SEASON OUTLOOK

Youth will be served again for the Saint Joseph's men's soccer team as head coach Tom Turner begins his 19th season at the helm of the program. Just seven upperclassmen return to a young lineup that will need to find a way to manufacture offense.

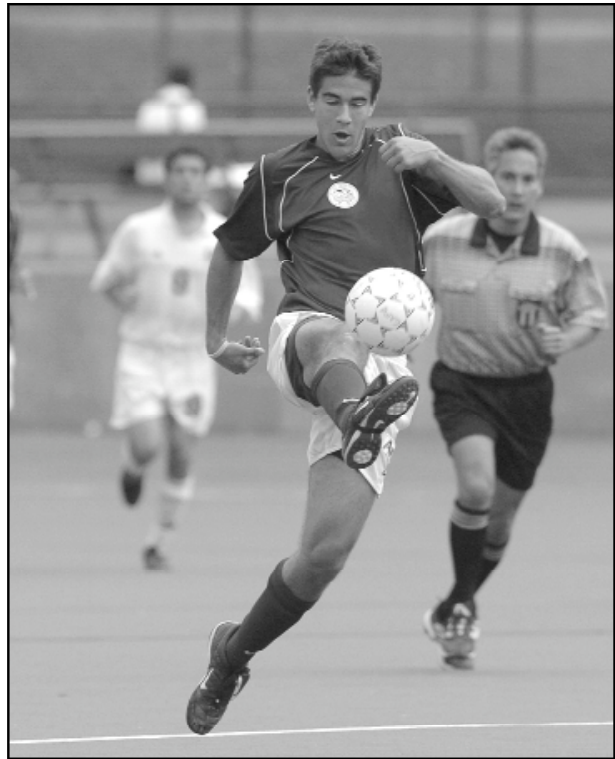
Defense should serve as a team strength as junior defender **Joe Grayauskie** and sophomores **Jim Slover** and **Alex Koufacos** return to the backline. A starter in every game of his career, Grayauskie is the team's most experienced returnee. Steady and reliable, he contributed a couple of assists as a freshman in 2003. Slover will anchor the defense from his spot at sweeper, while Koufacos made 13 starts as a freshman.

Redshirt sophomore **Trevor Lyman** should get the nod in goal, but will be challenged during the season by senior **Rob Lavorerio**. Lyman appeared in eight games as a freshman, making two starts and posting a stingy 1.04 goals against average.

Offensively, just one returning player, sophomore **John Creed**, tallied more than one goal. Creed, a Philadelphia Soccer Seven All-Star as a rookie, could miss significant time with a knee injury.

Sophomore **Patrick Duddy** will be looked up on to spark the offense. He made 13 starts and was the Hawk's top playmaker as a rookie. Several other Hawks including junior **Jim Brown** and sophomore **Cliff Jones** could also emerge.

Other veteran returnees who should hold down key positions are midfielders **Lateef Tural** and **Matt Worst**, as

well as senior forward **Pete Paradiso**.

Freshmen **Nick Pozzessere**, **Mike McInaw** and **Andrew Tursi** are among the newcomers most likely to contribute right away. Pozzessere was a two-time All-Conference and All-State pick at Hazleton High School in Central Pennsylvania. McInaw and Tursi were All-Suburban One League selections at Upper Dublin High School with Tursi capturing Conference Player of the Year honors as a senior.

The Hawks will be on the road for most of the season, and won't make their first appearance on Finnesey Field until October 22, when they host local rival Temple. The difficult schedule features four teams that were either nationally-ranked or qualified for the 2004 NCAA College Cup, including Wake Forest, Long Island, Binghamton and George Washington. The Atlantic 10 slate becomes even more formidable with Charlotte and national power Saint Louis joining the Conference.

With a youthful lineup and a challenging schedule the Saint Joseph's men's soccer team will be put to the test nearly every time out. Still with a core group of veterans and an up and coming group of newcomers hungry to make their mark the Hawks should prove capable of showing steady improvement in 2005.

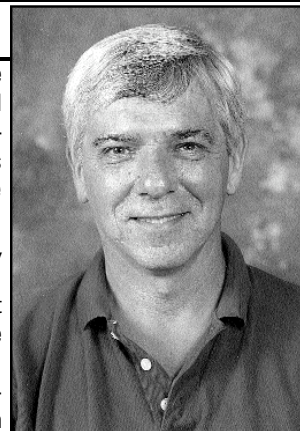
Tom Turner

Head Coach 19th Season

Now in his 19th year as the Saint Joseph's head men's soccer coach, Tom Turner has made great strides in making the Hawk program competitive in the Mid-Atlantic region. Turner reaped the benefits from his rebuilding plan installed back when he took over the helm of the Hawk soccer program in 1987, posting back-to-back double digit win seasons (1993-94). That success brought back memories of the Hawk teams during his playing days in the early 1970s, the last time SJU made an NCAA Tournament appearance.

Named the Atlantic 10 Conference and Philadelphia Soccer Seven Coach of the Year in 1993, Turner guided his charges to a school-record 12 wins and a first-ever Soccer Seven title and Atlantic 10 tournament appearance. He followed that with a 10-7-2 record in 1994, marking the first consecutive double digit win campaigns in the program's history. The Hawks also advanced to the A-10 Tournament, losing in overtime at Rutgers, a 1994 NCAA semifinalist, 4-2.

After a stretch of six seasons in which the team posted just 23 total wins, Turner has the program back on track with three solid seasons. In 2001, he guided SJU to a 10-7-2 mark, just the fifth 10-win campaign in the program's history and picked up his second Philadelphia Soccer Seven Coach of the Year award. The the 2002 and 2003 seasons each produced eight wins and Turner is just 10 wins shy of becoming the winningest coach in men's soccer history.

A former SJU defensive standout (1970-73) who played on the school's 1971 and 1972 NCAA teams, Turner took over the reins of the Hawk soccer program after a 10-year stint at La Salle College High School (1977-86). At La Salle, he compiled a record of 100-88-21. During that period, he also coached the Montgomery County All-Stars in Pennsylvania's Keystone Games scholastic competition while continuing his playing career in the Major Division of Philadelphia's United Soccer League.

The 53-year-old Turner resides in Churchville, PA with his wife, Michelle, and their two children, Brigid (22), a 2005 graduate of SJU, and Mary Catherine (16).

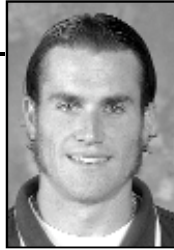


ASSISTANT COACHES

Ken Clark

Assistant Coach
Temple '97 - Eighth Year

Now in his eighth-year on the Saint Joseph's men's soccer coaching staff is Ken Clark. A native of Philadelphia, Clark is well known in the area soccer community after playing four years at Temple University ('97) and prepping at La Salle College High School ('93).



Clark capped a stellar career in goal for the Owls as a senior during the 1996 season. That year he led the Mid-Atlantic region in saves (155), setting a new single season school record, and minutes played (1,798). He also posted a stingy 1.60 goals against average and was twice named Philadelphia Soccer Seven Player of the Week and also the *Soccer America* National Goalkeeper of the Week (9/29/96). He missed just 13 minutes of play during the year, helping Temple to a 10-win campaign. The Owls were nationally-ranked twice during the year (#19 and #25).

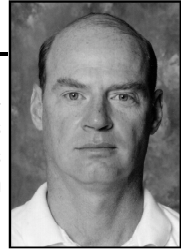
A scholar, as well as an athlete, Clark was recognized as a Third Team Academic All-American. The 31-year-old earned a bachelor's degree in marketing from Temple. He resides in Philadelphia with his wife, Bridget.



Hugh McInaw

Assistant Coach
Philadelphia '72 - Second Year

Among the most respected names in Philadelphia-area soccer for over 30 years, Hugh McInaw returns for his second stint as an assistant coach at Saint Joseph's University. He previously served on Tom Turner's staff at SJU during the 1994 season.



McInaw got his start in coaching as an assistant on Turner's staff at La Salle College High School from 1978-79. In 1980 he was named the head coach at Cardinal Dougherty High School. He compiled an 85-74-17 record in 14 seasons at Dougherty, leading the team to a pair of Catholic League crowns.

He spent the 1994 season as an assistant at Saint Joseph's before being appointed the head soccer coach at Temple University. He spent five seasons (1995-99) in North Philadelphia, capturing Philadelphia Soccer 7 Coach of the Year honors in 1997 after guiding the Owls to a 10-7-2 record and a City Series title.

A 1972 graduate of Philadelphia Textile, McInaw was the Rams leading scorer as a junior, helping the team become the nation's top-ranked soccer program for most of the year (1970). Prior to Textile, he was a prep standout at North Catholic High School leading the team to three straight League titles.

McInaw resides in Upper Dublin, Pa. with his wife Jean. He has two children, the youngest, Mike, is a freshman on the Hawk squad.

Jack Ruggero

Administrative Assistant
Saint Joseph's '69 - Seventh Year

Working behind the scenes for the seventh straight year as the administrative assistant of the men's soccer team is SJU Hall of Famer Jack Ruggero. One of only three men to coach the SJU men's soccer program in its 48-year varsity existence, Ruggero guided the Hawks to 53 wins over an 11-year stint from 1976 through 1986.



A standout defensive back, the 1969 SJU grad earned regional All-America honors as a junior and senior (1967-68). In November of 1999, he was the only men's soccer player and one of 20 inducted into the inaugural class of the Saint Joseph's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Ruggero previously served as an assistant coach under Jack Dunn before taking over the program in 1976. As an assistant, he helped guide the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances, and coached current SJU mentor Tom Turner during that time.

He resides with his wife, Joyce, in Philadelphia.

Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk men's soccer since its inception in 1958.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the men's soccer team, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, women's soccer and both men's and women's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

SJU's men's soccer team has compiled a record of 154-140-30 on the field since 1958. The team played its first Finnesey Field game on October 24, 1958, defeating Rutgers-South Jersey, 6-0.

In the first-ever night time event on the field, the Hawks topped Lehigh, 3-0, on October 19, 1994.

DIRECTIONS TO FINNESEY FIELD

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for almost half a century, and celebrates its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.



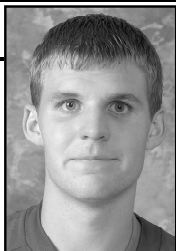

2004 YEAR IN REVIEW



After graduating 10 seniors from the 2003 squad that posted an 8-11-1 overall record and tied the school record for conference victories, Saint Joseph's men's soccer coach Tom Turner accepted that 2004 was going to be a rebuilding year for his team. With more than a dozen freshmen and sophomores playing regularly, the Hawks finished 3-13-1 and 2-7-1 in Atlantic 10 Conference play.

One of only two seniors, goalkeeper Chris DiStefano led the Hawk contingent. After seeing limited action in the net early in his career, DiStefano stepped up as the Hawks everyday goalkeeper in his final season. Playing behind a youthful defense, DiStefano finished the season with 91 saves, ranking 13th in the nation. He was tabbed to the 2004 Philadelphia University/Adam's Mark All-Tournament Team.

Two pleasant surprises came in the way of freshmen midfielders Craig Olsen and John Creed. Olsen saw action in only nine games, but made an impact when available. He tallied his first collegiate goal in a 1-1 tie with UMass. He was also named to the 2004 Philadelphia University/Adam's Mark All-Tournament Team. Creed's playing time increased as the season wore on and he received Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week honors and was named Soccer Seven Player of the Week after scoring game-winning goals in consecutive wins against Fordham and La Salle. He was tabbed to the Soccer Seven All-Star team.

Junior Scott Cunningham and red-shirt freshman Chris Powell also made a mark for the Hawks during the season, topping the team in scoring. Cunningham, who netted a couple of goals during the season, picked up All-Tournament honors at the Lafayette/Lehigh Classic. Powell, meanwhile made a full recovery from a knee injury and finished with a team-high three goals and seven points. Sophomore Joe Grayauskie was the lone Hawk to start every game.

The team began the season with two in-season tournaments and played well in the opening game of each, dropping tight 2-1 decisions to James Madison in the JMU/Ramada Inn Invitational and Monmouth in the Philadelphia University/Adams Mark Hotel Soccer Classic.

The team snapped its four-game skid with a 3-2 win over crosstown rival Philadelphia University. Powell tallied the winning goal in the second overtime.

The Hawks lost the next two games to Lafayette and Lehigh, but opened Atlantic 10 Conference play with a 1-1 tie against Massachusetts. The Hawks saw defeat in their next three A-10 games versus Rhode Island, Dayton and Xavier. However, Turner's young squad fired back with back-to-back 2-1 wins over Fordham and La Salle.

Unfortunately, their success was short-lived as St. Bonaventure, Richmond, Duquesne, and George Washington shutout the Hawks in their next four games. The season came to a close as the Hawks fell to Temple, 6-1, on Finnesey Field.

Despite suffering a number of tough setbacks, many of the Hawks' younger players saw a great deal of action on the field and gained valuable experience. Turner expects that the growth and maturity of this year's team will lead to a stronger, more confident club in 2005 and a run at the A-10 Tournament.

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE



On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10. The University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Temple University, and Xavier University have formed the foundation of the Atlantic 10 - a foundation which is further strengthened this season with the additions of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte and Saint Louis University.

In 2005-06, the Atlantic 10 Conference celebrates its 30th anniversary season.

Although anniversaries are a good time to reflect, this anniversary is a celebration of the future as much as the past.

"It is with pride that we look back at our accomplishments and see how far this league has truly come," says A-10 commissioner Linda Bruno, who begins her 12th season at the helm of the league - the longest tenure of any commissioner in the Conference's history. "More importantly, however, the additions of Charlotte and Saint Louis ensure that the future is brighter than it has ever been. We are adding two members who will greatly enhance the national profile of all our sports and expose our programs to two new markets in which our universities actively recruit. The A-10 has never been as strong as it is now."

The Atlantic 10 Conference, which spans eight states and the District of Columbia with a total population of almost 73 million people, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor

track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

George Washington won its first-ever men's basketball title and represented the Atlantic 10 in the NCAA Tournament. Saint Joseph's and Temple also earned postseason bids with the Hawks reaching the final of the National Invitation Tournament. In women's basketball, the A-10 sent four teams to the postseason as Temple earned the automatic bid by winning its second consecutive Atlantic 10 championship. The Owls were joined by George Washington and Richmond, marking the 11th time in the last 12 years that the A-10 has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Xavier also garnered a postseason berth and advanced to the third round of the WNIT.

Rhode Island won its first-ever A-10 baseball championship and earned its first NCAA berth; in field hockey, Richmond, which was ranked as high as 10th nationally, went unbeaten in Conference play for the second straight year in advancing to the NAACAs; Xavier took the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Men's Golf Tournament, where it was joined by Rhode Island; and Richmond won its first A-10 lacrosse title and the bid to the NAACAs.

The Massachusetts women's rowing team won its 10th straight A-10 title, setting a league record for the most consecutive tournament championships won by any team in any sport. UMass also won the ECAC title; George Washington advanced to the second round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament; Dayton lost in overtime in its NCAA women's soccer opener; Massachusetts won its 17th A-10 softball title to advance to the NAACAs; Richmond represented the A-10 in the NCAA men's and women's tennis tournaments; and Dayton won the Conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.

In all, 374 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 season.

JACK DUNN

Legendary Jack Dunn, the first-ever coach of the Saint Joseph's soccer team, has done more for the Hawk program than any one individual. The team's head coach from 1958 through 1975, Dunn compiled a career record of 120-57-23 (.658) in his 18 years at the helm, leading SJU to the NCAA Tournament in 1966, 1971 and 1972.

The 72-year-old Dunn played on the 1952 U.S. Olympic team and went on to a long playing career in the old German-American Professional League.

Dunn, who also served as an assistant coach with the Hawks in the mid-90s, was one of 20 inaugural inductees to the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.
