2008 PREVIEW

Saint Joseph's women's lacrosse head coach **Denise Roessler** returns her four top scorers and one of the best goalkeepers in school history to the 2008 squad.

The offense will be the least of Roessler's concerns with four players returning that had 33 or more points in 2007. Leading the way is sophomore **Jenna Martino**, who was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team last spring. She led the team in goals (31) and added six assists for a team-high 37 points.

Joining Martino on the offensive front are seniors **Christina Colangelo** and **Lindsey-Kate McCool** as well as junior **Jessica Westlake**. Westlake and Colangelo tallied 27 and 26 goals apiece, while McCool's all-around scoring effort saw her put up 18 goals and 15 assists.

McCool currently ranks amongst the all-time leaders in SJU women's lacrosse history. She enters the season third in assists (44), seventh in ground balls (117), eighth in goals (61), and ninth in points (105).

McCool has also played and started in every game (47) for the Crimson and Gray. She isn't the only Hawk to achieve that feat as Colangelo has done the same. Provided they both play in every game this season, they will surpass Megan O'Donnell and Jen Fletcher, who graduated last spring, on the all-time games played list (61).

The Hawk offense is also aided by seniors **Abby Renninger** and **Colleen Ingelsby**, who combined for 23 goals and 16 assists.

Junior **Suzu Herlihy** compiled an impressive stat line in her first year on Hawk Hill. The Delaware transfer's 152 saves in 2007 were sixth-best in a season, while her goals against average (GAA) was third-best at 8.69. Currently, her GAA ranks her atop the all-time list.

In front of Herlihy, a younger corps of defenders will step up to fill the shoes of the departed seniors. Juniors **Jontell Lyons** and **Meghan Cullinan** are the veterans in the back to shore up the Hawk defense. Helping Lyons and Cullinan from the midfield will be senior **Courtney McManama**.

Other veterans who look to provide valuable experience and leadership on the field will be juniors **Kelly Heuther**, **Becca Collins**, and **Helene Tursi** as well as sophomores **Casey Lieb** and **Rae Wojnar**. Sophomore **Kaitlin LaBarbera** will serve as the Hawks' backup goalkeeper this season, as well.

SJU will be bolstered by a crop of 10 freshmen, which will help the back line and give depth to the offense. **Jenna Ambrosini**, **Christine Readinger**, **Kelley Pendergast**, and **Maddie Lynch** are the defensive stoppers, while **Kristen Reynolds**, **Alison Reynolds** and **Gracia Barr** will help the midfield. **Alexis Arons**, **Ashley Scherer** and **Francesca Volpe** will backup the veteran crew on the attack.

The Hawks face a tough non-conference slate including games against nationally-ranked Rutgers, local rival Villanova as well as two tough CAA opponents in Old Dominion and George Mason. Additionally, Saint Joseph's will take on its difficult Atlantic 10 schedule, culminating with the A-10 Championship in Amherst, Mass..

HEAD COACH



Denise Roessler Head Coach – 9th Season Old Dominion '95

Denise Roessler returns for her ninth year as head coach of the Saint Joseph's women's lacrosse team. In eight years, Roessler has compiled a 40-77 record, highlighted by a spot in the Atlantic 10 Tournament in 2001.

Last season, Roessler led the Hawks to a 7-9 record, their best mark since 2004 when SJU went 8-6. With a veteran core of talent that Roessler has recruited, this season looks to be one of the best on Hawk Hill.

A 1995 graduate of Old Dominion, where she earned a bachelor's of science degree in sports medicine, Roessler previously served as the head women's lacrosse coach at La Salle University. She led the Explorers to a 5-9 overall record in their inaugural season of varsity competition in 1998.

In addition to her head coaching duties, Roessler previously spent three years as an assistant field hockey coach at Saint Joseph's from 1998-2000.

Prior to taking over at La Salle, Roessler served as the head junior varsity and assistant varsity field hockey coach at Bishop Eustace Prep. In 1995, she led Eustace to a 10-0-2 record.

In the spring of 1996, she joined the staff at her alma mater, Camden Catholic ('91), as a volunteer assistant lacrosse coach.

At Old Dominion, Roessler played women's lacrosse under Sue Stahl, who also serves as the United States National Team head women's lacrosse coach. She is still active, playing in the West Jersey Field Hockey League as well as the Philadelphia Women's Lacrosse League.

A native of Pennsauken, N.J., Roessler was a First Team All-Conference and All-Parochial selection in lacrosse as a senior at Camden Catholic.

Roessler currently resides in Marlton, N.J. with her husband Scott and their daughter, Jordan.

Melissa Hieber, a 2002 graduate of Saint Joseph's, returns for her sixth season as a member of the women's lacrosse staff. A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks after earning a spot as a walk-on, Hieber earned a starting position her freshman year. A mainstay at midfield during her four years, Hieber was named captain as a senior. As a sophomore in 2000, she was named both the team's Defensive Player of the Year and MVP. As a senior, Hieber suffered a career-ending facial fracture. Due to her continued support and leadership off the field, she was honored by her teammates and coaches with the Loyalty Award.

Holding a bachelor's degree in marketing, Hieber earned a master's degree in education from Saint Joseph's in 2004. A 1998 graduate of Camden Catholic High School, she is currently working towards her master's in educational leadership to obtain her Principals' Certification. Hieber currently resides in Paoli, Pa. and teaches fifth grade in Lower Merion.

Kinney graduated last spring with her bachelor's degree in marketing. Currently, she is working on the staff as a Volunteer Assistant and resides in Marlton, N.J.

FINNESEY FIELD



Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk women's lacrosse since its inception in 1993.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the women's lacrosse team, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, men's and women's soccer and men's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

Saint Joseph's women's lacrosse team has compiled a record of 46-66 on the field since 1993.

Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site. Several war-era relics, in fact, were discovered during landscaping work in 1939.

DIRECTIONS TO FINNESEY FIELD

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for over half a century, having celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The beginning of April saw SJU hit a four-game losing skid, with a loss to Rutgers, as well as conference rivals Richmond and St. Bonaventure and a heartbreaker to Duquesne. The Hawks got back on track with wins over Lafayette (14-6) and La Salle (14-7) but lost three more as the end of April approached, falling 9-1 at George Washington, 13-5 at Lehigh and 9-5 at Massachusetts. ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE



On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation work. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. In doing so, the Atlantic 10, under the leadership of commissioner Linda Bruno, instituted the Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better. 1,170 student-athletes were named to the Fall 2006 Honor Roll and 1,119 were named to the Spring 2007 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. In 2006-

07, over 170 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition. Also, the Atlantic 10 provides postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes.

Five A-10 schools were among the 51 cited for having five or more athletics programs recognized by the NCAA for their latest Academic Progress Rate scores. Fordham led the Atlantic 10 in the number of high-performing squads with nine teams receiving awards. Only the Ivy League (eight) and Patriot League (six) had more than the A-10's five, which was matched by the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Charlotte cross country and track & field standout Jane Daniels was chosen as a 2006-07 NCAA Div. I Coca-Cola Community All-American. The national honor includes a \$5,000 donation in her name to the charity of her choice. Daniels chose to split her donation among Girls on the Run International, the Charlotte University City YMCA and the Oostburg (Wis.) Community Education Foundation.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 73 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.



Ali Wean became the first Hawk to earn Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Year honors, as All-Conference First Team member led the A-10 in goals (14) and points (33).



Rebecca Cunfer, the 2004 Atlantic 10 Field Hockey Rookie of the Year, was named Student-Athlete of the Year in 2006.

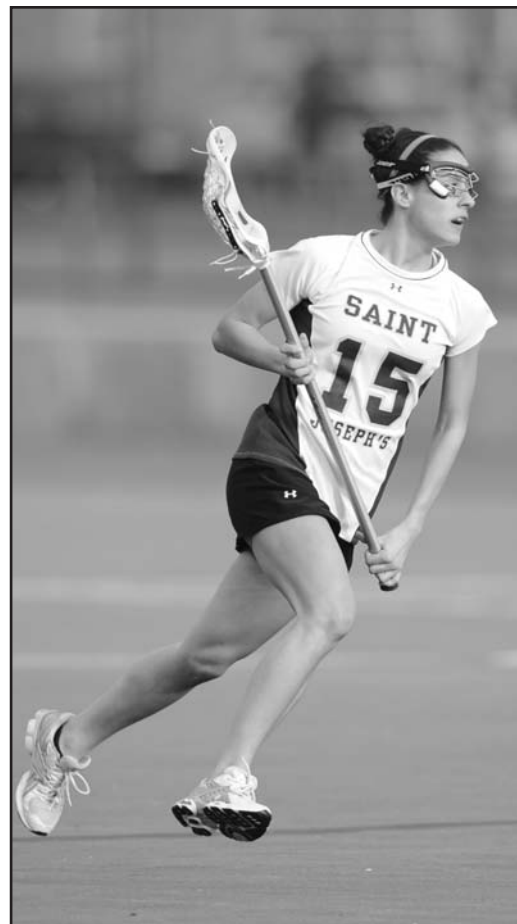

Timothy R. Lannon, S.J.
University President

Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., is in his fifth year as president of Saint Joseph's University.

Fr. Lannon began his term as Saint Joseph's 26th president in July 2003. Since then he has led many significant University initiatives, most notably the agreement to purchase the 38-acre campus of the neighboring Episcopal Academy. Saint Joseph's anticipates taking possession of the property in 2008; the acquisition – to be known as the Maguire Campus – will provide unparalleled flexibility to enhance academic programs and facilities.

Under Fr. Lannon's stewardship, the University vastly upgraded student housing and parking options with the opening of the City Avenue Residence Halls in August 2004. Phase II of that initiative is currently underway and will result in additional parking and retail development along 54th Street.

Fr. Lannon has also played a major role in boosting Saint Joseph's academic profile, an effort which includes recently endowed faculty chairs and student scholarships as well as the opening of the Pedro Arrupe Center for Business Ethics. A major curricular-review initiative and the hiring of more than 50 new full-time faculty over a five-year period will serve to further strengthen the University's academic position. SJU has attained its best-ever U.S. News ranking (t-8th, Northeast) in the 2008 "America's Best Colleges" edition.

Fr. Lannon has worked tirelessly to re-engage the University in its mission and to foster expanded outreach efforts to alumni, governmental leaders, and other external constituencies. In the latter role, he serves as chair of the City Avenue Special Services District (CASSD). As a central tenet of his leadership, Fr. Lannon's has articulated a vision for Saint Joseph's to be recognized as the preeminent Catholic comprehensive university in the Northeast.

He previously was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president at Marquette University, and served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University. Fr. Lannon serves on the boards of Marquette University, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania.

Fr. Lannon has studied and written on Catholic identity at Jesuit universities. A native of Mason City, Iowa, he attended Creighton University as an undergraduate and was later president of Creighton Preparatory School. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1977 and was ordained in 1986.



Dr. Cary Anderson
Vice President for Student Life

Cary Anderson, Ed.D., is the newest member of the Saint Joseph's University administration, assuming the post of vice president for student life on June 1, 2007. He brings a wealth of experience in higher education and student affairs to Saint Joseph's, along with a great familiarity with Jesuit institutions.

As vice president for student life, Dr. Anderson oversees many areas, including athletics and recreation, along with residence life, career development and counseling services.

Dr. Anderson came to SJU from Canisius College, where he served as the associate vice president and dean of students for eight years. Prior to that, he spent over nine years at the College of the Holy Cross, working first as complex director, then advancing to assistant dean of students and then to associate dean of students.

Dr. Anderson holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa and a master's degree from Loyola University of Chicago. He earned his doctorate in education from the University of Massachusetts while working at Holy Cross.

He is a contributing columnist with several student affairs publications, and was recently elected editor of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) Journal.

Dr. Anderson and his wife, Cindy, live in Bala Cynwyd, Pa. with their daughter, Chay.



Don DiJulia
Associate Vice President
Athletic Director

One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an assistant vice president/athletic director on June 8, 1988.

Over the past 19 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs.

Saint Joseph's is undergoing the biggest project in DiJulia's tenure with the expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which will include a dedicated center for men's and women's basketball. This comprehensive plan to enhance varsity and recreational sports at SJU also includes the transition to the Maguire Campus, which will add the use of four playing fields, two gymnasiums and eight tennis courts to the program.

In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as director of athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

He and his wife, Pat, have seven children and eight grandchildren, and reside in Havertown, Pa.



THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,150. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national, and international opportunities for student service. From parts of



Philadelphia to New Jersey; from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains; and from Ecuador to Tanzania, Saint Joseph's students embrace the Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers. And with its many diverse student organizations, SJU offers ample opportunities to assume leadership positions.

An extensive on-campus recruitment program provides graduates with a head start in their employment search. Regular meetings with faculty advisors, along with advisory programs in the health professions and in pre-law, assist students who wish to further their schooling.

PHILADELPHIA

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia - only a short ride away.

Center City's cultural, commercial, and recreational activities are only a short ride away. SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers - the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Franklin Institute Science Museum, and the new Kimmel Center, to name a few. In addition to rooting for their beloved Hawks, SJU students can be found cheering on the eight professional sports teams in the city, particularly the Eagles, Flyers, Phillies and 76ers.
