SEASON OUTLOOK



With the graduation of just one letterwinner from last season's team, which matched Saint Joseph's best Atlantic 10 Conference finish in a decade, head coach Al Laveson believes his team has the talent and ability to achieve even greater success in 2005-06.

Seniors **Nicole Morrison** and **Jess Swanderski** are projected to hold down the top two spots in the singles lineup and to team up at the top spot in doubles.

Morrison, who posted a 17-7 record during her first two Hawk seasons playing at lower positions, started every match at first singles as a junior. A model in the classroom, the Plantation, Fla. native received the team's scholar athlete award.

Like her classmate, Swanderski racked up an impressive 16-7 record as a freshman and sophomore. She slid up to the third singles position as a junior and was again solid, positing a 7-8 mark.

While the seniors will hold down key positions at the top of the lineup, the play of sophomore **Gina DiGiorgio**, along with juniors **Erika Guers** and **Alisa Van Meter** will most likely hold the key to the Hawks fortunes.

The athletic DiGiorgio burst onto the scene as a freshman and immediately forced her way into the lineup. Most likely to move into the number four slot, she split the year between fifth and sixth singles and rolled up a team

best 9-4 mark on the season. She was even better in doubles, teaming with junior **Marisa Donelson**. The tandem started the season 8-0 and finished with a 9-2 mark at third doubles and an 11-3 pairs mark for the year. After her strong showing in doubles, Donelson should be a contender for either the fifth or sixth singles spots.

The team's Most Valuable Player, Guers has been steady and reliable throughout her career. She posted an 8-7 mark in 2004 and is projected to creep up one spot to the number three position this season. Who she will team with in doubles is undecided. She paired with departed senior Michelle Savage to notch a 6-4 mark at second singles last year.

Van Meter, who played both fifth and sixth singles as a sophomore and made several spot starts in doubles, will likely hold down one of those slots again.

Several other returnees, including juniors **Reshma Moorthy** and **Rory Paolantonio**, along with sophomores **Theresa Hornung** and **Chelsea Molyneaux** will look to push for time in the rotation. Newcomers junior **Lauren Kuhmerker** and freshmen **Krysta Contino** and **Tristin Reppert** could also contribute.

With a veteran lineup back in the fold, including five of six starters, Al Laveson believes his team has the tools to improve upon its finish at the Atlantic 10 Championships.

Temple '53 - 25th Season

Hawk Hall of Famer Al Laveson, the dean of coaches at Saint Joseph's University, is the winningest coach in the history of the school. The 1953 Temple grad has compiled a 445-492 record in 41 seasons with the men's tennis team (283-321) and 24 seasons with the women (162-171). His coaching tenure at Saint Joseph's is the longest in school history.

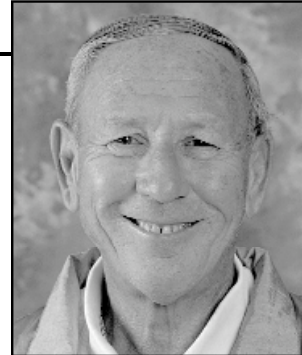
In 2004-05, Laveson helped the Hawks to match their best Atlantic 10 finish in six years, placing ninth. He has guided the women's tennis program to two 10-win seasons, the last coming in 2000-01, and began his career with the women with eight straight winning seasons.

Laveson, who was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001, was the first Hawk mentor to reach 400 career wins with a men's tennis victory over Towson in the fall of 2002. He became only the second Hawk coach to reach the 300-win plateau in 1994, joining the legendary Bill Ferguson, who guided the Hawk basketball team to 309 victories over 25 years. He became the winningest Hawk coach one year later.

Captain of the Temple tennis team as a collegiate player, Laveson has been a teaching professional for the United States Professional Tennis Association for the past 42 years. He is also a past vice president of the organization.

Laveson retired from his full-time teaching position at Central High School in Philadelphia just before the 1994 season. Prior to his arrival at Central in 1987, he taught for 33 years at Penn Treaty Junior High School. Besides coaching at SJU, Laveson coached the boys' tennis team at Father Judge High for two years in the early 60s. He won City Championships in badminton and tennis at Central, along with a gymnastics title while at Penn Treaty. Laveson also coached girls' field hockey at Central.

Laveson, who resides in Philadelphia, is the father of three sons, Bob, Dave, and Peter. The two eldest were both SJU tennis team captains under their father.

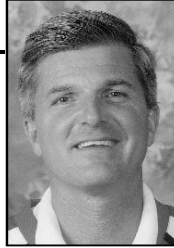
ASSISTANT COACHES



Gene Miller

Assistant Coach
Navy '79 - Sixth Year

Gene Miller is entering his sixth year as an assistant coach at Saint Joseph's University. Arriving on Hawk Hill after spending the 2000 fall season as an assistant coach at Rollins College, Miller brings a great store of tennis knowledge with him to SJU. While at Rollins, two of Miller's players won the NCAA Division II Doubles Championship.



Prior to his stint at Rollins, Miller served as an assistant coach at Southern Methodist University for two years. Responsible for all on-court conditioning and recruiting, Miller's squad received a national ranking as high as #5 in 1999, while reaching the Sweet 16 at the NCAA National Championships that same year.

Prior to SMU, Miller was the head men's coach at the University of Pennsylvania for seven years. At Penn, his accolades included seven Big 5 Championships, three Academic All-Americans and an Eastern Region ITA ranking of #3 in 1995 after guiding the Quakers to 21 victories.

A USPTA Professional, Miller has coached several All-Americans, including three in a single season at SMU. A 1979 graduate of the United States Naval Academy, Miller served in 18 combat missions in Desert Storm as a Navy F-14 fighter pilot. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from the US Naval Academy before earning his Master's in Information Management from George Washington in 1989. He currently resides in Cherry Hill, N.J. and is a commercial pilot for Delta Airlines.



Francisco Velazquez

Assistant Coach
Saint Joseph's '05 - First Year

Joining the Saint Joseph's coaching staff in 2005-06 is former Hawk standout Francisco Velazquez. The all-time winningest player in program history at both singles (64) and doubles (67), the 2005 SJU grad is the only Hawk to be named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference team four times.



As a senior, he posted an impressive 24-12 doubles mark and was ranked as high as #14 in ITA Region I, while teaming with current Hawk A.J. Garabedian. The duo won the "A" Flight at the Swarthmore Invitational, reached the final of the Princeton Invitational, advanced to the Round of 16 at the ITA Championships and the Round of 16 in the back draw at the Pacific Coast Doubles Championship.

A native of Seroe Patrishi, Aruba, he competes on Aruba's National team and was selected for Team Topsport Elite, the pre-2008 Olympics training program. He was a four-time Aruba men's tennis champion.

Velazquez is currently completing his Master's degree in health education.

Michelle Savage

Assistant Coach
Saint Joseph's '05 - First Year

Michelle Savage, a 2005 graduate of Saint Joseph's, returns to her alma mater to join Al Laveson's coaching staff. The Hawks' captain as a senior, as well as the team's Vasquez Award winner for loyalty, Savage posted 21 singles victories in her four varsity seasons. She was a member of both the SJU Athletic Director's and A-10 Commissioner's Honor Rolls.

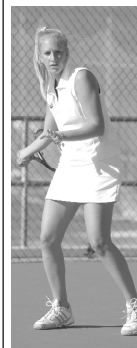

Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk athletic teams since its inception in 1929. Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Just this past summer, bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall.

Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, men's and women's soccer and both men's and women's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

Adjacent to Finnesey Field stand the Finnesey Courts, home to the Hawk men's and women's tennis teams since the late 1940s. Earlier than that, SJU primarily played its home matches at the nearby Narberth courts. When courts were first built on campus, they were located where Bellarmine Hall now stands. Due to Bellarmine's construction in the summer of 1960, however, the Finnesey Courts were torn down and rebuilt in their current location.

After briefly disappearing in the late 1990s due to Mandeville Hall's construction, the courts were refurbished in the summer of 2000 to provide a better playing facility for the athletes. The Saint Joseph's women's tennis team has compiled a record of 71-117 on the courts since 1983.

DIRECTIONS TO FINNESEY COURTS

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Courts are straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for almost half a century, and celebrates its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.

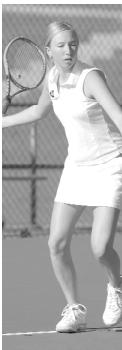

YEAR IN REVIEW



The emergence of several newcomers and the steady play of its upperclassmen made the 2004-05 season another competitive one for the Saint Joseph's women's tennis team. Paced by senior captain Michelle Savage the Hawks posted a 7-9 season record and matched their best Atlantic 10 Conference showing in the past 10 years.

Savage along with juniors Nicole Morrison and Jess Swanderski and sophomore Erika Guers all stepped up their level of competition and responded with successful seasons.

The lone Hawk senior and the team's captain, Savage made the leap from fourth singles to #2 and posted a solid 7-9 record. She also teamed with Guers to go 6-5 at #2 doubles. Consistent throughout her career, the team recognized her with its Vasquez Award for loyalty and dedication.

Guers, coming off a strong rookie season, improved her play as a sophomore. In addition to pairing with Savage she delivered an impressive 8-7 record at fourth singles and was tabbed as the team's Most Valuable Player.

Freshman Gina DiGiacomo proved to be the year's most pleasant surprise. The rookie immediately pushed herself into the lineup and led the team in victories. She finished 2005 with a 9-4 overall singles record, going 3-1 at #6 and 6-3 at #5. She also paired with sophomore Marisa Donelson in doubles to post an 11-3 mark. The tandem started the year 8-0 and finished with a 9-2 mark at #3 doubles and a 2-1 ledger at #2.

A model in the classroom, as well as on the court, Morrison jumped from third singles to the top spot and finished with a 4-11 record. She continued to hold down the #1 doubles position, teaming this season with Swanderski to go 3-9.

Sophomore Alisa Van Meter usually rounded out the Hawk lineup, going 4-5 at #6 singles and occasionally competing in doubles.

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10. The University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Temple University, and Xavier University have formed the foundation of the Atlantic 10 - a foundation which is further strengthened this season with the additions of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte and Saint Louis University.

In 2005-06, the Atlantic 10 Conference celebrates its 30th anniversary season. Although anniversaries are a good time to reflect, this anniversary is a celebration of the future as much as the past.



"It is with pride that we look back at our accomplishments and see how far this league has truly come," says A-10 commissioner Linda Bruno, who begins her 12th season at the helm of the league - the longest tenure of any commissioner in the Conference's history. "More importantly, however, the additions of Charlotte and Saint Louis ensure that the future is brighter than it has ever been. We are adding two members who will greatly enhance the national profile of all our sports and expose our programs to two new markets in which our universities actively recruit. The A-10 has never been as strong as it is now."

The Atlantic 10 Conference, which spans eight states and the District of Columbia with a total population of almost 73 million people, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor

track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

George Washington won its first-ever men's basketball title and represented the Atlantic 10 in the NCAA Tournament. Saint Joseph's and Temple also earned postseason bids with the Hawks reaching the final of the National Invitation Tournament. In women's basketball, the A-10 sent four teams to the postseason as Temple earned the automatic bid by winning its second consecutive Atlantic 10 championship. The Owls were joined by George Washington and Richmond, marking the 11th time in the last 12 years that the A-10 has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Xavier also garnered a postseason berth and advanced to the third round of the WNIT.

Rhode Island won its first-ever A-10 baseball championship and earned its first NCAA berth; in field hockey, Richmond, which was ranked as high as 10th nationally, went unbeaten in Conference play for the second straight year in advancing to the NCAAs; Xavier took the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Men's Golf Tournament, where it was joined by Rhode Island; and Richmond won its first A-10 lacrosse title and the bid to the NCAAs.

The Massachusetts women's rowing team won its 10th straight A-10 title, setting a league record for the most consecutive tournament championships won by any team in any sport. UMass also won the ECAC title; George Washington advanced to the second round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament; Dayton lost in overtime in its NCAA women's soccer opener; Massachusetts won its 17th A-10 softball title to advance to the NCAAs; Richmond represented the A-10 in the NCAA men's and women's tennis tournaments; and Dayton won the Conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.

In all, 374 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 season.

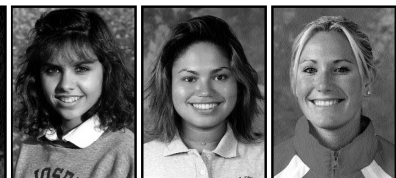
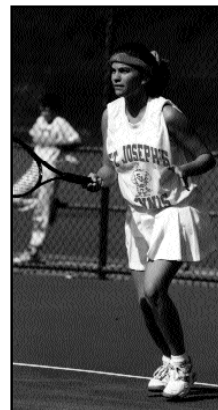
