# ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 13-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 – The University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, George Mason University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University and Virginia Commonwealth University. The league will add one more to its ranks in 2014 when Davidson College becomes the 14th institution to join the A-10.

In 2012-13, the Atlantic 10 continued to be proactive in navigating sweeping conference realignment, adding George Mason University for 2013 and Davidson College in 2014. The additions follow a very successful first year by Virginia Commonwealth University, which began full membership on July 1, 2012. The league continues to draw national praise for its decisions during conference realignment in selecting institutions driven by academics and basketball. The league was deemed the "winner" of conference realignment in 2011-12. The three additions were part of a five-year Strategic Initiative Plan that was adopted during the 2010-11 academic year.

The 13 member institutions of the A-10 are united and strengthened by their diversity. Each is extraordinary in its educational mission, whether of a Catholic faith, a private university or a land grant institution. The varied pursuits of each member prove that there are many threads that weave the fabric for a great conference.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of over 82 million people within its geographic footprint of seven states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this year: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions, in conjunction with Atlantic 10 Commissioner Bernadette V. McGlade, have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation a successful one. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its studentathletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized a record 3,255 student-athletes in 2012-13.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors two student-athletes as the A-10 Student-Athletes of the Year. Moreover, the

Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes. In 2012-13, nearly 200 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition.

The Atlantic 10 Conference once again earned high marks in the latest Academic Progress Rates (APR). This includes ranking fifth among all 32 Division I Conferences with a 984 average, 10 points above the national average.

The Atlantic 10 boasted a second-place ranking in the single-year Graduation Success Rate (GSR) among all Division I leagues that was released in the Fall of 2012. Measured in a six-year window, 90 percent of freshman enrolling in an A-10 institution in 2005 graduated. Twelve of the league's institutions were above the national four-year GSR average of 80 percent and four of those programs, Dayton, George Washington, Richmond and Saint Joseph's, were all over 90 percent. The Atlantic 10 also rates in the Top 10 in men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball in the single-year GSR. The league is ninth nationally in men's basketball, graduating at a 74 percent rate, nearly 7 percent above the national average. In women's basketball the league ranks sixth with an incredible 96 percent graduation rate for its 2004 freshman class, 10 percent higher than the national average.

Matt Martucci is in his fifth season as the Hawks' radio play-by-play announcer. He has been with the Saint Joseph's Sports Network since 2006 and has also served as the announcer for women's basketball and

baseball broadcasts over the internet.

Martucci has worked as the producer for both Phil Martelli's HawkTalk television and radio shows and currently serves as on-air talent for audio and video features on Hawks' All-Access.

He has been with 97.5 The Fanatic since March 2011 as one of two local morning update anchors during ESPN's "Mike and Mike in the Morning" as well as a fill-in update anchor for the highly-rated "Mike Missanelli Show". In April of this year, he began hosting a Sunday morning show "Gallen and Martucci" with friend and colleague Pat Gallen.

A 2006 graduate of Syracuse University's Newhouse School of Communications, he recently joined The Comcast Network as one of two high school football TV play-by-play announcers and joined SiriusXM Satellite Radio as a national update anchor last year.

Martucci has also served as a sideline reporter for Northeast Conference Football on ESPN3 as well as The Ripken Baseball Youth World Series on CBS Sports Network.

Martucci, who received the William J. Bennett Award for dedication and loyalty to the SJU men's basketball program in 2011, began his broadcasting career with WAER at Syracuse University, and has also worked with ESPN Radio 1450 in Atlantic City.

A 1982 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Lunardi returned to his alma mater in 1987 as director of media relations. He has also served as director of external relations, director of university communications, and assistant vice president for university communications.

Away from the University, Lunardi is the nationally-known "Bracketologist" for ESPN, ESPN Radio, and ESPN.com. His ESPN.com bracketology site generates over 10 million hits per season. He correctly forecast all 68 NCAA Tournament teams last season.

In 2001, *The Sporting News* called it the "nation's best coach's show."

#### Why S-a-i-n-t Joseph's University?

The corporate title "S-a-i-n-t" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the public title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts.

The vast majority of academic and government publications have referred to Saint Joseph's University since at least 1986, as have most campus references with the exception of athletics. However, university-wide "image campaign" revealed the need to clarify this policy both internally and externally.

According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them – Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia – is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of Saint Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

Style information for print, electronic and digital media is available. It includes accepted abbreviations of the corporate name (e.g., "SJU" or "St. Joe's" in headlines or certain informal references) as well as prohibited usages (e.g., partial abbreviations such as "St. Joseph's" or "Saint Joe's").

#### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

#### PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers attending Saint Joseph's home basketball games must be credentialed. Requests for credentials should be made in at least 24 hours in advance to Marie Wozniak. Due to space demands, access to freelance photographers is limited.

#### SCOUT CREDENTIALS

Credentials for NBA scouts must be requested in advance of the game by contacting Marie Wozniak.

#### RADIO POLICY

Radio stations designated as the primary visiting outlet can have access to phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line per game. (\$200 for ISDN), unless a reciprocal usage agreement exists. #### INTFRVIFW
