2006 CROSS COUNTRY OUTLOOK

The Saint Joseph's University men's cross country team has its sights set on returning to the top of the Atlantic 10 in 2006. Head Coach **Mike Glavin**, in his 18th season on Hawk Hill, will lean heavily on experienced leadership in an attempt to earn the Hawks their first A-10 championship since 2000.

Coach Glavin expects returning standouts **Mike DiDio** and **Teddy Meyers** to pace the Hawks in 2006. DiDio, a graduate student, was one of the Hawks' most accomplished runners during his undergrad years. Meyers, a senior co-captain, has blossomed into one of the elite distance runners in the Mid-Atlantic region. Meyers was far and away the Hawks' top performer in 2005, and last spring he also qualified for the NCAA East Regionals in the 5000m. His co-captain is senior **Shawn Duffy**. Duffy was consistently one of the top five performers in each meet for SJU, and his experience will be relied upon in the upcoming season.

Juniors **Will Rowland** and **Rich Ryan** will be expected to move into the top-five for the Hawks as the season gets underway. Rowland finished 15th at the 2005 Atlantic 10 Championships, earning All-Conference honors. Both runners met with success during the 2005-06 track & field season. If the cross country Hawks are to improve on last season's results, Rowland and Ryan will be a big part of that improvement.

The Hawks are also looking for contributions from the other members of the squad, in particular senior **Brian O'Neill** and a quartet of sophomores - **Justin Heinze, Michael Howanski, Brendan Kearney, and Stephen Young**. Despite the individual accomplishments of DiDio, Duffy, and Meyers, the success of the squad as a whole will depend on one or more of these unheralded talents breaking through in 2006.

A handful of newcomers will join the Hawks for the upcoming campaign. Sophomore transfers **Peter Dittmar** and **Kyle Murray** will look to make a difference in their first year on the team. Rounding out the roster are four freshmen, as **James Jennings, Chris Savino, Jonathan Sclafani, and George Wittman** will begin their collegiate careers on Hawk Hill in the fall of 2006.

The Saint Joseph's men's cross country team will rely on a balance of youth and experience in its efforts to climb back to the top of the Atlantic 10. If the squad can avoid the injury bug that has reared its head over the past few seasons, the 2006 season could be a bright one indeed.

The Hawk Will Never Die!

2006-07 TRACK OUTLOOK

The 2006-07 men's track and field campaign looks to be one of rebuilding for coach **Mike Glavin** and the Saint Joseph's Hawks. The graduation of the class of 2006 resulted in the departure of a number of key cogs in the SJU lineup, and the losses of standouts Joe Mohn, Matt Petrocci, and Andrew Thomas will not be easy to recover from. However, some outstanding performers will return to Hawk Hill this season in an effort to keep the Hawks in the upper echelon of the Atlantic 10.

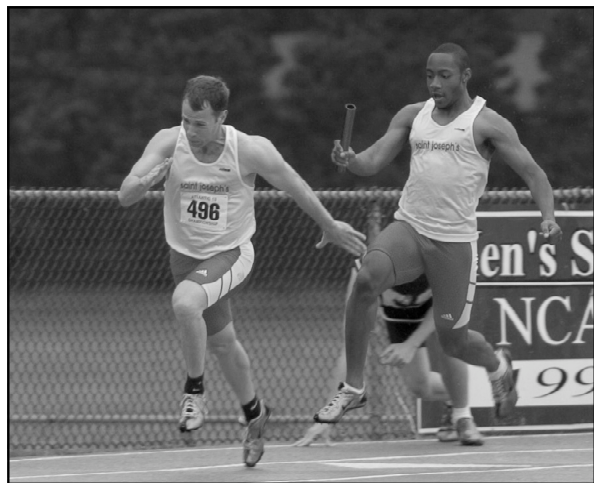
The Hawks will rely on the experience and leadership of their senior captains, **Mike Tatara** and **Joe Witiw**, as they look to contend for a spot at the top of the Atlantic 10. Both captains exemplify the spirit of "team players," as both contribute heavily to the sprint relay squads. Witiw also placed third in the 500m at last season's A-10 Outdoor Championships. He will also be a contributor in the jumps, while classmate **Matthew McClure** will handle the throws. Fellow senior **Chris Kessler** will join the captains on the sprinting squad, and is also expected to be a part of the Hawk relays as well.

Joining the senior sprinters will be juniors **Quenton Boyer**, **Bobby Staten**, and **Matt Weaver**. Boyer has turned in some of the team's fastest indoor sprint times in his first two seasons, while Weaver was named to the All-Atlantic 10 Second Team in the 4x400 relay at the 2006 indoor championships. Staten will likely be the team's top sprinter, as he recorded team-best times in most of the indoor sprinting events as well as the 100m and 200m outdoor races. He was also part of the outdoor conference-champion 4x400 relay team, and was poised to challenge for top honors in the 100m before being sidelined by a hamstring injury. Rounding out the sprinting squad are newcomers **Drew Brandt**, **Christopher Caranante**, **Brian Doherty**, **Tom Gonzalez**, and **Steven Philbrook**.

In the middle distance events, the Hawks will rely on the experience of senior **Brian O'Neill** and junior **Rich Ryan**. O'Neill has lent his talents to the cross country squad as well, and looks to follow up on a junior season in which he improved a number of his personal bests. Ryan will be the team's primary entrant in the steeplechase after showing great promise last season; he was able to qualify for the IC4A Championships in just his first season competing in the event. For his efforts, Ryan was named the team's Most Improved Player. O'Neill and Ryan will be joined by three of their cross country teammates, sophomores **Michael Howanski** and **Brendan Kearney**, and freshman **Jonathan Sclafani**. Howanski and Kearney both showed great potential last season, with Kearney placing third at the A-10 Outdoor Championships in the 800m.

The distance contingent of the Hawk lineup should be incredibly strong throughout the 2006-07 campaign. Led by senior cross country captains **Shawn Duffy** and **Teddy Meyers**, as well as graduate student **Mike DiDio**, the Hawks will look to score big in the long distance races. Duffy will be the team's go-to runner in the 10,000m races, where he placed 11th at the A-10's 2006 outdoor championships. Meyers will look to defend his indoor and outdoor 5,000m A-10 crowns and repeat his feat of qualifying for both the IC4A Championships and the NCAA Regionals. DiDio returns for his final season of eligibility to defend his 1,500m conference crown. He also earned Most Outstanding Performer honors at the outdoor championships; this season, he will try to be the first runner in A-10 history to accomplish that feat twice. Junior **Will Rowland**, a 2005 All-Conference performer in cross country, will look to repeat as an IC4A qualifier in the 5,000m indoor event and carry some momentum into the outdoor season. The veterans will be joined by a handful of young harriers, including sophomores **Justin Heinze** and **Stephen Young**. Heinze will focus on the 3,000m and 5,000m races, while Young will look to inherit the mantle of 1,500m standout from DiDio. Transfer students **Peter Dittmar** and **Kyle Murray** will contribute to the long distance squad, as will freshmen **James Jennings**, **Chris Savino**, and **George Wittman**.

The Saint Joseph's men's track team lost a great deal of scoring in the offseason, but Glavin and his remaining charges are primed to make a run at the top flight of the Atlantic 10. Despite the departures of a handful of crucial components from last year's squad, the 2006-07 Hawks still have a solid, reliable core of veteran leadership to go with their youth and potential. The question that remains to be answered is whether or not the young Hawks will respond to this leadership and elevate their own performance to the next level. The Hawks are looking forward to finding the answer.

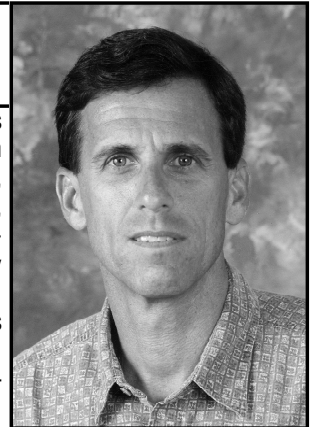
Atlantic 10 Titles:

Mike Glavin, a 1978 graduate of Saint Joseph's University, begins his 18th season as the head men's cross country and track coach in 2006. A three-time Atlantic 10 Men's Cross Country Coach of the Year, he has led the Hawk men to three conference championships (1992, 1998, 2000). During his tenure, 31 Hawks have been named All-Conference, while three have qualified for the NCAA Cross Country Championships.

Glavin returned to Hawk Hill after a ten-year stint as the head cross country and track coach at Paul VI High School in Haddon Heights, NJ. During his decade at the helm, the cross country team achieved a spotless 110-0 record and won three state championships (1984, 1985, 1988). On the track, Glavin led Paul VI to a record of 60-18, including four South Jersey championships and the 1989 state crown.

A top-notch performer for SJU as an undergrad, Glavin established a number of school records, including the outdoor track record for the three-mile and 5,000m runs as well as the indoor record for both the mile and two-mile runs. He also broke the Belmont Plateau cross country record with a time of 25:36. Glavin qualified for the NCAA Cross Country Championships in both his junior and senior seasons. He remains the only Hawk harrier to qualify twice for the NCAA championships.

Glavin holds a master's degree in mathematics from Villanova University and currently teaches at Haddonfield High School in New Jersey. Recently, he became the President of the IC4A Coaches Association after serving as Vice President for several years. Glavin, 49, currently resides in Ardmore, PA, with his wife Julie and their two sons, Graeme and Michael.

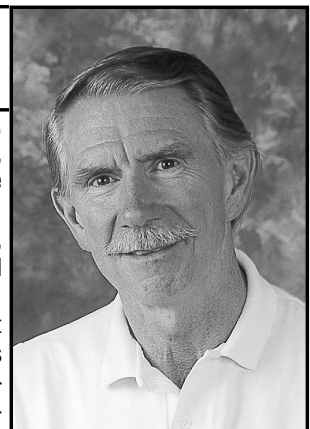


Kevin Quinn Director of Track and Field - 41st Season Saint Joseph's '62

Kevin Quinn enters his 41st year directing the Saint Joseph's track and cross country programs, including the last 21 as the head coach of the women's programs. A 1962 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Quinn joined the Hawk athletic staff as the head coach of the men's cross country and track squads in the fall of 1966, a position he held for 23 years. In 1985, he added the title of women's cross country and track head coach to his resume, and is now entering his 22nd season in that capacity. In July of 1989, Quinn was appointed to the position of assistant athletic director for facilities. In 2001 he was promoted to his current position of associate athletic director for facilities.

An outstanding educator, teacher, and motivator, Quinn has led the Hawk track program to great heights during his tenure. His men's cross country squads won two Big 5 titles, while the 1984 men's track team turned in a seventh-place finish at the IC4A Championships. In 1993 the women's cross country team won the Atlantic 10 championship, becoming the first women's sport at Saint Joseph's to accomplish that feat. Under Quinn's tutelage the 1997 track team set 10 new school records and notched SJU's first-ever women's Penn Relays victory, earning first place in the 4x800m relay. In 2000, Quinn again coached the Hawks to the Atlantic 10 cross country title, earning himself conference Coach of the Year honors. Over the past three seasons, Quinn's charges have broken school records in track and field on 17 different occasions, including seven in 2005-06.

An outstanding athlete in his own right, Quinn once held SJU records in the mile and two-mile runs. A charter member of the Saint Joseph's Track Hall of Fame, he placed third in the 1961 IC4A Cross Country Championships. Quinn also served as one of the team's tri-captains in his senior season. For his dedication and achievements, he was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001. Quinn, 65, currently resides in Havertown, PA, with his wife Marie. The pair are the parents of six children: Kevin, Marie, Sean, Kathleen, Colleen, and Brendan.

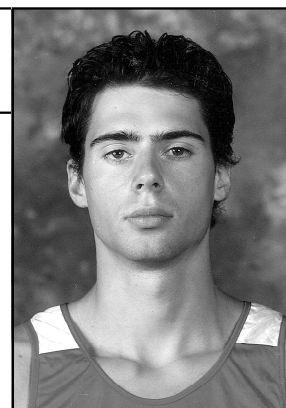

A 2001 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Karl Savage begins his third season as an assistant coach on Mike Glavin's staff in 2006.

Named the 2000 Atlantic 10 Performer of the Year in both cross country and track, Savage twice earned All-Conference honors in cross country and was an NCAA qualifier in 2000, placing 67th overall at the NCAA meet. He is one of three runners to qualify for the NCAA Championships during Coach Glavin's tenure at Saint Joseph's.

A leading runner on the 2000 Atlantic 10-champion cross country team, Savage is a strong complement to Glavin's coaching. Savage took first place in both the 1,500m and the 5,000m at the 2001 A-10 Championships and his experience is a valuable asset to the Hawks' long distance runners.



FINNESEY FIELD

Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk athletics since 1929.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the track and field teams, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU field hockey, men's and women's soccer and both men's and women's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site. In fact, several war-era relics were discovered during landscaping work in 1939.



THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for half a century and celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.

2005 CROSS COUNTRY REVIEW

The 2005 Saint Joseph's University men's cross country team returned to the upper echelon of the Atlantic 10 conference after a disappointing 2004 campaign. The Hawks avoided the injury bug that plagued them throughout the previous season on their way to three top-ten finishes and fourth place at the Atlantic 10 Championships.

Teddy Meyers turned in spectacular performances week in and week out and was the top finisher for the Hawks in all six races he ran, including a second-place individual finish at the A-10 Championships. Seniors David Masse and Joe Mohn also performed well throughout the season, as did junior Shawn Duffy and sophomore Will Rowland. Rowland joined Meyers on the All-Conference team with a 15th-place finish at A-10's.

The Hawks began the season with a seventh-place showing at the 8K Fordham Invitational. Rowland paced the squad with a time of 26:34, placing 23rd. Sophomore Rich Ryan and Duffy finished 55th and 56th, respectively, both turning in a 27:38.

Two weeks later, SJU finished 4th out of 17 teams at the Penn State Spiked Shoe race. Meyers led all runners, finishing in first place with a time of 25:32. Mohn finished the 10K race in 26:36, earning 20th place in the field of 189. Freshmen Brendan Kearney and Justin Heinze recorded times of 27:35 (41st) and 27:50 (55th), respectively.

The first meet of October was the 8K Paul Short Invitational in Bethlehem, PA. Meyers led the Hawks to a 17th place finish out of 44 schools with a sixth-place individual performance (24:04). Senior captain Mike DiDio carded a 24:29 to finish 27th in a field 300-deep in his only race of the fall. Masse finished 163rd with a time of 25:49.

The Hawks then returned to State College, PA for the Penn State National Invitational. The team turned in a 23rd-place finish, paced again by a brilliant performance from Meyers (25:24, fourth overall). Mohn and Rowland both finished the 10K race in 26:58, earning 112th-place and 115th-place honors, respectively.

The last weekend of October saw Saint Joseph's return home to Philadelphia for the Atlantic 10 Championships. Five

Hawk runners finished in the top fifty in the 8K meet, including Meyers (24:37.2, second overall out of 131 entries), Rowland (25:26.1, 15th), Masse (25:40.4, 21st), Mohn (25:52.8, 27th), and Duffy (26:29.4, 46th). Freshman Michael Howanski also turned in his best time of the season, finishing 81st (27:38.9). As a team, SJU placed fourth, successfully bouncing back from their eighth-place showing in 2004. Meyers and Rowland were named All-Atlantic 10 for their efforts on the Belmont Plateau.

The Hawks then made a second trip to Bethlehem for the 10K NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regionals. The squad placed 13th out of 28, with Meyers again leading the way (31:13.3, 24th place). Mohn (31:31.6, 37th) and Rowland (31:36.9, 42nd) were close behind.

The 2005 men's cross country season came to a close in mid-November at the IC4A Championships in New York. Teddy Meyers concluded his stellar campaign with a time of 25:53.4 in the five-mile run, good for 34th out of 174. Mohn ended his cross country career on Hawk Hill with a time of 26:04.6, taking 51st place. Junior Brian O'Neill turned in his best time of the season with a 29:17.6.

All told, the 2005 season can be considered a success for coach Mike Glavin and the Hawk harriers. After injuries devastated the squad in 2004, the veteran leadership provided by experienced upperclassmen carried Saint Joseph's back to the levels that they have grown accustomed to in the past.

2005-06 TRACK REVIEW

The 2005-06 Saint Joseph's University men's track team took advantage of a solid core of senior leaders and an exciting group of youngsters to turn in successful seasons on both the indoor and outdoor ovals. Throughout the season, the Hawks had an opportunity to score points in every race they ran and to compete for top honors at every meet. Led by seniors Mike DiDio, Matt Petrocci, and Andrew Thomas, the Hawks ran to a fourth-place finish at the Atlantic 10 Championships in both the indoor and outdoor seasons.

The Hawks spent the indoor season taking event titles and qualifying for the IC4A Championships in Boston, MA. DiDio qualified for IC4As in the mile at Fordham, while two SJU relays, the distance medley and the 4x800, qualified a week later at Penn State. Junior Teddy Meyers qualified in the 3,000m and the 5,000m while sophomore Will Rowland joined him by qualifying for the 5,000m. Other qualifiers during the indoor season included seniors Petrocci (500m, 800m, 1,000m), Thomas (400m, 500m), and Joe Mohn (mile), sophomore Bobby Staten (60m), and the 4x400 relay squad.

At the Atlantic 10 Championships, three Hawks earned individual conference titles while the team took home a fourth-place finish. Petrocci (800m), Thomas (500m), and Meyers (5,000m) all became Atlantic 10 Champions, improving on the times they posted earlier in the season. Petrocci, Thomas, senior Joe Bieret, and sophomore Matt Weaver were also named to the All-Atlantic 10 Second Team after their performance in the 4x400 relay.

Four Hawks competed individually at the IC4A Championships in Boston, and were joined by three SJU relay squads. Andrew Thomas was the top performer for Saint Joseph's, equaling his own school record in the 400m trials (47.22). Unfortunately, Thomas strained a hamstring and placed fourth. DiDio, Petrocci, senior Brad Schmidt, and freshman Brendan Kearney placed seventh in the 4x800 relay with a season-

best time of 7:33.78. DiDio placed 15th in the mile as well. Teddy Meyers and Will Rowland placed ninth and 28th, respectively, in the 5,000m.

The outdoor season saw more of the same for Saint Joseph's as the Hawks placed fourth in the Atlantic 10 once again. Four Hawks won individual conference titles as the team also sent a number of runners to the IC4A and NCAA Regional championships.

SJU turned in sparkling performances at the Duke and Virginia Invitationals. DiDio, Petrocci, Staten, and Thomas all qualified for IC4As while DiDio took top honors in the 1,500m at Virginia. One week later, Rich Ryan and Teddy Meyers met IC4A qualifying standards as well. Ryan ran a 9:10.64 to qualify in the 3,000m steeplechase. Meyers' time of 14:06.23 was the second fastest 5,000m time ever recorded by a Saint Joseph's runner, and was good enough to qualify for NCAA Regional competition as well as IC4As.

At the Atlantic 10 Outdoor Championships in Charlotte, the Hawks turned in 10 team-best marks on their way to fourth place, tied for the second-best finish in school history. Four Hawks won conference titles in their events. Petrocci (800m) and Thomas (400m) placed first and qualified for NCAA competition, while DiDio (3:50.19 in the 1500m) and Meyers (14:33.25 in the 5000m) set meet records en route to taking home championship honors. Bieret, Petrocci, Staten, and Thomas also won the 4x400 relay title. For his efforts, Mike DiDio was named the Most Outstanding Performer at the Atlantic 10 Championships.

The 2005-06 track and field season ended with selected Hawks traveling to the IC4A Championships in Princeton, NJ and NCAA Regional competition in Greensboro, NC. Teddy Meyers placed sixth in the 5,000m at IC4As, turning in a 14:08.75. Bobby Staten also qualified for the 100m finals, but was unable to run due to a hamstring injury. At NCAA Regionals, Mike DiDio (1,500m) and the 4x400 relay squad placed 13th.

All in all, both the indoor and outdoor track and field seasons were successful for the Hawks. Where injuries had sidetracked them in previous seasons, Saint Joseph's instead was able to rely on experienced veterans and talented youngsters to push forward and turn in impressive performances both as a team and as individuals.

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 73 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

Xavier became the first team in NCAA history to win four games in four days at its league's men's basketball tournament twice when it won the 2006 A-10 title (previously done in 2004). The Musketeers earned the Atlantic 10's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and were joined by George Washington, which became just the fourth team in league history to go unbeaten in Conference play. The Colonials, who at one time had the nation's longest winning streak (18 games), were ranked as high as sixth in the national polls. In addition, Charlotte, Saint Joseph's, and Temple earned NIT bids. In women's basketball, Temple won its third-straight A-10 title and was joined by George Washington in the NCAA Tournament. Charlotte, Saint Joseph's, and Xavier garnered WNIT bids.

Saint Louis won the A-10 baseball championship and earned its first NCAA berth since 1966. In cross country,

Duquesne won its first-ever men's title and La Salle won its fourth women's crown in the last five years. In field hockey, Richmond ended the season ranked 19th nationally after going unbeaten in Conference play for the third straight year in advancing to the NCAAAs.

The men's golf season was the most successful in Atlantic 10 history as league champion Charlotte was joined by George Washington, Rhode Island, Richmond, and Xavier in the NCAA Tournament, marking the first time ever that five A-10 schools earned postseason bids. Charlotte, which won the title in its first season as a member of the A-10, reached the national finals for the first time in school history.

Richmond won its first-ever women's lacrosse regular season title and its second tournament title in advancing to the NCAA Tournament. In addition to Richmond, St. Bonaventure earned a national ranking in 2006, the first-ever in school history. The Massachusetts women's rowing team won its 11th straight A-10 title, building upon its league record for the most consecutive tournament championships won by any team in any sport. Rhode Island won the A-10 Men's Soccer Championship, while Saint Louis won the women's regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In softball, UMass won its 18th league championship and an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Super Regional round. St. Bonaventure won its first A-10 men's swimming & diving crown since 1999 and the Richmond women claimed their fifth straight title. Richmond captured its third straight men's and women's tennis championships and the accompanying NCAA automatic berths. Charlotte took the men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field titles. In volleyball, Dayton won its third straight Conference crown to earn the league's automatic NCAA bid.

In all, 392 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 season.

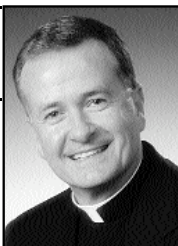

He played three seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles during the 1970s, and was the subject of the 2006 motion picture *Invincible*.

Timothy R. Lannon, SJ
University President



Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., is beginning his fourth year as president of Saint Joseph's University.

Fr. Lannon began his term as Saint Joseph's 26th president in July 2003. Since then he has led many significant University initiatives, most notably the agreement to purchase the 38-acre campus of the neighboring Episcopal Academy. Saint Joseph's anticipates taking possession of the property in 2008; the acquisition -- to be known as the Maguire Campus -- will provide unparalleled flexibility to enhance academic programs and facilities.

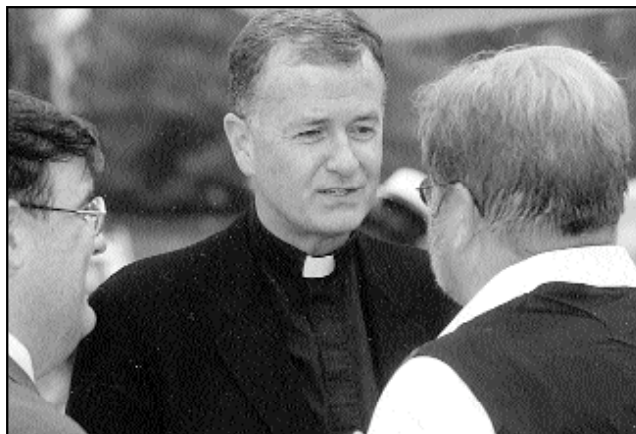
Under Fr. Lannon's stewardship, the University vastly upgraded student housing and parking options with the opening of the City Avenue Residence Halls in August 2004. Phase II of that initiative is currently underway and will result in additional parking and retail development along 54th Street.

Fr. Lannon has also played a major role in boosting Saint Joseph's academic profile, an effort which includes recently endowed faculty chairs and student scholarships as well as the opening of the Pedro Arrupe Center for Business Ethics. A major curricular-review initiative and the hiring of more than 50 new full-time faculty over a five-year period will serve to further strengthen the University's academic position. SJU has already equaled its best-ever U.S. News ranking (t-9th, Northeast) in the 2007 "America's Best Colleges" edition.

Fr. Lannon has worked tirelessly to re-engage the University in its mission and to foster expanded outreach efforts to alumni, governmental leaders, and other external constituencies. In the latter role, he serves as chair of the City Avenue Special Services District (CASSD). As a central tenet of his leadership, Fr. Lannon's has articulated a vision for Saint Joseph's to be recognized as the preeminent Catholic comprehensive university in the Northeast.

He previously was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president at Marquette University, and served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University. Fr. Lannon serves on the boards of Marquette University, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania.

Fr. Lannon has studied and written on Catholic identity at Jesuit universities. A native of Mason City, Iowa, he attended Creighton University as an undergraduate and was later president of Creighton Preparatory School. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1977 and was ordained in 1986.



Linda Lelii
Vice President/Student Life & Academic Development



Great strides have been made over the past decade to enhance the overall aspect of student life at Saint Joseph's University and at the heart of this growth and development is Vice President for Student Life and Academic Development Dr. Linda Lelii.

In her 12th year in this capacity, Dr. Lelii is responsible for Residence Life, Career Services, Counseling and Personal Development, Student Activities, Student Health, Academic Development, Advising to Students with Disabilities, Multicultural Life, Freshmen Orientation, and Athletics and Recreation.

Dr. Lelii came to Hawk Hill in 1987, when she accepted the position as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. In 1991, she was promoted to Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Lelii received her Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania in 1977 and her master's degree in psychology at Southern Methodist University in 1971.



Don DiJulia
Associate Vice President Athletic Director



One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. The 61-year old DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an Assistant Vice President/Athletic Director on June 8, 1988.

Over the past 15 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs. During his tenure, five varsity programs have been added, a new weight training facility built, athletic facilities upgraded and athletic fund drives initiated. In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as Director of Athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become Commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the Commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

A two-sport athlete as an undergraduate at SJU, DiJulia was a member of the 1964-65 Hawk basketball team which compiled a 26-1 regular season record and a top 10 national ranking under head coach Dr. Jack Ramsay. He and his wife, Pat, are the parents of seven children and reside in Havertown, Pa.



THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who seek to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,250. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

THE JESUIT TRADITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national and international opportunities for student service. From North



Philadelphia to Camden, N.J.; from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains, Saint Joseph's students embrace the Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

IDEAL CAMPUS LOCATION

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers. And with its many diverse student organizations, SJU offers ample opportunities to assume leadership positions.

An extensive on-campus recruitment program provides graduates with a head start in their employment search. Regular meetings with faculty advisors, along with advisory programs in the health professions and in pre-law, assist students who wish to further their schooling.

PHILADELPHIA

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia - only a short ride away.

SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers, as well. They visit the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts; the Franklin Institute Science Museum; the Academy of Music, which houses ballet and opera; and the new Kimmel Center, home to the Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition, SJU students know they always have a good time rooting for Philadelphia or other hometown teams in the four major professional sports.
