA rules and regulations. The office is a liaison between the athletic department and the faculty, while serving as a secondary academic advisor to the student-athletes, helping with registration, among other issues.

In line with the centuries-old Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, Saint Joseph's University remains dedicated to its student-athletes, both past and present.

The office also assists student-athletes in career development and runs time management and study skills workshops throughout the academic year.

All freshman student-athletes, along with select upper-classmen, are required to attend study hall four nights a week. The office, located in Science Center 113, has eight individual study rooms, each equipped with a computer.

Coordinated through the Office of Educational Support Services for Student-Athletes, Saint Joseph's student-athletes utilize numerous support programs available through the University. Those programs include the Learning Resource Center, Career Services, the Counseling Center and the Writing Center. The services available to student-athletes; career choice assistance, academic skills workshops, individual tutoring and personal development, allow for success in the present while preparing for the future.

The office is aware of the challenges today's student-athletes face both on and off the playing field. To prepare them, the Office of Educational Support Services for Student-Athletes organizes and facilitates a Life Skills Program. This is designed to provide student-athletes with educational experiences that will assist them in bridging the gap from high school to college and from college to professional life. The program is designed to reach each student-athlete based on his or her individual needs. The Life Skills Program focuses on the individual as a whole—academically, athletically, and emotionally—and on the changing needs and skills of that individual in the years during and after college. Among the wide range of topics covered are time management, stress management, resume writing and interviewing, alcohol and drug awareness, and financial planning.

Greder and Bagley also oversee the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), which acts as liaison between the University community and the student-athlete body. Members are selected by respective coaches or team members at the beginning of each academic year. SAAC works to encourage and promote student-athletes to be student leaders that represent individual varsity teams and the entire athletic department as a vocal, integral part of the greater Saint Joseph's community.

SAAC plans two major events each academic year, a "Welcome Back" picnic for student-athletes at the beginning of the fall semester and a semi-formal dinner and dance in the spring.



Timothy R. Lannon, S.J.
University President

Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., is beginning his fifth year as president of Saint Joseph's University.

Fr. Lannon began his term as Saint Joseph's 26th president in July 2003. Since then he has led many significant University initiatives, most notably the agreement to purchase the 38-acre campus of the neighboring Episcopal Academy. Saint Joseph's anticipates taking possession of the property in 2008; the acquisition – to be known as the Maguire Campus – will provide unparalleled flexibility to enhance academic programs and facilities.

Under Fr. Lannon's stewardship, the University vastly upgraded student housing and parking options with the opening of the City Avenue Residence Halls in August 2004. Phase II of that initiative is currently underway and will result in additional parking and retail development along 54th Street.

Fr. Lannon has also played a major role in boosting Saint Joseph's academic profile, an effort which includes recently endowed faculty chairs and student scholarships as well as the opening of the Pedro Arrupe Center for Business Ethics. A major curricular-review initiative and the hiring of more than 50 new full-time faculty over a five-year period will serve to further strengthen the University's academic position. SJU has attained its best-ever U.S. News ranking (t-8th, Northeast) in the 2008 "America's Best Colleges" edition.

Fr. Lannon has worked tirelessly to re-engage the University in its mission and to foster expanded outreach efforts to alumni, governmental leaders, and other external constituencies. In the latter role, he serves as chair of the City Avenue Special Services District (CASSD). As a central tenet of his leadership, Fr. Lannon's has articulated a vision for Saint Joseph's to be recognized as the preeminent Catholic comprehensive university in the Northeast.

He previously was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president at Marquette University, and served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University. Fr. Lannon serves on the boards of Marquette University, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania.

Fr. Lannon has studied and written on Catholic identity at Jesuit universities. A native of Mason City, Iowa, he attended Creighton University as an undergraduate and was later president of Creighton Preparatory School. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1977 and was ordained in 1986.



Dr. Cary Anderson
Vice President for Student Life

Cary Anderson, Ed.D., is the newest member of the Saint Joseph's University administration, assuming the post of vice president of student life on June 1, 2007. He brings a wealth of experience in higher education and student affairs to Saint Joseph's, along with a great familiarity with Jesuit institutions.

As vice president of student life, Dr. Anderson oversees many areas, including athletics and recreation, along with residence life, career development and counseling services.

Dr. Anderson came to SJU from Canisius College, where he served as the associate vice president and dean of students for eight years. Prior to that, he spent over nine years at the College of the Holy Cross, working first as complex director, then advancing to assistant dean of students and then to associate dean of students.

Dr. Anderson holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa and a master's degree from Loyola University of Chicago. He earned his doctorate in education from the University of Massachusetts while working at Holy Cross.

He is a contributing columnist with several student affairs publications, and was recently elected editor of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) Journal.

Dr. Anderson and his wife, Cindy, live in Bala Cynwyd, Pa. with their daughter, Chay.

Associate Vice President
Athletic Director

One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an assistant vice president/athletic director on June 8, 1988.

Over the past 19 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs.

Saint Joseph's is undergoing the biggest project in DiJulia's tenure with the expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which will include a dedicated center for men's and women's basketball. This comprehensive plan to enhance varsity and recreational sports at SJU also includes the transition to the Maguire Campus, which will add the use of four playing fields, two gymnasiums and eight tennis courts to the program.

In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as director of athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

He and his wife, Pat, have seven children and eight grandchildren, and reside in Havertown, Pa.



THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,150. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national, and international opportunities for student service. From parts of Philadelphia to New Jersey; from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains; and from Ecuador to Tanzania, Saint Joseph's students embrace the



Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

IDEAL CAMPUS LOCATION

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. PHILADELPHIA

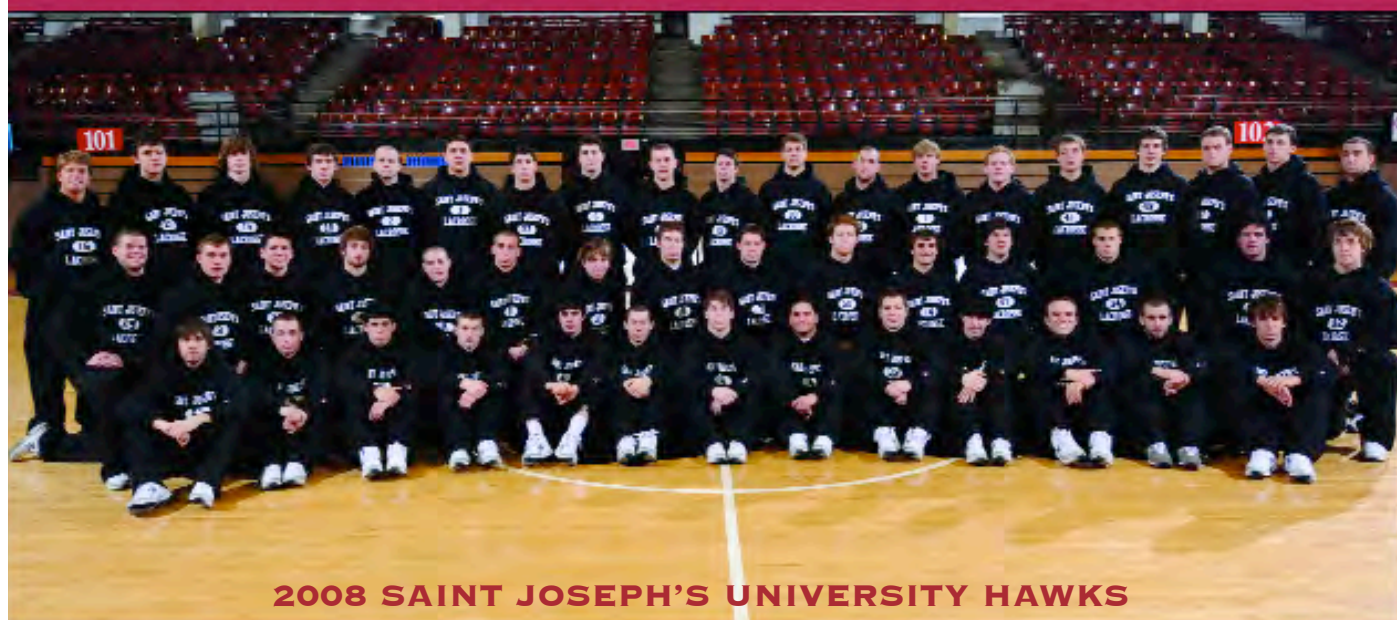
SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a
