SAINT JOSEPH'S HAWKS

SEASON OUTLOOK

With the departure of a quartet of four-year starters who comprised the winningest class in SJU history, the Saint Joseph's men's tennis team will have a different look in 2006-07. The fresh-faced Hawks, however, don't intend to skip a beat. Instead of retooling, the Hawks have reloaded with a nationally-ranked recruiting class to complement sophomores Pat Adams and Phil Bayliss, who anchor the rotation.

One of the brightest stars of the very competitive USTA SoCal Section, Adams possesses the ability to hold down a spot at the top of the Hawks' lineup. As a rookie, he settled in at fourth singles and finished third on the squad with 17 wins. He was also solid in doubles, posting an 11-4 mark from the third position.

Bayliss, meanwhile, spent most of his time at fifth singles and topped the team in victories with 21. He also led with 20 doubles wins and reached the semifinals of the "B" Flight singles and main doubles draws at the Princeton Invitational.

While that tandem gives the Hawks a pair of experienced returnees, junior Jarrett Chirico, a transfer from Virginia, should provide the biggest boost. The highest-rated player ever to don the Crimson and Gray, he was the top-ranked player in the USTA 14's and 16's singles and 16's and 18's doubles and was ranked as high as No. 15 in the world in the ITF 18's singles rankings. At the University of Virginia, he helped the Cavaliers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and reached the main draw at the ITA East Regional as a freshman.

Chirico headlines five new faces who will vie for immediate playing time for SJU. Scouring the globe, the Hawks reeled in players from Puerto Rico, Australia, Canada and Texas to complete their 2006-07 recruiting class.

Likely to make the most immediate impact are Lucho Perez-Abreu and Matt Glasgow. Currently the fourth-ranked junior in the Carribean Tennis Association and ranked among the top-150 players in the U.S., Perez-Abreu is a fierce competitor and team-oriented player. Glasgow, who possesses a tremendous knowledge of the game for an incoming freshman, is one of the top 15 players in the Super Championship Division of the Texas Tennis Association.

Two additional athletic international players, Australian Nick Tuxen and Canadian Michael Stauble, round out the incoming class. A native of Melbourne, and ranked among his country's top 40 juniors, Tuxen has solid technique and promises great growth potential. A diligent worker with a solid upside, Stauble is ranked seventh in the province of Ontario.

While the newcomers are highly-touted, a trio of returnees junior Phil Garabedian and sophomores Brent Kahl and Brian Costello - will also vie for time in the lineup. Garabedian, whose father and brother both played at SJU, has the best chance to crack the starting six. Injuries limited him to just seven singles matches in his first season in the Crimson and Gray after transferring from Philadelphia University. He did, however step in late in the season and picked up a key victory at the Atlantic 10 Championships.

Having restablished itself among the top programs in the East in recent seasons, Saint Joseph's will lean on a youthful group of fledgling Hawks to help the team ascend to the next level in 2006-07. The Hawks possess the raw talent to contend for the Atlantic 10 title and an NCAA Tournament berth; if they can overcome their inexperience it may be a year to remember on Hawk Hill.

Al Laveson

Head Coach Temple '53 - 43rd Season

Hawk Hall of Famer Al Laveson, the dean of coaches at Saint Joseph's University, is the winningest coach in the history of the school. The 1953 Temple grad has compiled a 459-514 record in 42 seasons with the men's tennis team (294-331) and 25 seasons with the women (165-183). His coaching tenure at Saint Joseph's is the longest in school history.

The long-time coach has helped lead a resurgence for the men's tennis team in the past four seasons. In 2002-03, the Hawks tied a school record with 15 wins and recorded a then best-ever showing at the Atlantic 10 Championships, placing fifth. The past two seasons, Laveson upgraded the schedule to include several nationally-ranked teams and SJU bettered its A-10 performance with a fourth place finish in 2004. This past year, the team earned its highest-ever A-10 seed (third) and the squad placed 12th at the ECAC Championships.

Laveson, who was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001, was the first Hawk mentor to reach 400 career wins with a men's tennis victory over Towson in the fall of 2002. In 1994, he became only the second Hawk coach to reach the 300-win plateau, joining the legendary Bill Ferguson, who guided the Hawk basketball team to 309 victories over 25 years. He became the winningest Hawk coach one year later.


Captain of the Temple tennis team as a collegiate player, Laveson has been a teaching professional for the United States Professional Tennis Association for the past 40 years. He is also a past vice president of the organization.

Laveson retired from his full-time teaching position at Central High School in Philadelphia just before the 1994 season. Prior to his arrival at Central in 1987, he taught for 33 years at Penn Treaty Junior High School. Aside from coaching at SJU, Laveson coached the boys' tennis team at Father Judge High School for two years in the early 1960s. He won City Championships in badminton and tennis at Central, along with a gymnastics title while at Penn Treaty. Laveson also coached girls' field hockey at Central.

Laveson, who resides in Philadelphia, is the father of three sons, Bob, Dave, and Peter. The two eldest were both SJU tennis team captains under their father




ASSISTANT COACHES



Gene Miller Assistant Coach Navy '79 - Seventh Year

Gene Miller is entering his seventh year as an assistant coach at Saint Joseph's University. Among the most respected names in college tennis, Miller has played an integral role in the resurgence of the Hawks program and coordinates recruiting, scheduling and on-court training.



Prior to his stint at Rollins, Miller served as an assistant coach at Southern Methodist University for two years. Responsible for all on-court conditioning and recruiting, Miller's squad received a national ranking as high as #5 in 1999, while reaching the Sweet 16 at the NCAA National Championships that same year.

Prior to SMU, Miller was the head men's coach at the University of Pennsylvania for seven years. At Penn, his accolades included seven Big 5 Championships, three Academic All-Americans and an Eastern Region ITA ranking of #3 in 1995 after guiding the Quakers to 21 victories.

A USPTA Professional, Miller has coached several All-Americans, including three in a single season at SMU. A 1979 graduate of the United States Naval Academy, Miller served in 18 combat missions in Desert Storm as a Navy F-14 fighter pilot. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from the U.S. Naval Academy before earning his master's in Information Management from George Washington in 1989. He currently resides in Cherry Hill, N.J. and is a commercial pilot for Delta Airlines.



Francisco Velazquez Assistant Coach Saint Joseph's '05 - Second Year

Returning for his second season on the Saint Joseph's coaching staff in 2006-07 is former Hawk standout Francisco Velazquez. The all-time winningest player in program history at both singles (64) and doubles (67) when he



graduated, the 2005 SJU alum is the only Hawk to be named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference team four times.

As a senior, he posted an impressive 24-12 doubles mark while teaming with former Hawk A.J. Garabedian. The duo won the "A" Flight at the Swarthmore Invitational, reached the final of the Princeton Invitational, advanced to the Round of 16 at the ITA Championships and the Round of 16 in the back draw at the Pacific Coast Doubles Championship.

A native of Seroe Patrishi, Aruba, he competes on Aruba's National team and was selected for Team Topsport Elite, the pre-2008 Olympics training program. He was a four-time Aruba men's tennis champion.

Velazquez is currently completing his master's degree in health education.



FINNESEY COURTS



Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk athletic teams since its inception in 1929. Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. During the summer of 2003, bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall.

Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, men's and women's soccer and both men's and women's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

Adjacent to Finnesey Field stand the Finnesey Courts, home to the Hawk men's and women's tennis teams since the late 1940s. Prior to that, SJU primarily played its home matches at the nearby Narberth courts. When courts were first built on campus, they were located where Bellarmine Hall now stands. Due to Bellarmine's construction in the summer of 1960, however, the Finnesey Courts were torn down and rebuilt in their current location.

After briefly disappearing in the late 1990s due to Mandeville Hall's construction, the courts were refurbished in the summer of 2000 to provide a better playing facility for the athletes. The Saint Joseph's men's tennis team has compiled a record of 58-78 on the courts since 1983 and are riding a 14-match winning streak on Finnesey Courts.

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Courts are straight about

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for half a century, celebrating its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous acco-

lades in its 51-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News, Sports Illustrated, Sports Illustrated for Kids, Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.



2005-06 YEAR IN REVIEW



Keyed by a record-setting quartet of seniors and the influx of a heralded group of newcomers, the Saint Joseph's men's tennis team continued to establish its position among the East's top programs in 2006.

The veteran group of Antonio Aniello, Jimmy Holland, A.J. Garabedian and Chris Spencer played an integral role in the resurgence of the SJU program, securing their position among the winningest players in program history, and were the catalysts for SJU.

The versatile Aniello concluded his career with more wins (73) than any player to ever don the Crimson and Gray. As a senior, he finished second on the team in singles victories (18), playing regularly between the fourth, fifth and sixth slots. He also teamed with Holland at number one singles, posting a 17-11 mark.

Holland rebounded from an injury-plagued junior season to capture All-Atlantic 10 Conference honors for the second time. The lanky lefthander held down both the number one singles and doubles positions.

Two other seniors, Chris Spencer and A.J. Garabedian, also closed out impressive careers. Spencer regularly played third singles and finished with the third most singles wins (63) in Hawk history. He also paired with freshman Pat Adams to post an 11-4 record at third doubles. Garabedian, meanwhile split time between third and fifth singles. He teamed with freshman Phil Bayliss to notch a team-best 19-10 mark mostly at second doubles, reaching the semifinals in the "B" Flight at the Princeton Invitational. He finished his career with more doubles victories than any player in Hawk history.

Among the newcomers, Bayliss and Adams both lived up to their high expectations. Seeing most of his time at fifth singles, Bayliss topped the team in victories with 21 and also led with 20 doubles wins. He reached the semifinals of the "B" Flight singles draw at Princeton, in addition to advancing to the semis in doubles. Adams, projected as a top of the lineup performer, flashed his immense skills and eventually settled in at number four singles. He wrapped up the season third on the team in singles wins (17).

Two other newcomers, sophomore transfer Phil Garabedian and f reshman Brent Kahl, also got a couple of turns in the regular lineup.

As a team, the Crimson and Gray delivered impressive results. They knocked off Dartmouth en route to a 12th place finish at the ECAC Championships at the US National Tennis Center. They also ea med a bye and a school-best third seed at the Atlantic 10 Championships before being ousted by eventual A-10 Champion and NCAA To u mament qualifier Richmond and settling for a seventh-place finish. At the Swarthmore Invitational, SJU won all five singles

flight titles, including wins by Holland, Aniello, Spencer, Fred Duncan and Kahl; and both doubles flight crowns.

The Saint Joseph's men's tennis team said goodbye to a quartet of talented seniors in 2006 that played an integral role in re-establishing SJU among the top programs in the East. This record-setting group concluded their careers among the winningest players in Hawk history, but more importantly, coupled with the development of a dynamic group of underclassmen, they positioned the Crimson and Gray for even greater success in the near future.

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE



On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 73 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: base-

ball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and out-

door track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

Xavier became the first team in NCAA history to win four games in four days at its league's men's basketball tournament twice when it won the 2006 A-10 title (previously done in 2004). The Musketeers earned the Atlantic 10's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and were joined by George Washington, which became just the fourth team in league history to go unbeaten in Conference play. The Colonials, who at one time had the nation's longest winning streak (18 games), were ranked as high as sixth in the national polls. In addition, Charlotte, Saint Joseph's, and Temple earned NIT bids. In women's basketball. Temple won its third-straight A-10 title and was joined by George Washington in the NCAA Tournament, Charlotte, Saint Joseph's, and Xavier garnered WNIT bids.

Saint Louis won the A-10 baseball championship and earned its first NCAA berth since 1966. In cross country,

Duquesne won its first-ever men's title and La Salle won its fourth women's crown in the last five years. In field hockey, Richmond ended the season ranked 19th nationally after going unbeaten in Conference play for the third straight year in advancing to the NCAAs.

The men's golf season was the most successful in Atlantic 10 history as league champion Charlotte was joined by George Washington, Rhode Island, Richmond, and Xavier in the NCAA Tournament, marking the first time ever that five A-10 schools earned postseason bids. Charlotte, which won the title in its first season as a member of the A-10, reached the national finals for the first time in school history.

Richmond won its first-ever women's lacrosse regular season title and its second tournament title in advancing to the NCAA Tournament. In addition to Richmond, St. Bonaventure earned a national ranking in 2006, the first-ever in school history. The Massachusetts women's rowing team won

its 11th straight A-10 title, building upon its league record for the most consecutive tournament championships won by any team in any sport. Rhode

Island won the A-10 Men's Soccer Championship, while Saint Louis won the women's regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In softball, UMass won its 18th league championship and an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Super Regional round. St. Bonaventure won its first A-10 men's swimming & diving crown since 1999 and the Richmond women claimed their fifth straight title. Richmond captured its third straight men's and women's tennis championships and the accompanying NCAA automatic berths. Charlotte took the men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field titles. In volleyball, Dayton won its third straight Conference crown to earn the league's automatic NCAA bid.

In all, 392 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 season.



Timothy R. Lannon, SJ University President

Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., is beginning his fourth year as president of Saint Joseph's University.

Fr. Lannon began his term as Saint Joseph's 26th president in July 2003. Since then he has led many significant University initiatives, most notably the agreement to purchase the 38-acre campus of



the neighboring Episcopal Academy. Saint Joseph's anticipates taking possession of the property in 2008; the acquisition -- to be known as the Maguire Campus -- will provide unparalleled flexibility to enhance academic programs and facilities.


Under Fr. Lannon's stewardship, the University vastly upgraded student housing and parking options with the opening of the City Avenue Residence Halls in August 2004. Phase II of that initiative is currently underway and will result in additional parking and retail development along 54th Street.

Fr. Lannon has also played a major role in boosting Saint Joseph's academic profile, an effort which includes recently endowed faculty chairs and student scholarships as well as the opening of the Pedro Arrupe Center for Business Ethics. A major curricular-review initiative and the hiring of more than 50 new full-time faculty over a five-year period will serve to further strengthen the University's academic position. SJU has already equaled its best-ever U.S. News ranking (t-9th, Northeast) in the 2007 "America's Best Colleges" edition.

Fr. Lannon has worked tirelessly to re-engage the University in its mission and to foster expanded outreach efforts to alumni, governmental leaders, and other external constituencies. In the latter role, he serves as chair of the City Avenue Special Services District (CASSD). As a central tenet of his leadership, Fr. Lannon's has articulated a vision for Saint Joseph's to be recognized as the preeminent Catholic comprehensive university in the Northeast.

He previously was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president at Marquette University, and served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University. Fr. Lannon serves on the boards of Marquette University, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania.

Fr. Lannon has studied and written on Catholic identity at Jesuit universities. A native of Mason City, Iowa, he attended Creighton University as an undergraduate and was later president of Creighton Preparatory School. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1977 and was ordained in 1986.





Linda Lelii Vice President/Student Life & Academic Development

Great strides have been made over the past decade to enhance the overall aspect of student life at Saint Joseph's University and at the heart of this growth and development is Vice President for Student Life and Academic Development Dr. Linda Lelii



In her 13th year in this capacity, Dr. Lelii is responsible for Residence Life, Career Services, Counseling and Personal Development, Student Activities, Student Health, Academic Development, Advising to Students with Disabilities, Multicultural Life, Freshmen Orientation, and Athletics and Recreation.

Dr. Lelii came to Hawk Hill in 1987, when she accepted the position as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. In 1991, she was promoted to Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Lelii received her Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania in 1977 and her master's degree in psychology at Southern Methodist University in 1971.



Don DiJulia Associate Vice President Athletic Director

One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. The 61-year old DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an Assistant Vice President/Athletic Director on June 8, 1988.



Over the past 17 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs. During his tenure, five varsity programs have been added, a new weight training facility built, athletic facilities upgraded and athletic fund drives initiated. In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as Director of Athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become Commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the Commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

A two-sport athlete as an undergraduate at SJU, DiJulia was a member of the 1964-65 Hawk basketball team which compiled a 26-1 regular season record and a top 10 national ranking under head coach Dr. Jack Ramsay. He and his wife, Pat, are the parents of seven children and reside in Havertown, PA.

THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who seek to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,250. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

THE JESUIT TRADITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. The Jesuit tradition of intelectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national and international opportunities for student service. From North



Philadelphia to Camden, N.J.; from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains, Saint Joseph's students embrace the Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

IDEAL CAMPUS LOCATION

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers. And with its many diverse student organizations, SJU offers ample opportunities to assume leadership positions.

An extensive on-campus recruitment program provides graduates with a head start in their employment search. Regular meetings with faculty advisors, along with advisory programs in the health professions and in pre-law, assist students who wish to further their schooling.

PHILADELPHIA

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia only a short ride away.

SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers, as well. They visit the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts; the Franklin Institute Science Museum; the Academy of Music, which houses ballet and opera; and the new Kimmel Center, home to the Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition, SJU students know they always have a good time rooting for Philadelphia or other hometown teams in the four major professional sports.
