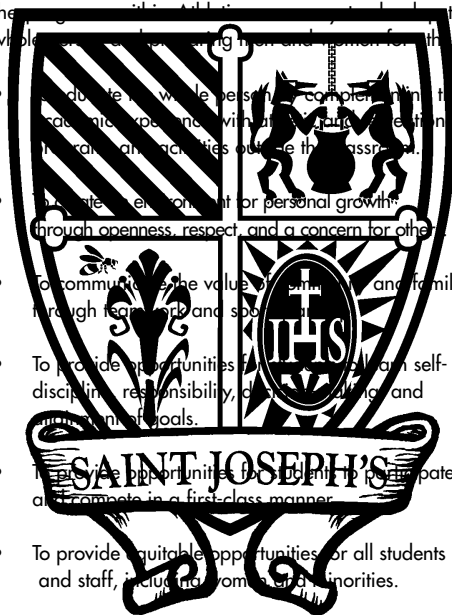

# 2004 CROSS COUNTRY OUTLOOK

Despite last year's season being hampered by injuries, men's cross country coach Mike Glavin is anticipating that this year's team will remain strong and healthy, giving them the opportunity to be top players in the race for the Atlantic 10 Conference championship.

Coach Glavin returns seven top runners from a summer of high mileage and intense training to attempt to break their three-year streak of second place Atlantic 10 finishes. This year's team will be led by senior cross country and track captain, **Collin Martin**. Martin had an outstanding spring season finishing first in the 5000m and second in the 3000m steeplechase, with a NCAA regional qualifying time of 9:05.55. According to Coach Glavin, Martin's running has steadily improved since his freshman year. As the Hawk's fifth runner at the A-10s two years ago and the fourth Hawk runner last year, Coach Glavin is confident that Martin can again improve his position and continue to provide top times.

The Hawks' top returnee, **Andre Laboy** is back after an impressive sophomore year. Laboy's first place finish at the A-10s last year earned him the honors as only the fifth Hawk harrier to win the conference championships. Laboy covered the 8k course at Belmont Plateau in 24:46.7, posting the fastest time ever of the six Atlantic 10 Championships held at the plateau. Laboy also finished 4th at the Mid-Atlantic Regionals and competed with the best in the nation at the NCAA Championships. On the track Laboy earned first team All-Atlantic 10 with his win in the indoor 5000m. He went on to place second in the 3000m at the indoor IC4A Championships where he smashed the school record by 4.5 seconds, running 8:09.07. Laboy looks to defend his Atlantic 10 Cross Country title and repeat his All-East performance from last year.

Fellow junior, **Mike DiDio**, will also be called upon as a top scorer for the Hawks this year. DiDio started off last year with an impressive first place finish at the Fordham Invitation in early September, but was unfortunately sidelined by a foot injury later in the season that left him unable to compete at the A-10s. DiDio was able to rehab his injured foot and come back for a competitive indoor season, running a leg of the Atlantic 10 championship DMR, as well as qualifying for the IC4A championships in the 1500m running a 3:49.00. Coach Glavin will be looking to DiDio, as a top finisher for the Hawks,

who will be counted on to help lead the team at the Atlantic 10 Championships.

Another top returnee, junior **Rich Anderson**, has been battling injury a good portion of his career as a Hawk harrier. After strong indoor and outdoor track seasons and a dedicated summer of training, Glavin expects Anderson again to be consistently running in the top three. Junior **Joe Mohn** also spent time in the Hawks top three last fall. Despite battling health problems, Mohn was able to provide top times for the Hawks and this season he looks to reclaim the All-Conference honors he earned as a freshman.

Fellow junior **Dave Masse** was also a strong contributor to the Hawks' successes last season. He was a consistent top performer and could also be a contender for All-Conference honors. Rounding out the top returnees is sophomore **Teddy Meyers**. Meyers was a pleasant surprise for Coach Glavin last year. In his rookie season, he finished second for the Hawks and 15th overall at the Atlantic 10 Championships. Coach Glavin also welcomes newcomers freshmen **Will Rowland** and **Rich Ryan**. These two rookies will definitely be looking to make their mark on the team.

This season's schedule is again filled with competitive meets including the famed Paul Short Invitational at Lehigh University in September, the Pre-National meet in Terra Haute, Indiana in mid-October, the Atlantic 10 Championships held in Pittsburgh October 30th, and the NCAA Regional Meet and Championships in late November.

The Hawks have a strong team this year with a great deal of depth and experience. According to Coach Glavin, if everyone can remain healthy, expect Saint Joseph's to be a top player at the Conference Championships.

## 2004-05 TRACK OUTLOOK

Saint Joseph's track team has always been strong in the sprints, however the Hawks graduated a core of that talent last year, losing two key members of the school record holding 4x400m relay team, Nick Carras and Jerry Puryear. Coach Glavin will be looking to senior track co-captain **Doug Rick** and junior **Andrew Thomas** to step up and lead the sprinters by both talent and example.

Co-captain Rick had an impressive 2004 placing fourth in the indoor 500m at the ICAAAA Championships with a time of 1:02.05, which broke the previous school record (also broken that day by teammate Thomas). Rick also ran the fastest outdoor quarter in a relay leg at 46.7 two years ago and was a member of the school record breaking 4x400m relay team. Coach Glavin will no doubt be looking to Rick to help rebuild a strong sprint team.

Along with Rick, Thomas will be called upon to lend his talent to the sprint group. Thomas holds the school records in both the outdoor 400m (46.85) and indoor 500m (1:01.98). He also placed second in the 500m at the indoor IC4A Championships and ran a 1:52.8 to win the conference title in the outdoor 800m, running both IC4A and NCAA qualifying times.

Glavin returns a strong core of mid-distance runners, led by senior co-captain **Brad Schmidt**. Schmidt has consistently performed well in the 800m and 1500m. Glavin will look to Schmidt to be a top player at the Atlantic 10 Championships and a strong member of relay teams. Saint Joseph's also looks forward to the return of juniors **Matt Petrocci**, **Rich Anderson** and **Mike DiDio** to the mid-distance group. Coach Glavin will be counting on these runners to represent the Hawks in the 800m/1000m/1500m events and improve their performances from last season.

A talented group of returning distance runners will definitely be the Hawks strength this year. Senior co-captain **Collin Martin** will be looking to leave his mark in one of the most difficult events, the steeplechase. After running an impressive second place at the outdoor Atlantic 10's last year, Martin will be looking to compete for the title this year. Martin will also be out to defend his outdoor 5000m conference title. Junior **Andre Laboy** will lend his talents to the 3000m/5000m/1000m events. The school record holder in the indoor 3000m, Laboy hopes to repeat his All-Conference honors and better his IC4A performances. Coach Glavin will also look to junior **Dave Masse** and sophomore **Teddy**

**Meyers** to step up and be top performers at the conference championships.

A talented group of freshmen will also be joining the Hawks this year. Sprinters **Bobby Boyer** and **Quenton Rich Ryan** will assist in the mid-distance and Will Rowland in the distance events.

Coach Glavin in confident his team will be in the hunt for top positions in the both the indoor and outdoor conference championships. With the leadership, talent and experience his team possesses, the Hawks are definitely going to be a tough contender in the Atlantic 10 this year.

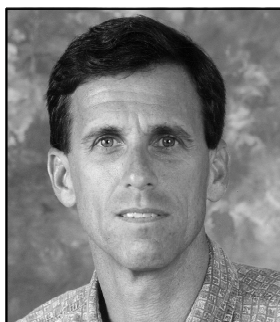

# HEAD COACH



## MIKE GLAVIN (SAINT JOSEPH'S '78)

HEAD COACH - 16TH SEASON

Mike Glavin, a 1978 graduate of SJU, is in his sixteenth year as head men's cross country and track coach. The 1992, 1998 and 2000 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for Men's Cross Country, Glavin has led the men to three A-10 Championship titles. Under his watchful eye, the Hawks have produced 31 all-conference harriers and three NCAA qualifiers.

Glavin returned to his alma mater after a highly successful ten-year stint as track and cross country coach at Paul VI High School in Haddon Heights, N.J. During his tenure there, he led the cross country team to a phenomenal 110-0 record, including three state championships in 1984, 1985 and 1988. His track record was an equally impressive 60-18, which included four South Jersey championships and the 1989 state crown.

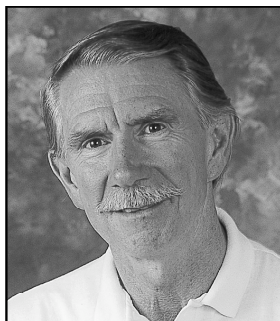
A stellar performer for the Hawks as an undergrad, Glavin established numerous records, including the outdoor track record for the three-mile and the 5,000 meter runs and the indoor record for the mile and two-mile. He also held the Belmont Plateau cross country record with a time of 25:36. Glavin qualified for the NCAA Cross Country Championships in both his junior and senior years.

Glavin holds a Master's degree in mathematics from Villanova University and is currently teaching at Haddonfield High School in New Jersey. The 47-year-old resides in Ardmore, Pa. with his wife Julie.

# DIRECTOR OF TRACK AND FIELD



## KEVIN QUINN (SAINT JOSEPH'S '62)

DIRECTOR OF TRACK AND FIELD - 39TH SEASON

Kevin Quinn is in his 39th year directing the SJU track and cross country programs, including the last 19 as the head of the women's programs. A 1962 SJU graduate, Quinn joined the Hawk athletic staff as the men's cross country and track coach in the fall of 1966. In 1985, he added the duties of the women's cross country and track program and has been the team's coach for the past 19 years. SJU's Director of Track and Field was named to his current position of assistant athletic director for facilities in July of 1989. In 2001 he was promoted to associate athletic director of facilities.

An outstanding educator, teacher and motivator, Quinn has led the Hawk track program to great success during his tenure. His men's cross country teams won two Big Five Championships, while his 1984 men's track team recorded a seventh-place finish at the IC4A Championships.

More recently, under Quinn's tutelage the 1997 track team set 10 new school records including the first ever women's Penn Relays win by the 4x800 relay team. He coached the 1993 women's cross country team to the Atlantic 10 Championship title, the first-ever won by a women's sport at SJU. That same team also finished 7th in the ECAC Championships. In 2000, Quinn again coached the women's team to an Atlantic 10 Championship victory, earning conference coach of the year honors. Last season, eight school records were broken under Quinn's watchful eye.

An outstanding athlete in his own right, Quinn once held the school records in the mile and two mile runs. A charter member of the SJU Track Hall of Fame, he placed third in the 1961 IC4A Cross Country Championships and was the first American finisher in the race. For his dedication and achievements, Quinn was inducted into Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001. The 63-year-old resides in Bala Cynwyd, Pa. with his wife Marie. They are the parents of six children (Kevin, Marie, Sean, Kathleen, Colleen and Brendan).

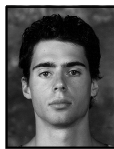

John Capiello, a two-time all-conference runner and 1998 graduate of Saint Joseph's, is in his second season as an assistant on Mike Glavin's staff.

Capiello's best finish was at the 1997 Atlantic 10 Cross Country Championships, where he finished fourth overall. He was all-conference in 1995 after finishing 10th.

A 2001 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Karl Savage is in his first season as an assistant on Mike Glavin's staff. He was the 2000 Atlantic 10 Performer of the Year in both Cross Country and Track.

Savage twice earned all-conference honors in cross country and was an NCAA qualifier in 2000, placing 67th overall at the national meet.

Corey Shannon, SJU's assistant director of recreation, is in his second year as an assistant track and field coach. A 1998 graduate of Pennsylvania, Shannon works primarily with the throwers.

An All-East and All-Ivy performer at Penn, Shannon was the IC4A champion and finished second at the Penn Relays in the javelin.

# FINNESEY FIELD

Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk athletics since 1929.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the men's track team, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU women's track and field, men's and women's soccer and both men's and women's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site. Several war-era relics, in fact, were discovered during landscaping work in 1939.



## THE HAWK



The "Hawks" nickname has been associated with the Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor, Charlie Dunn decided to initiate a contest among the student body for a symbol.

Nearly 100 names were submitted and narrowed down to the Hawks winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin in a final vote. The winning suggestion was entered by John Gallagher, class of 1931.

Gallagher's choice was selected because "it is suggestive of the aerial attack which made our football team famous," according to the student newspaper which also took the name *The Hawk*. Football, ironically, was discontinued at Saint Joseph's following the 1939 season.

A costumed Hawk mascot made its debut on January 4, 1956. It is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

The Hawk has been named the "Best Mascot in the Nation" by *The Sporting News* and *Sports Illustrated*.

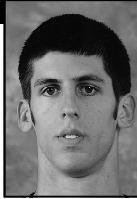

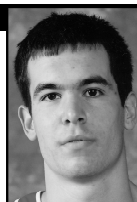

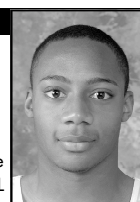

# 2003 CROSS COUNTRY REVIEW

Despite what his surname may indicate, sophomore harrier Andre Laboy was the man this fall. The Danbury, Conn. native blazed a path, usually from the front of the pack, over cross country courses all across the East Coast to earn a trip to the NCAA Championships in Waterloo, Iowa. After winning the Atlantic 10 Championship and placing fourth at the Mid-Atlantic Regional, Laboy competed with the nation's best and finished 75th overall in the field of 254 runners.

While Laboy was certainly the big story on Hawk Hill, a number of other runners helped the Hawks to a second-place finish at the Atlantic 10 Championships and 12th at the Regional Championships. Fellow sophomore Mike DiDio, who won the Fordham Invitational in early September, was a contender for the A-10 Individual title before a foot injury sidelined him late in the season. He tried to push through the pain at A-10s, but was forced to withdraw from the race after the first lap.

Freshman Teddy Meyers was a pleasant surprise, finishing second for SJU at A-10s and third among league rookies. Sophomore David Masse and junior Collin Martin continued to provide top times for Saint Joseph's and sophomore Joe Mohn battled health problems to round out the top five.

Saint Joseph's opened the season with its younger runners taking part in the Ursinus Invitational in late August. Meyers, freshman Ryan Bennett, and Masse finished three-four-five for the Hawks, which won the event over La Salle and Haverford. Meyers won A-10 Rookie of the Week honors for his performance.

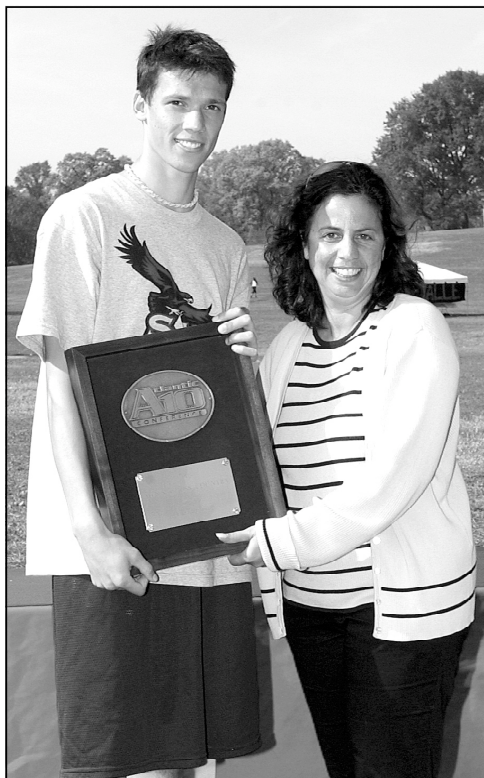
Two weeks later, DiDio won the Fordham Invitational and edged Laboy and Martin, who finished second and third, to help SJU capture the team title over city rival Pennsylvania. With Meyers (sixth) and Masse (11th), Saint Joseph's took five of the first 11 spots.

In early October, Saint Joseph's took on some of the nation's best teams at the prestigious Notre Dame Invitational. The Hawks placed 11th out of 23 teams and Laboy began to hit his stride with a seventh place finish in a field of 188. The sophomore earned his first A-10 Runner of the Week honor.

Laboy maintained his stature as one of the region's best runners with a second place finish at the Penn State National Invitational and helped SJU to a sixth place finish. He was just seven seconds off the pace of PSU's Dan Mazzocco, who would go on to win the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional race.

Another two weeks later, it was back home at Fairmont Park's Belmont Plateau for the Atlantic 10 Championships. Laboy finished in 24:46.7, the fastest time in six A-10 Championships at Belmont, and had the fourth largest margin of victory in conference history. DiDio was among the leaders but trying to race on a broken metatarsal proved to be too much and gutsy performances from Meyers, Masse and Martin were enough to finish second behind La Salle, who won its third straight league title.

Laboy went on to strong performances at the NCAA Regional and National meets. Along with a slew of talented underclassman, Laboy and the Hawks seem poised to dominate the Atlantic 10 for years to come.

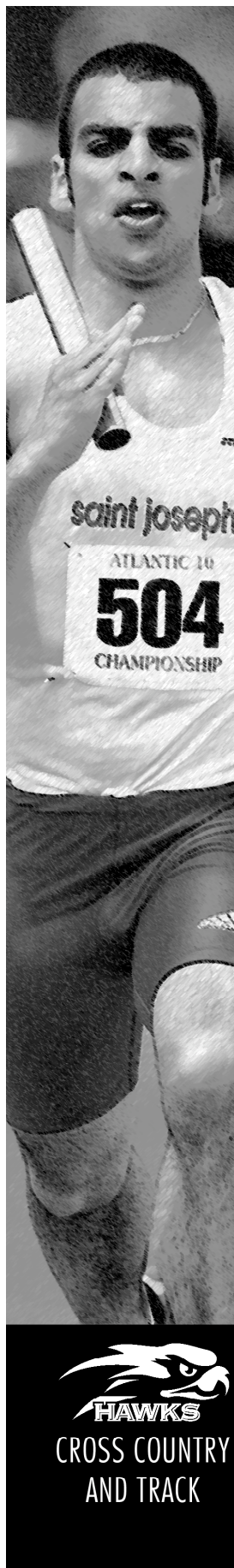

# 2003-04 TRACK AND FIELD REVIEW

In typical Hawk fashion, it was numbers in the distance and middle distance events that set the tone for the Saint Joseph's men's track and field team on the oval in 2003-04. Paced by an experienced group of upper classmen and a talented collection of newcomers the squad posted impressive showings throughout the indoor and outdoor seasons.

The indoor slate was filled with strong overall showings by the team, as momentum built and times shrunk as the season progressed. A sixth place finish in a field of more than 40 schools at the prestigious New Balance Collegiate Invitational held at The Armory labeled the Hawks as contenders for the A-10 title. Eight SJU runners achieved IC4A qualifying standards on the fast track.

One week later, sophomore Andre Laboy, who earned first team All-Atlantic 10 honors in a pair of events by winning the 5000m and leading off the Distance Medley Relay, led the Hawk men to a third place finish at the Atlantic 10 Indoor Track and Field Championships.

Laboy and David Masse placed one-two in the 5,000 to highlight the Hawk individuals. Laboy covered the oval in 15:00.01 to best the field and Masse followed right behind in a time of 15:01.22. The DMR comprised of Laboy, Kile Garguilo, Chris Kessler and Mike DiDio also claimed gold. SJU received second team All-A-10 honors from Andrew Thomas (49.19) in the 400m, Chris Koneski (1:05.13) in the 500m, Brad Schmidt (2:29.50) in the 1000 and the 4x800 relay team (7:51.59) of Matt Petrocci, Rich Anderson, Schmidt and Thomas.

The team followed up its showing at A-10s by breaking four school records in three different events en route to a school-best eighth place finish in a field of over 80 schools at the IC4A Championships in Boston.

Leading the record setting day for SJU was Laboy, who placed 2nd in the 3000m in 8:09.07, smashing the old school record by 4.5 seconds. SJU also qualified three runners to the 10 man final in the 500m. Thomas won the seeded section, and placed second overall just 0.3 seconds out of first. His time of 1:01.98 broke the school record set at the IC4As in 2002. Doug Rick placed 4th in the same event by running 1:02.05 (also bettering the former record). Koneski also qualified for the final with a personal best 1:03.50.

In the relays, the 4x400 relay team of Nick Carras, Thomas, Koneski, and Rick won their heat on Saturday in a school record time of 3:12.37. That mark was short-lived, however, as they came back on Sunday to place 4th overall in another record time of 3:11.60. The 4x800 relay of Anderson, Schmidt, Jerry Puryear, and DiDio made the final. Puryear, however, was injured on the 3rd exchange, and was replaced by freshman Chris Kessler. The team placed 6th.

Following up its successful indoor campaign, SJU had high hopes for the outdoor season, but after a strong start injuries and bad luck conspired to derail the Hawks' plans.

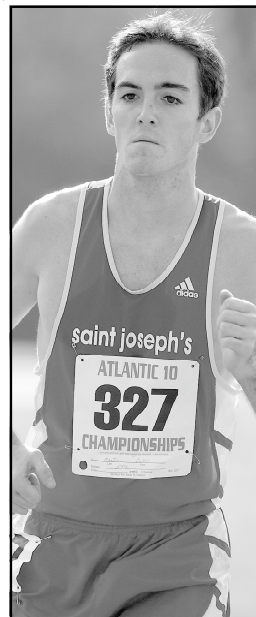
The team was rounding into form outdoor after a solid effort at the Duke Invitational and then placing eighth in the 21 team field at Virginia in early April. Key injuries, however, began to slow the team's progress, as Laboy and Rick were lost for the remainder of the season.

The shorthanded Hawk men placed fifth at the A-10

Outdoor Championships. Thomas took first in the 800m with a time of 1:53.18. Collin Martin won the 5000 in 15:15.04 and was second in the 3000m Steeplechase in a time of 9:05.55. The Hawks also won the 4x400 relay. The snakebit Hawks received another blow when Puryear was disqualified after winning the 400m Hurdles.

Sparked by a fourth place finish from Thomas in the 400m, the team placed 37th at the IC4A Championships. Thomas placed fifth during qualifying, narrowly missing a Hawk record with a time of 46.85. He then returned in the final to place fourth overall in a time of 47.10. The 4x800 circled the track in 7:37.27 in qualifying to place eighth and reach the final. It then ran 7:37.40 in the final to finish ninth.

Thomas and Martin represented SJU in a field of nearly 200 schools at the NCAA Regional Championships. Thomas placed sixth in his 800m heat and finished 27th overall. Martin finished 19th in the 3000m Steeplechase.

Saint Joseph's, Dayton, and Richmond each garnered at-large berths with the Musketeers and Hawks coming within a game of the Final Four - the first time that two Atlantic 10 teams reached the Elite 8 in the same season. With four teams earning NCAA bids, the A-10 has now sent multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament 13 of the last 14 seasons. George Washington, Rhode Island, and Temple also received NIT bids. George Washington and Temple

earned berths in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament - the 10th time in 11 years that the Conference sent multiple teams. Richmond, Saint Joseph's, and Xavier participated in the WNIT, with the Spiders reaching the semifinals.

In men's golf, Rhode Island became the first team in A-10 history to qualify for the National Golf Championship; Richmond earned NCAA bids in field hockey and men's and women's tennis; Dayton represented the A-10 in the NCAA volleyball and women's soccer tournaments; Temple earned berths in the women's lacrosse and softball tournaments; St. Bonaventure advanced to the NCAA Baseball Tournament; Rhode Island garnered the A-10's men's soccer automatic bid; and Massachusetts went to the NCAA Softball Tournament for the 10th straight year by earning an at-large berth.



In all, 356 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 in post-season play since the 1976-77 season.

Atlantic 10 student-athletes excel in the classroom as well. The Atlantic 10 sponsors several academic awards programs, including Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and the Commissioner's Honor Roll, which honored an Atlantic 10 record 1,830 student-athletes with a 3.0 grade point average or better this past year. The league also cites a male and female Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and awards four postgraduate scholarships to student-athletes who express a desire to continue their education.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, which spans six states and the District of Columbia with a total population of almost 58 million people, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

# ADMINISTRATION

## TIMOTHY R. LANNON, S.J. PRESIDENT



Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., an accomplished leader in Jesuit education, is in his second year as the university's chief executive. Fr. Lannon succeeded Nicholas S. Rashford, S.J., at the start of the 2003-04 academic year. Increased undergraduate admissions applications and alumni donations marked the first year of the Lannon era, as did construction of the City Avenue Residence Halls.

Fr. Lannon came to Saint Joseph's from Marquette University, a fellow Jesuit institution in Milwaukee, Wisc., where he was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president. He previously served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross (1996) and Boston College (1997-99), also Jesuit institutions, while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University.

The 53-year-old Fr. Lannon is a native of Mason City, Iowa. He is a 1973 graduate of Creighton University, a Jesuit school in Omaha, Neb., where he earned a B.S. in mathematics and was elected president of the student body. He entered the Society of Jesus (Wisconsin Province) in 1977, completing philosophy studies at Saint Louis University and later two advanced degrees at the Weston Jesuit School of Theology in Cambridge, Mass.

Fr. Lannon spent 1980-83 at Marquette University High School in Milwaukee, teaching mathematics and theology and also working as academic assistant principal. He was ordained a Roman Catholic priest in 1986 and, in 1988, was named president of Creighton Preparatory School in Omaha. He served seven years in that post before returning his focus to higher education.

Between 1996 and 2000, Fr. Lannon earned a master's degree in education along with a doctorate in administration, planning and social policy in higher education from Harvard University. His dissertation — "Catholic Identity at Jesuit Universities: How Do the Presidents of Jesuit Universities Promote the School's Catholic Identity?" — was excerpted in *Conversations on Jesuit Higher Education*. He presented on a related topic, "Catholic Identity vs. Secularization," at the international Jesuit Higher Education 21 conference, held at Saint Joseph's in June 1999.

At Marquette, Fr. Lannon was asked to lead the University Advancement area after two years in central administration. Development income achieved record-breaking years in both 2000-01 and 2001-02, with Fr. Lannon also serving as vice chair of the University Planning Council and as a member of the University Marketing Council.



## LINDA LELII VICE PRESIDENT/STUDENT LIFE & ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT



Great strides have been made over the past decade to enhance the overall aspect of student life at Saint Joseph's University and at the heart of this growth and development is Vice President for Student Life and Academic Development Dr. Linda Lelii.

In her 11th year in this capacity, Dr. Lelii is responsible for Residence Life, Career Services, Counseling and Personal Development, Student Activities, Student Health, Academic Development, Advising to Students with Disabilities, Multicultural Life, Freshmen Orientation, and Athletics and Recreation.

Dr. Lelii came to Hawk Hill in 1987, when she accepted the position as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. In 1991, she was promoted to Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Lelii received her Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania in 1977 and her master's degree in psychology at Southern Methodist University in 1971.

## DON DIJULIA ASSOC. VICE PRESIDENT/ ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. The 61-year-old DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an Assistant Vice President/Athletic Director on June 8, 1988.

Over the past 15 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs. During his tenure, five varsity programs have been added, a new weight training facility built, athletic facilities upgraded and athletic fund drives initiated. In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as Director of Athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become Commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the Commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

A two-sport athlete as an undergraduate at SJU, DiJulia was a member of the 1964-65 Hawk basketball team which compiled a 26-1 regular season record and a top 10 national ranking under head coach Dr. Jack Ramsay. He and his wife, Pat, are the parents of seven children and reside in Havertown, Pa.

Jim Brown is in his fourth year as Assistant Vice President for Athletic Business Affairs at Saint Joseph's University, after spending three years as Assistant Athletic Director for Business Affairs.

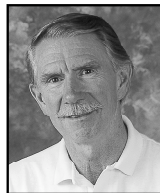

The head track coach at Saint Joseph's for the last 38 years, Kevin Quinn was promoted to Associate Athletic Director for facilities in 2002 after serving as Assistant Athletic Director since July 1989.

A 1962 SJU graduate, Quinn joined the Hawk athletic staff as the men's cross country and track coach in the fall of 1966. In 1985, he added the duties of the women's cross country and track program and also has been that team's coach for the past 18 years.

An outstanding trackster as a Hawk, Quinn once held all of SJU's distance records in the mile, two mile and cross country. A charter member of the SJU Track Hall of Fame, he placed third in the 1961 NCAA Cross Country Championships and was the first American finisher in the race.

## ELLEN RYAN ASSOC. ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/ VARSITY SPORTS

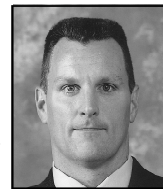

The department's senior women's administrator, she is in her fourth year as Associate Athletic Director for Varsity Sports. She previously spent 19 years as Assistant Director of Athletics. The person most responsible for the growth of women's athletics at SJU, Ryan has seen the women's program post winning marks in 25 of the last 28 years. ## SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The university boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers. And with its many diverse student organizations, SJU offers ample opportunities to assume leadership positions.

An extensive on-campus recruitment program provides graduates with a head start in their employment search. Regular meetings with faculty advisors, along with advisory programs in the health professions and in pre-law, assist students who wish to further their schooling.

## PHILADELPHIA

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia - only a short ride away.

SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers, as well. They visit the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, the Franklin Institute Science Museum, the Academy of Music, which houses ballet and opera, and the new Kimmel Center, home to the Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition, SJU students know they always have a good time rooting for Philadelphia or other hometown teams in the four major professional sports.



Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The university combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who seek to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 3,900. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,000.

## THE JESUIT TRADITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in *Barron's*, *U.S. News & World Report* and *Peterson's*. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-

foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

## A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the university's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national and international opportunities for student service. From North Philadelphia to Camden, N.J., from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains, Saint Joseph's students embrace the Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

## IDEAL CAMPUS LOCATION

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds.
