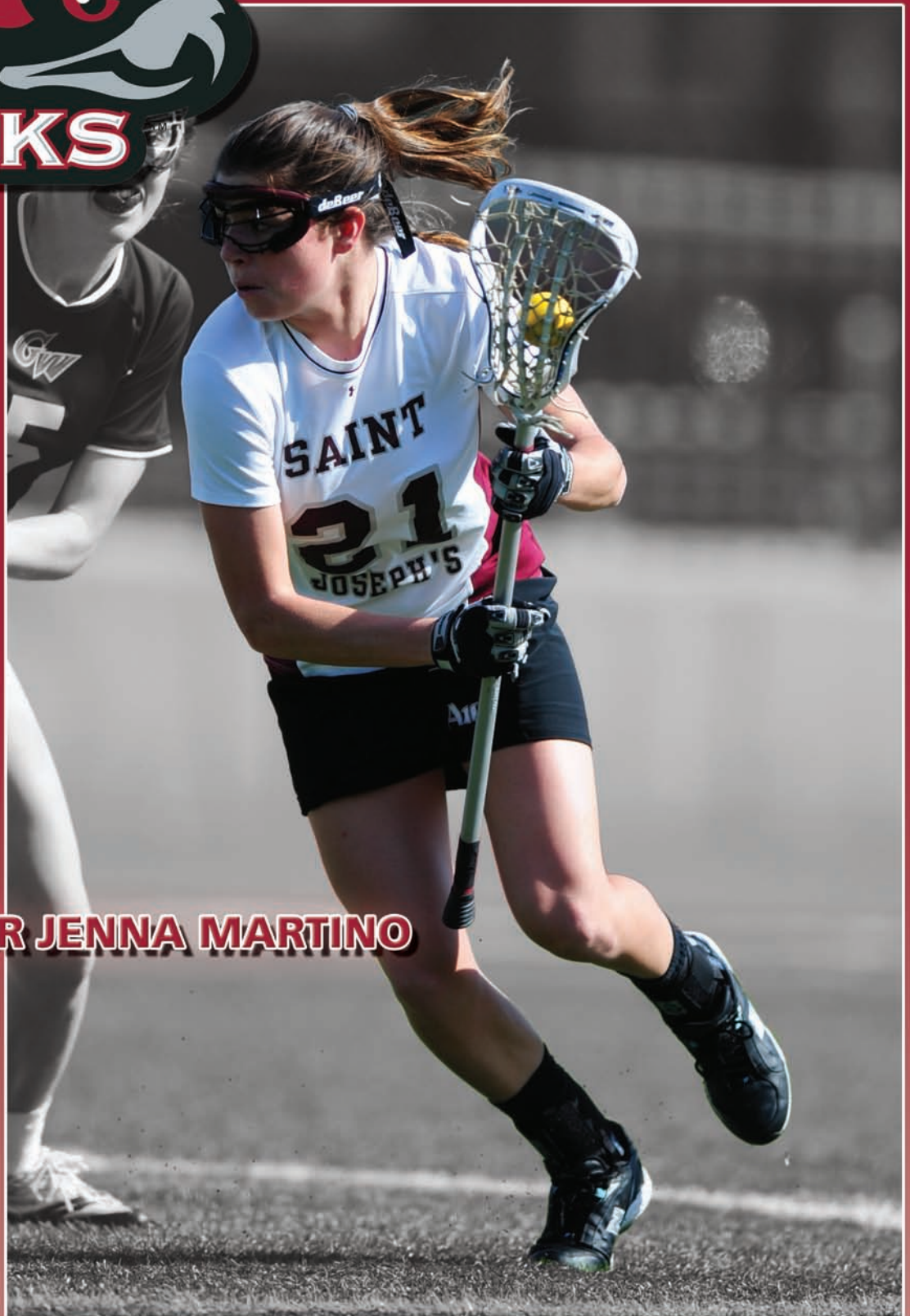

SEASON OUTLOOK

The Saint Joseph's women's lacrosse team looks to return to the Atlantic 10 Championship in 2010, and with a wealth of experience and a strong recruiting class, the Hawks have the potential to achieve their goal of their first Atlantic 10 title.

Although the Hawks lost some potent offense and a few key defenders, 2009 A-10 Coach of the Year, **Denise Roessler**, enters her 12th year optimistic about the 2010 season.

The Hawks return leading scorer **Jenna Martino** who accounted for nearly 40 percent of the 2009 offense and two defensive captains, senior **Rae Wojnar** and junior **Christine Readinger**.

Martino, a 2009 All-Tournament Team Selection and two-time Atlantic 10 First Team Selection, looks to beat last season's totals, in which she broke the single-season record in goals (57) to place her second on the charts for all-time career goals (133). Martino also had a team-best 19 assists and looks to be a serious contender for 2010 A-10 Player of the Year.



Jenna Martino returns as SJU's leading scorer for the third straight year and was named to the 2009 All-Tournament Team and All-Conference First Team.

Her offense is backed by a trio of relentless sophomores, **Meghan McDevitt**, **Jen Peters**, and **Julie Mineweaser**, which along with Martino, accounted for 85 percent of the scoring in 2009.

At attack McDevitt, an A-10 All-Rookie Team selection, was third on the team in goals (32) and tallied six assists while Peters scored 23 goals and had nine assists.

Mineweaser, another A-10 All-Rookie Team selection, will lead the midfield as she dished 10 assists while adding 16 goals to the SJU offense last season.

Sophomore midfielders **Grace Dinn** (9 goals, 3 assists) and **Alli MacDonald** (2 goals, 3 assists) look to be big contributors on the offensive end this season, while junior **Francesca Volpe** and sophomore **Elizabeth Fox** will shore up the midfield line.

Wojnar and Readinger, a 2008 A-10 All-Rookie Selection, will be the foundation of the defense bringing leadership and experience to the back line. The duo are SJU's most aggressive defenders who combined to cause 46 turnovers last season at 23 apiece and picked up a combined 59 ground balls.

Sophomore **Kelley Pendergast** along with freshmen **Heather Olson** and **Jess Phelan** will add depth to the defense while **Alisha Aquilino**, Honorable Mention All-American, will take over goalkeeping duties for the Hawks in net. Senior captain and goalkeeper **Kaitlin LaBarbera** suffered an injury prior to the season but looks to make a strong recovery and see time in the cage.

SJU newcomer's freshmen **Leana Brewer**, **Taylor Mallory**, **Alexa Matthews**, and **Nora McGuire** are expected to make an impact in the Hawks' attack, while freshman **Gwen Nihill** and sophomore **Meghan Mitchell** will conjure up the midfield. Nihill was named an All-American as a high school senior while Brewer earned Honorable Mention All-American and a spot on the Academic All-America team.

The Hawks open the 2010 season as they travel to Lafayette on February 20. After facing city rival, Drexel, SJU takes on Wagner in its home opener on February 27.

March opens the door to tough non-conference contenders such as Lehigh and Monmouth (NEC semifinalist), and the Hawks go up against 2009 NCAA semifinalist Penn and Old Dominion (CAA semifinalist) right before conference play.

SJU opens Atlantic 10 play on March 26 at home against Duquesne before taking on 2009 Atlantic 10 tournament opponents, Richmond and Massachusetts. The squad wraps up conference play at Temple.

Although young, the Hawks are athletic and with their leading scorer returning, a strong defense, and valuable A-10 tournament experience last season, Saint Joseph's has the potential to get back to the A-10 finals and have a shot at winning their first conference championship.

HEAD COACH



Denise Roessler
Head Coach – 12th Year
Old Dominion '95

Denise Roessler returns for her 12th year as head coach of the Saint Joseph's women's lacrosse team. In 11 years, Roessler has compiled a 64-103 record highlighted by two Atlantic 10 Tournament appearances and her first A-10 Coach of the Year award in 2009.

Last season Roessler led the Hawks to the school's most successful season with their first appearance in a championship final, marking the school's second A-10 Tournament berth after their first appearance in 2001. She led the Hawks to a program-best 5-2 record in the A-10, tying for second place and posting an overall record of 10-8.

A 1995 graduate of Old Dominion, where she earned a bachelor's of science degree in sports medicine, Roessler previously served as the head women's lacrosse coach at La Salle University. She led the Explorers to a 5-9 overall record in their inaugural season of varsity competition in 1998.

Roessler came to SJU in the fall of 1998 and spent three years as an assistant field hockey coach at Saint Joseph's in addition to her lacrosse head coaching duties.

Prior to taking over at La Salle, Roessler served as the head junior varsity and assistant varsity field hockey coach at Bishop Eustace Prep. In 1995, she led Eustace to a 10-0-2 record.

In the spring of 1996, she joined the staff at her alma mater, Camden Catholic ('91), as a volunteer assistant lacrosse coach.

At Old Dominion, Roessler played women's lacrosse under Sue Stahl, who also served as the United States National Team head women's lacrosse coach from 1989-2005.

A native of Pennsauken, N.J., Roessler was a First Team All-Conference and All-Parochial selection in lacrosse as a senior at Camden Catholic.

Roessler currently resides in Marlton, N.J. with her husband Scott and their daughter, Jordan.

Melissa Cosgriff (nee Hieber), a 2002 graduate of Saint Joseph's, returns for her seventh season as a member of the women's lacrosse staff.

A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks after earning a spot as a walk-on, Cosgriff earned a starting position her freshman year. A mainstay at midfield during her four years, Hieber was named captain as a senior. As a sophomore in 2000, she was named both the team's Defensive Player of the Year and MVP. As a senior, Cosgriff suffered a career-ending injury. Due to her continued support and leadership off the field, she was honored by her teammates and coaches with the Loyalty Award.

Holding a bachelor's degree in marketing, Cosgriff earned a master's degree in education from Saint Joseph's in 2004. A 1998 graduate of Camden Catholic High School, she is currently working towards her master's in educational leadership to obtain her Principal's Certification. Cosgriff currently resides in Exton, Pa., with her husband, Rich, and teaches fifth grade in Lower Merion, Pa.

Jill DePetrus is in her third year on the Hawk staff as an assistant coach. She played lacrosse at Syracuse University, earning Second Team All-Big East honors her sophomore and senior years. She ranked second in the Big East and 18th nationally in assists in 2007.

DePetrus attended Archbishop Carroll High School, leading them to three straight Philadelphia Catholic League lacrosse championships. She was a first team All-American her senior year and was named the school's Female Athlete of the Year.

DePetrus currently resides in Philadelphia.



Lindsey-Kate McCool
Graduate Assistant – 2nd Year
Saint Joseph's '08

Lindsey-Kate McCool is a 2008 graduate of SJU and returns to the Hawk staff for her second season in 2010.

McCool graduated from Saint Joseph's as the all-time leader in ground balls (151), tied

for the all-time lead in games played (63), second in career assists (65) and fifth in all-time points (140).

Additionally, McCool led the team in assists all four years on Hawk Hill and was vital to the offense from the midfield position. She also provided excellent defense, causing 56 turnovers, which ranks third all-time in the program's history.

McCool is working towards her graduate degree in criminal justice and resides in Marlton, N.J.

THE HAWK



One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk has been flapping its wings for 54 years.

The Hawk, which celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06, is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its over 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook*, *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was nominated for the Mascot Hall of Fame in 2008.

FINNESEY FIELD



Finnesey Field, currently in its 81st year, has been home to 10 different varsity squads at Saint Joseph's. Opened in 1929 as home to the SJU football squad, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years and has been home to over a thousand SJU varsity games, matches and track meets.

The most recent upgrade happened in 2008 when the AstroTurf, laid down in 2001, was replaced with new, state-of-the-art TigerTurf.

Home to the men's and women's lacrosse teams, men's and women's soccer teams, the field has seen other modifications since its inception in 1929. The prospect of a 70,000-seat bowl stadium for football was dashed when the sport was discontinued following the 1939 season.

Baseball re-occupied the space in 1947, calling Finnesey home until 1959. Saint Joseph's men's soccer began in 1958 and played every season but one (1960) at Finnesey. In 1960, the original grandstand as well as the hillside seating near Overbrook Avenue were eliminated as Villiger (now Post) Hall and the Bluett Theatre were built. In the process of the 1960 construction, the field's elevation was raised five feet to its current location.

In 1990, artificial turf replaced the grass, making Finnesey a true multi-purpose facility. In 1994 the installation of lights furthered the use of the grounds, while new bleachers in 2003 on the hill next to Mandeville Hall were another touch of renovation to a historic stadium.



The women's lacrosse squad is 55-74 in 17 seasons on Hawk Hill. The best season came in 2004 when the Hawks went 5-2 en route to an 8-6 campaign. The first game was played on March 23, 1993 when SJU defeated Gwynedd Mercy, 18-4.

The men's lacrosse team has compiled an overall 52-66 mark in 17 seasons.

The location has also been home to men's soccer since 1958 and women's soccer since 1996 and the field hockey team wrapped up its last season on Finnesey in 2007.

Overall, the site has seen 1,116 games entering 2010, and SJU teams put together a total record of 514-556-46 in 80 years.

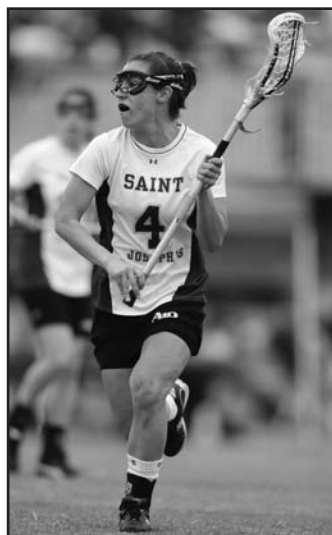

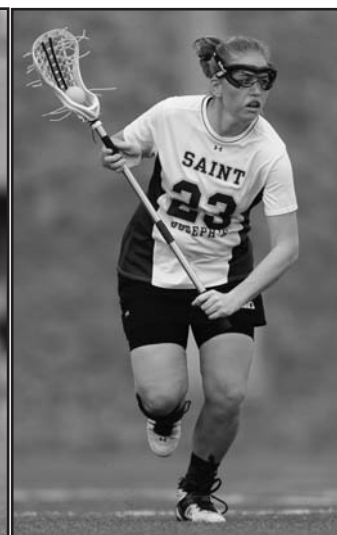

2009 REVIEW

The women's lacrosse team had one of Saint Joseph's most successful athletic campaigns during 2009. Aside from making team history through their collaborative successes, the program sported several of the Atlantic 10's top individual performers.

Throughout the season, junior Jenna Martino was an offensive force, netting a program record 57 goals and 78 points. She was helped in part by fellow senior leaders Abby Renninger and Jessica Westlake, the latter of which broke the SJU record for games played in a career.

After dropping their season opener at Lehigh, the Hawks went on a three-game winning streak that included a 14-2 drubbing of Lafayette. They were led by hat tricks from Julie Mineweaser and Meghan McDevitt and showed their team strength by drawing scores from eight different players when all was said and done.

SJU then went on to lose three in a row, but the streak was misleading; two of the losses were low-scoring matches lost by only a single goal. Senior goalkeeper Suzy Herlihy remained stellar in net, and when the annual rivalry game with Villanova came, the Hawks began to turn their season around. Senior Helene Tursi continued her breakout year with a career-high seven goals while Martino netted four and led the Hawks to their second consecutive blowout victory over the Wildcats, 18-4.

Even though the conclusion of the season would see losses to conference rivals Richmond and Massachusetts, the Hawks ultimately won four of their last five en route to clinching an Atlantic 10 Tournament spot. Highlighting this streak was a sentimental Senior Day victory at home over George Washington and a 16-6 victory over La Salle that featured Martino and Rookie

of the Week performers McDevitt and Jen Peters netting four goals each.

Heading into the Atlantic 10 Championship, the Hawks held the third seed out of four teams after finishing their strong regular season at 10-8. Throughout the first half of their semifinal with Richmond, the Hawks fought hard, but trailed by five with just over 11 minutes remaining in the game. However, a flurry of goals by the Hawks in the final minutes miraculously tied the game at 10-10. The play of the year may have come with just seven seconds remaining in regulation, when veteran Renninger intercepted a Richmond pass and whipped it down to Peters, who scored with the clock showing all zeroes. The historic goal counted and the Hawks clinched a berth in their first Atlantic 10 championship game in program history.

Underdogs from the get-go, the Hawks never showed any nerves against top-seeded Massachusetts, leaping out to a substantial lead in the first period. The Minutewomen ultimately reeled the Hawks in during the concluding minutes, sending the game to overtime, where UMass scored to win a 15-14 thriller.

Despite the loss, the season could not be called anything less than a wild success and a major achievement for SJU athletics. The A-10 All-Tournament team of 12 contained six SJU athletes: Renninger, Martino, Westlake, Herlihy, Tursi and Meghan Cullinan. Though the squad graduated significant talent and leadership, look for the Hawk women's lacrosse squad to remain near the top of the ranks of regional lacrosse for years to come.

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE



On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The 14 member institutions of the A-10 are united and strengthened by their diversity. Each is extraordinary in its educational mission, whether of a Catholic faith, a private university or a land grant institution. The varied pursuits of each member prove that there are many threads that weave the fabric for a great conference.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions, in conjunction with Atlantic 10 Commissioner Bernadette V. McGlade, have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation a successful one. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized 1,162 student-athletes in the Fall 2008 while 1,164 were named to the Spring 2009 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes. In 2000-09, 182 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition, while Charlotte's Lamarra Currie, Christa Dominick of La Salle, St. Bonaventure's Katelyn Murray and David Zenk of George

Washington received postgraduate scholarship grants.

The Atlantic 10 Conference had 50 teams among the 767 Division I sports teams honored by the NCAA with public recognition awards for their latest multi-year Academic Progress Rate scores. These teams posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. This represents an increase of 16 teams from a year ago and ranked the league fifth among 31 Division I Conferences. In 19 of the 21 sports sponsored by the Atlantic 10, the league's APR was at or above the conference average nationally according to the most recent data released by the NCAA. Moreover, 75 A-10 teams attained a perfect score in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate Report.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 74 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

From the North: N.J. Turnpike to Exit 6 (Pa. Turnpike connector). Follow Pa. Turnpike to Exit 326 (Rte. 476). Follow 476 South to Rte. 76 East, towards Philadelphia. Follow Rte. 76 East to exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.

From the East: Take either the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rte. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge; Follow Rte. 76 West to Exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.

From the South: I-95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to Exit 5 (Rte. 1). Follow Rte. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles.

From the West: Pa. Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rte. 76 East, towards Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rte. 76 West towards Valley Forge. Follow Rte. 76 West to Exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.



THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who strive to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment comprises approximately 4,550 students. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400 students.

Saint Joseph's nationally-recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students to literally enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers.
