SEASON PREVIEW

The Saint Joseph's men's rowing team has high expectations for 2009-10 as it returns a seasoned crew which will strive to regain the Hawks' status and uphold the strong tradition of SJU rowing.

The Hawks prepared for the season with an extremely rigorous winter workouts. "All of our varsity rowers came back earlier than required in January just so they could get a jump on winter training," said seventh-year head coach Drew Hill. "It was perhaps the most physically-rewarding preseason training workouts that I've seen in my years here at Saint Joseph's."

SJU's strength this season should lie in both the Varsity 8 and Varsity Lightweight 8.

The Varsity 8 returns six rowers from last year's boat, which took second at the Knecht Cup and the Jesuit Invitational, and seventh at the SIRA Regatta. Four-year V8 rower Glenn Griffin leads the way and is joined by senior co-captain Ryan Huck and classmates Max Schipper and Sarah Jost (cox). Juniors Dan Gallagher and Tim Strybuc, who was the team's MVP in 2008, will round out the lineup with sophomores Tyler Huck and Tom Kresz.

The Lightweight 8 enjoyed a great deal of success in 2008-09 and captured a team-best bronze medal at the Dad Vail Regatta. That boat also took first at the Murphy Cup, Knecht Cup and Bergen Cup. High hopes have been placed on the Lightweight 8 for this season as it will race in the EARC for the first time and will face an extremely challenging schedule. "They will be racing the toughest schedule ever for an SJU boat. As newcomers to that level of racing, they will take their licks, but will be very competitive regardless, and should be among the top two at Dad Vails," said Hill. That boat, which returns seven rowers from last season, will be led by senior co-captain Conor Malone. He will be joined by junior Chase Powell, sophomores Devon Teichman (cox), Brendan

Hanna, Sean Stewart, Liam Leyden, Justin Gentile, Chuck Hummel and Matt Benedetto.

The Second Varsity 8 also expects to be competitive at the top races. Seniors Mark Fanelli and Dave Lemon will be joined on the crew by juniors Paul Leggieri (cox), Steve Olenik, Rich Appell, Steve Dutcher, Mike Gibel, Luke Dentino and sophomore John Alburger.

The Hawks will also field boats in the Freshman 8 and Freshman Lightweight 8. Newcomers Alex Pugh and Justin Stephano should make an impact there but could also possibly compete for seats in the Varsity 8. Jamal Anderson and Pat Kenney will be other key rowers for the Freshman boats.

Saint Joseph's opens the year at the annual Jesuit Invitational on the Cooper River (March 20), but makes its season debut on its home course, the Schuylkill River, at the Murphy Cup (April 3). Other key races for SJU are the Knecht Cup (April 10-11) and the Bergen Cup (April 24). The Hawks will travel to the SIRA Regatta in Tennessee (April 17-18), with the prestigious Dad Vail Regatta being contested again on the Schuylkill River on May 7-8.

The Hawks' Lightweights slate will vary from the Heavyweight schedule and face teams such as Dartmouth, Harvard, Georgetown, Penn, Princeton and Cornell, among others.

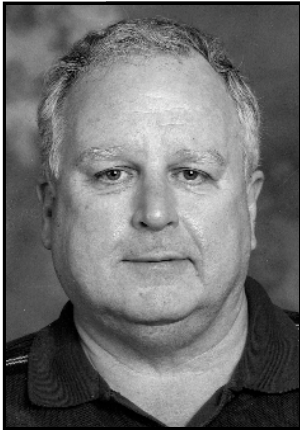
"Our primary goal this season is to reclaim the Dad Vail Men's Team Trophy that has eluded us for the past two years. We have the personnel and work ethic necessary, so it's just a matter of putting it all together," said Hill.

HEAD COACH



Drew Hill
Head Coach
Saint Joseph's '74 – Seventh Season

Drew Hill enters his seventh season as the head men's rowing coach at Saint Joseph's University. Since his return to his alma mater in 2002, Hill has rebuilt the program and led the team to remarkable success in the Dad Vail Regatta. He has guided his team to three first-place finishes (2003, 2005, 2006) and a second-place (2004) finish in the overall team competition for the Dad Vail Regatta Men's Point Trophy. Hill's successes, combined with those of the SJU women's rowing squad, saw the Hawks combine capture the Bratton Trophy, given to the overall points champion, in 2005 and 2006.

Under Hill, the SJU men have picked up seven gold, four silver, and seven bronze medals at Dad Vails. Hill has also led SJU back into national contention by qualifying 10 boats for the IRA National Championship Regatta in six of his first seven seasons, with the Varsity Four making the IRA Grand Final and placing fourth in the country in 2004 and returning in 2005 to finish sixth. In 2006, the Hawks qualified five crews for the IRA Regatta, while qualifying two more in 2007.

Hill joined the collegiate coaching ranks in the spring of 2002 working as an assistant coach for SJU after spending four years at his high school alma mater, St. Joseph's Prep. He served as The Prep's novice coach in 1998 and 1999 and as an assistant varsity coach from 1999-2001. Working mostly with the program's Second Varsity Eight and Varsity Four boats, his

crews went on to capture three SRA National titles and three Stotesbury championships, as well as five city and Catholic League titles.

A 1974 SJU grad, Hill was a four-year rower for the Crimson and Gray and a member of the school's talented crews of the early 1970s. He earned his MBA from the University of Notre Dame in 1976 and had successful careers in the automobile industry as founder of Devon Hill BMW & Volkswagen and in real estate development before turning his attention to coaching.

Hill and his wife Loretta, are 1974 and 1975 graduates, respectively, from Saint Joseph's and reside in Devon, Pa. They have seven children and two grandchildren.

Over the last 10 years, Kieffer has coached sculling and sweep on Boathouse Row at all levels - high school, club, and national team. His crews have won numerous major regattas and national championships.

John Fife

John Fife is in his second season with the Hawks and serves as the Lightweight Coach.

Fife, a 2002 University of Pennsylvania graduate, has been coaching rowing for the past nine years. Four of those years were spent between Penn and Georgetown, where he worked with the lightweight programs.

At Penn, Fife was the Freshman Lightweight Coach and his team enjoyed success at both the IRA and Eastern Sprints Championship Regattas. He then became the head lightweight coach at Georgetown where his crew finished seventh at the IRA Championship Regatta, as well as an impressive fifth-place finish at the Head of the Charles Regatta.

From 2001-05, Fife also served as the Head Junior Coach for Penn Athletic Club, where his junior mens' crews won three Canadian Henley Championships and several U.S. National Championships.

From 2006-2008, Fife served as the Assistant Head Coach at St. Joseph's Prep where his crews won the 2007 Head of the Charles and then achieved a total sweep of the boys' eights at the 2008 Stotesbury Cup Regatta, for just the second time ever.

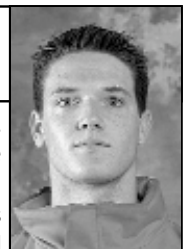
Dan Goettner

Saint Joseph's '02 – Third Season

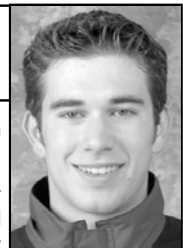


Ryan Bonner, a 2002 Saint Joseph's graduate, is in his third season on the Hawks' staff. He assists with the freshman crews.

Alex DiBiasi is in his third year assisting with the SJU men's rowing program.

A 2007 graduate of SJU, DiBiasi was a three-time member of the Varsity Heavyweight 8 and served as the team captain during the 2006-07 season. In 2005 and 2006, DiBiasi was a part of the SJU team that won the Dr. Thomas Kerr Trophy and in 2007 he received the team's Vasquez and Leahy Awards.

During his freshman year, DiBiasi was part of the 2004 Freshman 8 that won the Murphy Cup and the Jesuit, George Washington and Indianapolis Invitational Regattas.

DiBiasi rowed for Monsignor Bonner High School, where he was team captain his senior season.



GILLIN BOATHOUSE

The Robert M. Gillin, Jr. Boathouse was dedicated in June 2002 as the home of the Saint Joseph's University Women's and Men's Rowing teams.

The 15,540 square foot state-of-the-art boathouse includes four heated boat bays with capacity for 42 eights, 14 fours/quads, and 14 small boats.

The Boathouse sits on 20,381 square feet of land at the 1,000-meter mark of the famed Schuylkill River race course. The Boathouse serves as SJU's home base for all of its home regattas, including the Dad Vail Regatta, Murphy Cup, and various dual races. The 750-square foot deck is a perfect viewing area for families, fans, and alumni.

The second floor of the boathouse includes locker rooms, showers, etc as well as a large common area for ergs, team meetings, video review and yoga.

The Gillin Boat Club joined the Schuylkill Navy on September 20, 2004, by unanimous vote of the delegates of the Schuylkill Navy's 10 member clubs.

In addition to serving as the home of Hawk rowing, the Gillin Boathouse also hosts several summer camps including the Saint Joseph's University/Fairmount Park Commission's Community Rowing Program.

Fairmount Park Community Rowing Program

In addition to serving as the home of Hawk rowing, the Gillin Boathouse also hosts the Fairmount Park Commission's Community Rowing Program. The first step in a long-term partnership between the University and the Fairmount Park Commission, the program is designed to provide an experience for youth in the city of Philadelphia who have not had the opportunity to experience the sport of rowing.



DIRECTIONS TO GILLIN BOATHOUSE (2200 Kelly Drive, Philadelphia)

From the East: Follow I-76 West to Exit 340 (Lincoln Drive/Kelly Drive) on the right. Take Exit 340 and get into the left lane, following signs for Kelly Drive. Move to right lane and merge right at the bottom of the Exit ramp. Take Kelly Drive past four traffic lights. Turn right into the first parking lot on the right. The boathouse is located at the end of the parking lot.

From the Northeast or South: Follow I-95 to I-76 West to Exit 340 (Lincoln Drive/Kelly Drive) on the right. Take Exit 340 and get into the left lane, following signs for Kelly Drive. Move to right lane and merge right at the bottom of the Exit ramp. Take Kelly Drive past four traffic lights. Turn right into the first parking lot on the right. The boathouse is located at the end of the parking lot.

From the West: Follow I-76 East to Exit 340 (Lincoln Drive/Kelly Drive) on the left. Take Exit 340 and get into the left lane, following signs for Kelly Drive. Move to right lane and merge right at the bottom of the Exit ramp. Take Kelly Drive past four traffic lights. Turn right into the first parking lot on the right. The boathouse is located at the end of the parking lot.

THE HAWK



One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk has been flapping its wings for 54 years.

The Hawk, which celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06, is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die!"

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our

football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its over 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook*, *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was nominated for the Mascot Hall of Fame in 2008.

2008-09 REVIEW



The Saint Joseph's men's rowing team fielded a very young squad which made great strides during the course of the 2008-09 season.

The Hawks' lightweight boats had a solid season to set the stage for a promising future, and possibly a return to the success of the lightweights that was synonymous with Saint Joseph's in the 1990s. The Lightweight 8 capped off the year by earning a team-best bronze medal at the Dad Vail Regatta, with a boat comprised of Paul Leggieri, Brandon Hanna, Justin Gentile, Chase Powell, Conor Malone, Matt Benedetto, Kevin Burrows, Jordan Marwin and Sean Stewart. That crew also garnered first-place finishes at both the Murphy Cup and Knecht Cup, as well as a third-place effort at the SIRA Championships.

SJU's Lightweight 4 also turned in a strong effort at Dad Vails, reaching the Grand Final, where it finished sixth, with a crew comprised of Sarah Jost, Michael Gibel, Dave Lemon, Tom McElwee and Steve Dutcher. The Varsity 8 and Second Varsity 8 boats did not advance to the finals, with the Second V8 just missing by a fraction of a second.

The heavyweight boats (Varsity 8, Second Varsity 8) showed some good speed in the early season, but could never capitalize. The Hawks' Varsity 8 still earned a second-place finish at the Knecht Cup with a relatively young crew comprised of Ryan Pawling, Glenn Griffin, Ryan Huck, Max Schipper, Tyler Huck, Dan Gallagher, Tom Kresz, Jack Drewniak and Sean King. SJU's Second Varsity 8 took second at the Jesuit Invitational and fourth at the Bergen Cup.

The Hawks excelled in the classroom as the team posted a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and 17 rowers made the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Senior Kevin Burrows earned a spot on the *Philadelphia Inquirer* Academic All-Area Team for the second consecutive year, while freshman Matt Benedetto posted a 4.0 grade-point average.

Saint Joseph's graduated four oarsmen - Burrows, Drewniak, King and Marwin - so the Hawks' future is very bright as they will return seven athletes from the Varsity 8 and seven from the Varsity Lightweight 8 in 2009-10.

Schuylkill River (Philadelphia, Pa.); & Cooper River (Pennsauken, N.J.)



Although not the oldest sport at Saint Joseph's University, the Hawk rowing program has established itself as arguably one of the most successful in the school's long and storied athletics history. Making its mark on Philadelphia's famed Schuylkill River since 1954, SJU rowing celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2003-04.

First emerging as a club sport in 1954, rowing received official varsity status in 1959 and immediate respect when Al Rosenberg was named head coach. Rosenberg had helped the United States to a gold medal at the 1954 Pan Am Games and a silver at the 1958 European Championships. He guided the SJU program for just two seasons before taking over national team boats, but laid the groundwork for future success.

Legendary coach Joe Toland took over for Rosenberg and established SJU as one of the East's most successful programs from 1961-73. Toland helped SJU to six championships in Bergen Cup competition, as well as three President's Cup crowns. His varsity heavyweight eights advanced to the Dad Vail final in 12 of his 13 seasons. The V8 accomplished the greatest feat of the early era of Hawk rowing by winning the Dad Vail in 1970 and the team captured the Bratten Trophy as the overall points champion in 1971. Six of Toland's former Hawks would go on to represent the U.S. in international competition.

Toland relinquished the reins of the Hawk program to one of his former Hawk standouts, Jim Glavin. A member of SJU's 1970 Dad Vail champs, Glavin would go on to coach several junior national team boats. With the face of the University changing, the rowing program returned to club status following the 1975 season, but continued to produce strong crews throughout the 1970s and '80s.

Rowing returned as an official varsity sport in 1991 and the program quickly reclaimed its status among the nation's best. In 1999, the Hawk men penned, arguably the greatest feat in school history, matching the great 1971 Hawk squad by winning the Dad Vail Points title for the second time in school history and competing at the prestigious Henley Royal Regatta on the Thames River in London, England.

The University affirmed its commitment to rowing by breaking ground, along with St. Joseph's Prep, on a state-of-the-art boathouse along the Schuylkill River. Named in honor of Robert Gillin, Jr., construction was completed in time for the 2002 Dad Vail Regatta and provides a permanent home for the Hawk rowing programs.

Former SJU standout Drew Hill took over as head coach of the SJU program in 2003 and immediately made his presence felt. Sixteen Hawk boats advanced to the Dad Vail finals (15 claiming medals) in his first five seasons, and SJU matched the 1971 and 1999 squads by capturing the men's points title in 2003, 2005, and 2006.

Individually, 12 former Hawks have competed internationally and seven have been inducted into Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame, including Glavin, Toland, Richard and Donald Flanigan '60, Joe Henwood '68, Chris O'Brien '92 and Mike Teti '78.

Arguably the best-known oarsman in America, Michael Teti was a top Hawk rower, graduating from SJU with a sociology degree in 1978.

"Saint Joseph's gave me the opportunity to compete and also the opportunity for a great education," Teti says. "I owe SJU a great debt for all of the opportunities I received."

From 1977-93, Teti rowed on 11 national teams, including three trips to the Olympic Games. He won 24 national championships, a gold medal in the men's eight at the 1987 World Championships and a bronze medal in the same event at the 1988 Olympics. He was named the 1987 United States Rowing Male Athlete of the Year.

Teti achieved even greater notoriety as a coach, guiding the U.S. men's open eight squad to an unprecedented three straight world championships. He also coached the men's four with coxswain to world championship gold. In 1996 he led the lightweight men's four to an Olympic bronze medal before being named USRowing's Head Men's Sweep Coach, the highest coaching honor in the country, in October of that year.

SJU ROWING TRADITION

Teti became the U.S. Olympic coach following the 2000 Games, and led the men's eight boat to gold in Athens in 2004, a feat that the United States had not achieved since 1964 when another coach with Hawk ties, Al Rosenberg, led the Americans to victory. He also guided the U.S. Men to the bronze medal at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

Teti is currently the head coach of the men's crew team at the University of California and was inducted into the National Rowing Federation's Hall of Fame in 2010.

A more recent Hawk to make his mark on the international scene is junior Ryan Pawling. As a freshman, Pawling coxed the Adaptive Mixed Four squad to fifth place in the World Championships in Munich in 2007, which qualified the crew for the Beijing Olympics in 2008.

JESUIT INVITATIONAL

Saint Joseph's Rowing established the Jesuit Invitational in 1999 and it has become a major race in the collegiate rowing season, featuring solely Jesuit colleges. The Jesuit Invitational is held every year in March on the Cooper River in Pennsauken, N.J.

The Casey Ferrone Memorial Trophy is awarded to the Men's Varsity 8 champion, while the Robert Gillin, Jr., Memorial Trophy is awarded to the Women's Varsity 8 winner.

The Cannonball Trophy is given to the overall team champion. It is named in honor of Saint Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who had his leg shattered by a cannonball while defending Spain from an attack by France. The Cannonball Trophy serves as a reminder that all good things start with pain. The glory of winning is only possible by withstanding the mental and physical pain of the 2000m race course. The trophy is awarded to the school with the highest combined points in the day's races. It is a traveling trophy which the winner returns every year. The winning team receives a small cannonball that is theirs to keep as a reminder of their championship performance.

THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who seek to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,550. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

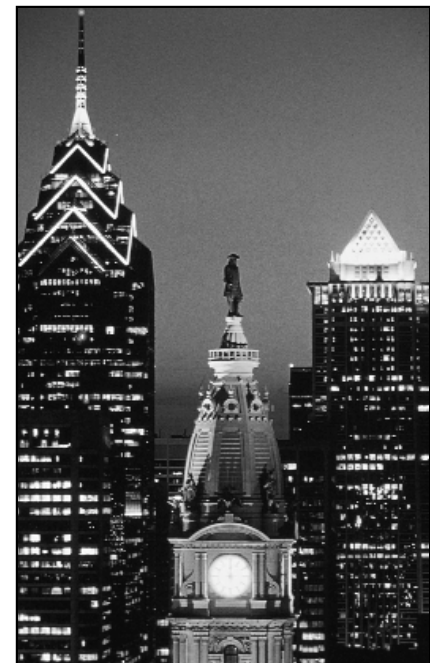

PHILADELPHIA


