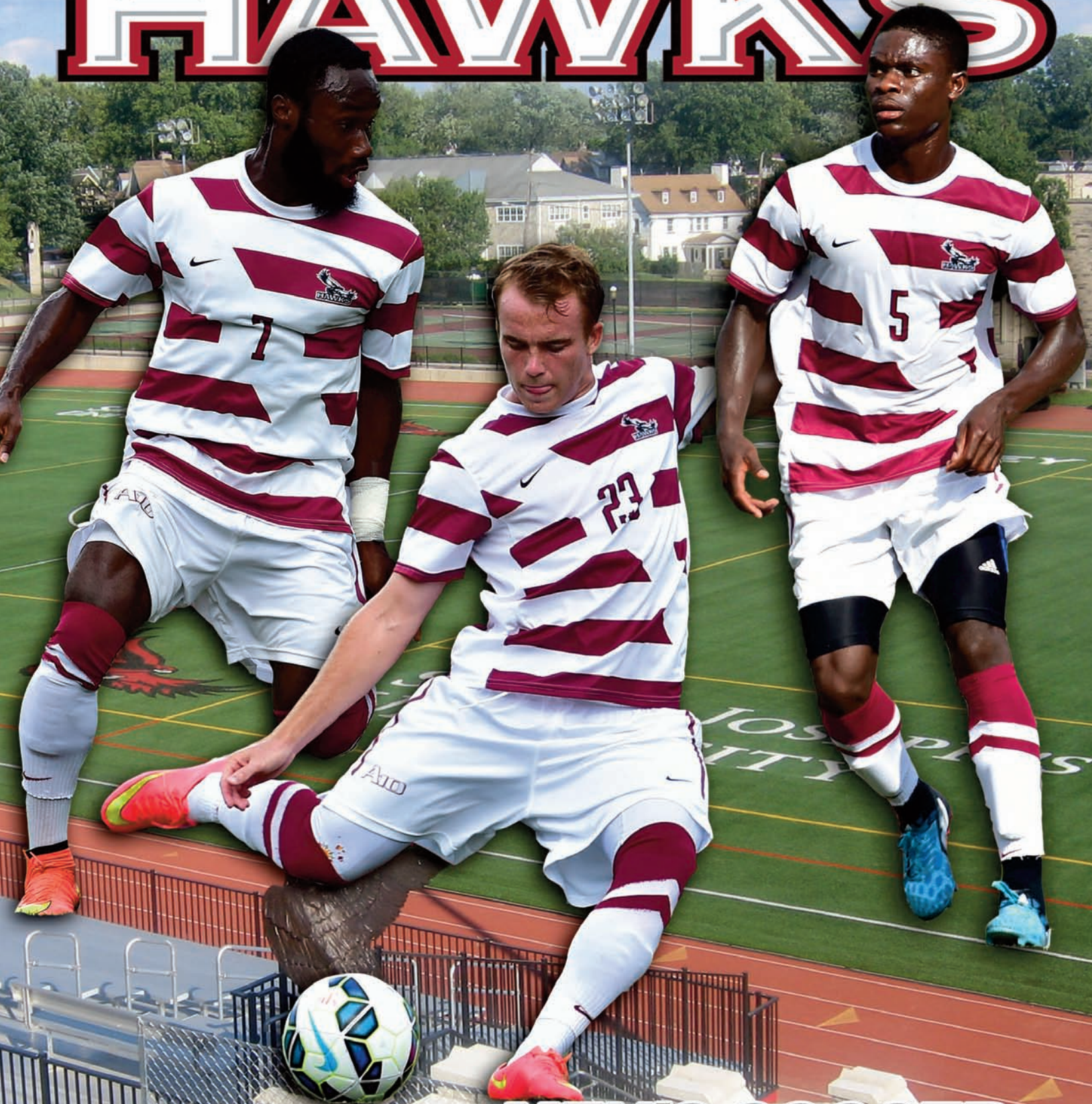

2015 SEASON OUTLOOK



The Saint Joseph's men's soccer squad will open the 2015 season at home this Friday, August 28 against Marist at 5:00 p.m., the first of eight home matches to be played on Sweeney Field this fall. SJU will open Atlantic 10 Conference action at home against Massachusetts on October 3 and will see an even four-home, four-road match schedule for league play. The Hawks were voted 11th in the A-10 preseason poll.

Saint Joseph's returns 19 Hawks, including seven starters and four players that combined for 39 percent of last season's scoring, to the field this fall. Despite the loss of four starters from the 2014 squad, SJU will look to continue on the momentum of last year's seven-win season, the program's highest single-season win total since 2003. Under the direction of sixth-year head coach **Don D'Ambra**, the Hawks return two seniors, nine juniors, and eight sophomores and add 10 newcomers this fall. SJU's only two returnees to have started all 18 matches last season, midfield co-captains **Tim Lazorko** and **Bliss Harris** will lead the Hawks into the 2015 season.

"Timmy is an on-the-field general," said D'Ambra of his senior captain. "He's always talking, communicating, and organizing other guys. What makes him a great player is his soccer IQ. He's very intelligent and sees things before they're going to happen. He's a good player and a good leader, and he can make big plays for us."

"Bliss has just kept getting better each year. He's an engine in the middle and a physical presence. Athletically, he's one of our top athletes on the team. He trains hard everyday, and he's a guy that day-in and day-out is consistently getting it done on and off the field."

OFFENSE

The vacancy of Mike Glazer, Jake Nelson, and Mark Colville – a trio that combined for 61 percent of SJU's goals in 2015 – will need to be filled in 2015. SJU's next two leading scorers from last season also happen to be the Hawks' two seniors this year – Lazorko (2G, 3A) and forward **Emmanuel Temeh** (3G, 2A). With three seasons apiece under their belts, the senior duo will look to lead the Hawks on the offensive end of the field.

A two-time Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Star selection who was listed as one of the top 50 prospects in the Premier Development League this summer, Lazorko returns for his fourth season of patrolling the midfield in 2015. With 54 career starts, Lazorko is the most experienced returnee on the team and owns 34 career points on 11 goals and 12 assists. The versatile Lazorko made the transition from attacking midfielder to defender last season yet still ranked in the squad's top five in goals, assists, and points.

Temeh broke into a starting spot at forward last season, making 12 starts in 17 appearances, and tied for second on the squad in goals (3), assists (2), and points (8). Temeh was the difference maker at LIU Brooklyn, where he tallied the 90th-minute equalizer and overtime match-winner.

Additional forwards up front with Temeh will be junior **Mori Diane** and freshmen **Derek MacKinnon** and **Heriberto Sevilla**.

Diane earned nine starts and 16 total appearances up front last season, and his speed and determination on the pitch will help the Hawks again in 2015.

“He’s a guy that makes things happen because he’s running people over and winning the ball,” said D’Ambra of his junior forward. “He wants to go forward. He’s a guy that can change the pace of the game and create some energy.

“They’re all going to compete well,” added D’Ambra of his group of forwards. “Whoever is doing the best will play. They’re going to be competing, and they know it. They’re all trying to learn and get better. Each of them have different looks and styles of their play, and they have different strengths to their game that might be another forwards’ weakness.”

The returning trio of last season’s starters in junior midfielders Harris, **Sam Irvin**, and **Eric Jordan** will also be expected to bolster the Hawks’ offensive attack this season.

Harris made all 18 starts as a defensive midfielder in 2014, ranking second on the squad in minutes played (1,687) and playing every minute of Atlantic 10 action. Harris tallied assists at Penn and George Washington and played 13 full matches, including five of SJU's six total shutouts against St. Francis (N.Y.), Howard, Drexel, Siena, and UMass.

Irvin made 17 starts in the midfield last season and tallied a goal and assist in SJU’s win over LIU Brooklyn. He played nine full matches, including shutouts against Howard, Drexel, Siena, UMass. Jordan made eight starts before suffering a season-ending injury last year and brings an aggressive spark to the pitch.

“Sam looks really good this year,” said D’Ambra. “In pre-season against UMBC and Penn State, he was our best playmaker. Eric is versatile, so he can be someone we throw up top. He creates through his energy and his ability to win the ball.”

Sophomores **Matt Crawford** and **Mike Akinkoye** are SJU's only two offensive players to have earned starts in their rookie seasons. Crawford led SJU's freshmen in all offensive categories and was SJU's only freshman to score a goal while Akinkoye, a 2014 Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Rookie Team selection, made 15 appearances with three starts on the attack last season.

"Matt will see minutes, and Mike looks very good," said D'Ambra. "Mike is one of the most improved returning guys. He's playing faster and more aggressively. He learned a lot from being on the bench, and he'll get time this year."

Freshman midfielder **Lou Vilotti**, a 2014 NSCAA All-American and 2013 Regional All-American, could also expect to see playing time right away.

"Lou looks very good," said D'Ambra. "He keeps getting better. He's a guy that can challenge to either start or be the first guy off the bench. He's been looking good."

Junior midfielder **Max Pozzessere** and newcomers **Nick Hartwell**, **Kyle Lochbihler**, **Robel Negatu**, and **Trent Taylor** will round out the offensive unit for the Crimson and Gray.

"A lot of what we've been working on is just attacking," said D'Ambra. "We were a very good defensive team in the pre-season, but we lacked creativity in attacking. Hopefully we can get the right mix and get everybody on the same page. We have a lot of options, and creating chemistry is going to be the key."

DEFENSE

The vacancy due to the graduation of last season's starting trio of veterans Nelson, Tommy Brooks, and Brandon Stevis opens three spots on the Hawks' backline in 2015, and filling that hole has been a priority this preseason. Junior **Coupar Lipp**, redshirt sophomore **Ted Foley**, and sophomore transfer **Kevin Lockhart** lead a group of five Hawks that could challenge for starting positions on opening day.

With 16 career matches played over his first two seasons, Lipp brings the most experience to the defensive unit. Lipp appeared in eight matches last season and made the first four starts of the season alongside Brooks, Nelson, and Stevis before being sidelined by injury. After redshirting his freshman season for development and missing his second season due to injury, Foley turned in an impressive spring season will be a welcomed addition to the Hawks' backline this season.

"Coupar looks really good in the back," said D'Ambra. "He's communicating really well and filled the role of Tommy [Brooks] last year. Ted has been our most consistent. He still needs to communicate a little bit better, but Coupar and Ted have been our most consistent players in the back."

Lockhart played his freshman season at LIU Brooklyn in 2013 and will don the Crimson and Gray this fall.

“Kevin looks very good,” said D’Ambra. “He’s a true lefty and likes to attack. He’ll be working as an attacking element out of the back, which we like. He’s physical and aggressive and has come in fit. He’s been working hard each day.”

Junior **Mike Stuski** and sophomore **Ben Zambetti** are also in the mix for starting positions this fall. As a sophomore, Stuski made 14 appearances with two starts on the back line while Zambetti saw 10 games in the midfield as a rookie last year.

“Mike has been getting good playing time,” said D’Ambra. “Ben looks very good; he’s been a nice surprise and has been very steady and consistent.”

Junior **Chris McCrea**, who saw minutes against Army, Marist, and La Salle last season, and sophomore **Tom Santilli** alongside new additions **Andrew Johnstone**, a 6-2 native of Liverpool, England who most recently competed for the U-21 Salford City Football Club, and **Eddie McCusker**, a two-time SJSCA All-South Jersey Defender of the Year, will also compete for playing time in 2015.

GOALKEEPERS

After a strong spring season, starting goalkeeper **Bobby Edwards** returns for his sophomore campaign between the pipes in 2015. A 2014 Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Rookie Team selection, Edwards made 14 starts in 15 appearances last season and posted a 0.99 goals-against average and .776 save percentage to go with four shutouts in 1365:39. Edwards owned a 1.42 GAA and .718 save percentage through all eight A-10 starts.

“Bobby had a good spring season,” said D’Ambra. “He made a lot of good plays. He has been consistent and is very good communicator. He trains very hard and has all of the attributes to be a top Atlantic 10 keeper. Bobby is the guy that has been playing the most consistently.”

Junior **Jay Higbee** posted a 1.75 GAA and .682 save percentage in 360:00 last season, earning four early-season starts against and making five saves in back-to-back starts against St. Francis (N.Y.) and Army. Sophomores **Greg O’Connell** and **Trevor Nicol** will also compete for minutes in net this season.

HEAD COACH



Don D'Ambra Head Coach - 6th Year Saint Joseph's University '94

Don D'Ambra enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Saint Joseph's men's soccer program in Fall 2015. One of the most decorated former SJU student-athletes to be named a head coach on Hawk Hill, D'Ambra was introduced as the fourth head coach in the program's history on April 15, 2010. D'Ambra's current five-year record on Hawk Hill stands as 21-56-12.

In 2014, D'Ambra coached the Hawks to an overall record of 7-7-4 to reach the program's highest single-season win total since 2003. Saint Joseph's jumped out to a 5-1-2 start to kick off the season, which marked the program's best record over its first eight matches since 2002. Over a six-match stretch from September 5-24, the Hawks went 4-0-2, which was the program's longest unbeaten stretch since 1994.

In 2013, D'Ambra led the Hawks to just their third Atlantic 10 postseason appearance in program history and their first since 1994. Saint Joseph's held a scoreless tie with George Mason before the Patriots advanced on penalty kicks. With the draw, D'Ambra coached the Hawks to a 5-8-6 overall record for a .421 winning percentage, the program's highest since 2003, and to a 2-4-3 conference record, marking the first time since 2007 that the men's soccer program had notched more than two league wins in one season.

The 2012 season marked tremendous growth of the Saint Joseph's men's soccer program as the Hawks posted a 5-11-2 overall record while going 1-6-2 in the Atlantic 10. The Hawks recorded the same amount of wins as in their previous three seasons combined en route to putting together a pair of ties late in the season to prevent losses against La Salle and Fordham for the first time since 2008 and 2006, respectively.

In 2011, D'Ambra compiled identical overall and conference records as in his inaugural season, putting together a two-year record of 4-30-0 overall and 2-16-0 in conference play.

In his first season at SJU, D'Ambra led the 2010 Hawks to an overall record of 2-15-0 and 1-8-0 in the A-10 as the squad snapped a 24-game losing streak with a 1-0 win over Iona and won its first conference match since 2008 in a 2-0 victory over Rhode Island.

D'Ambra has coached one Atlantic 10 All-Rookie selection, six Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Stars, five Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Rookie selections, and an Atlantic 10 Academic All-Conference selection.

HEAD COACH



D'Ambra returned to Saint Joseph's after a successful coaching and playing career with the Philadelphia KiXX of the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL). He played a total of 16 seasons in the MISL, the last 14 seasons with the KiXX, and served as team captain, assistant coach, and head coach. In 2002, he assumed duties as the head coach of the KiXX and served as the vice president of soccer operations/head coach until 2009-10. D'Ambra helped the KiXX to two MISL championships, as a player in 2002 and player/coach in 2007. A four-time All-Star selection, D'Ambra is the KiXX's all-time leading scorer with 388 goals and 905 points. In eight seasons as head coach, he totaled 119 wins, the most in the team's history.

While at Saint Joseph's from 1990-94, D'Ambra was a Regional All-America First Team selection and Philadelphia Soccer Seven Player of the Year and remains the only player in Hawk history to earn the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year award, winning it in 1993. D'Ambra holds the SJU career records for goals (41) and points (102), as well as the marks for goals (15) and points (38) in a season, set in 1993. He was inducted into SJU's Men's Soccer Hall of Fame in 2000.

"We are pleased and honored to welcome back Don D'Ambra as our new head men's soccer coach. Don is committed to the SJU mission to enhance the overall student-athlete experience," said director of athletics Don DiJulia. "Don's passion and commitment to excel will encourage the success of our student-athletes and the soccer program from its solid foundation built by his predecessors - Tom Turner, Jack Ruggero and Jack Dunn. He brings energy and a vision for the future of the Hawk soccer program. Don made us proud during his playing days here and will make us even more proud during his tenure as our head coach."

D'Ambra owns a USSF "A" coaching license and has been involved with coaching youth teams, conducting coaching clinics and organizing skills and development programs for over 14 years.

He possesses international playing experience, having been a member of the United States National Futsal Team from 2002 through 2008. With 15 international caps, D'Ambra has participated in the World Championships and the Pan American Games.

D'Ambra replaced Tom Turner, who retired after 23 seasons as the Hawks' head coach and had been an assistant coach on Turner's staff at SJU from 1996-99.

A native of Philadelphia, D'Ambra attended North Catholic High School and graduated from Saint Joseph's in 1994 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and concentration in food marketing. D'Ambra and his wife, Leslie, have three daughters - Samantha, Kylie and Milana.

ASSISTANT COACH



Pat Morris Assistant Coach - Sixth Year Philadelphia University '98

Pat Morris, a former defender with the Philadelphia KiXX, enters his sixth season as an assistant coach on the Saint Joseph's men's soccer staff with former KiXX teammate and coach Don D'Ambra in Fall 2015.

In 2014, Morris helped coach the Hawks to an overall record of 7-7-4 to reach the program's highest single-season win total since 2003. Saint Joseph's jumped out to a 5-1-2 start to kick off the season, which marked the program's best record over its first eight matches since 2002. Over a six-match stretch from

September 5-24, the Hawks went 4-0-2, which was the program's longest unbeaten stretch since 1994.

In 2013, Morris helped coach the Hawks to their first Atlantic 10 postseason appearance since 1994. Saint Joseph's held a scoreless tie with George Mason before the Patriots advanced on penalty kicks. With the draw, the Hawks concluded their season with a 5-8-6 overall record, marking the first time since 2007 that the men's soccer program had notched more than two league wins in one season.

A seven-time All-MISL selection, Morris' professional career spanned 11 years, 10 of which he played for the KiXX. Morris captained the squad for eight seasons en route to earning the MISL's Defender of the Year award twice, in 2005 and 2009. Totalling 150 goals in over 300 career games, Morris helped the KiXX to league titles in both 2001 and 2007. In 2010-11, his final season in the MISL, Morris earned his third MISL Defender of the Year honor with the Baltimore Blast.

In addition to playing for the KiXX, Morris became a Philadelphia KiXX camp instructor in 2001 and a site director after his first two years with the organization.

Morris is a former All-American, Philadelphia Soccer Seven MVP, and four-time All-Soccer Seven selection at Philadelphia University. He graduated in 1998 with a degree in finance and was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A native of Philadelphia, Morris is a graduate of Northeast Catholic High School and former Philadelphia Catholic League MVP. He owns more than 30 international caps as a member of the U.S. National Futsal Team and has participated in the World Championships, Pan-American Games, and a CONCACAF qualifier.





ASSISTANT COACH



Steve Wacker Assistant Coach - Fourth Year Temple University '05

Steve Wacker enters his fourth season as an assistant coach on Hawk Hill in Fall 2015. Wacker played professionally with the MISL's Philadelphia KiXX from 2005-08 and was a member of the KiXX 2007 championship team.

In 2014, Wacker helped coach the Hawks to an overall record of 7-7-4 to reach the program's highest single-season win total since 2003. Saint Joseph's jumped out to a 5-1-2 start to kick off the season, which marked the program's best record over its first eight matches since 2002. Over a six-

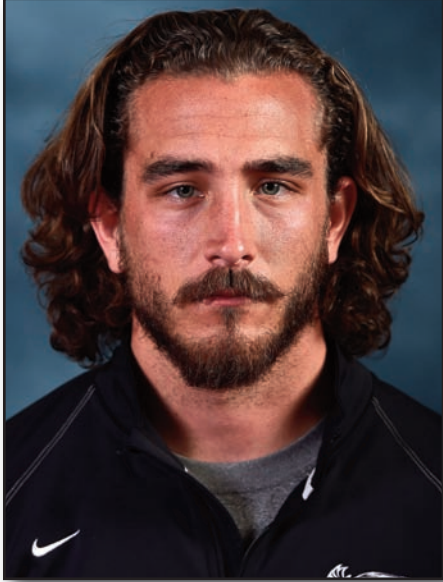
Wacker earned his bachelor's of science degree from Temple University in 2005. At Temple, the Adidas All-American earned multiple Atlantic 10 and Philadelphia All-Soccer honors and was named the 2005 Temple University Male Athlete of the Year. He was also selected as an Academic All-American by ESPN the Magazine and earned the Soccer-Seven Student-Athlete of the Year award, both in 2005.

A graduate of Northeast Catholic High School, Wacker is a former Philadelphia Catholic League MVP and member of the Northeast Catholic Soccer Hall of Fame. He holds a USSF National "C" Coaching License and currently coaches youth soccer for the South Jersey Elite Barons Soccer Academy and trains various teams throughout the Tri-State area.





VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH



Scott Krotee **Volunteer Assistant Coach - Second Year** **Gardner-Webb University '12**

Scott Krotee enters his second season as a volunteer assistant coach on the Saint Joseph's men's soccer staff in Fall 2015. Krotee's primary responsibility includes working with SJU's goalkeepers.

In 2014, Krotee coached Bobby Edwards to Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Rookie Team honors, as well as five weekly accolades between the Philadelphia Soccer Six and Atlantic 10 Conference.

Krotee currently plays professionally for the Harrisburg Heat out of the Major Arena Soccer League and will begin his second season with the Heat this fall.

Krotee signed with the USL Pro's Dayton Dutch Lions on June 2, 2014 and appeared in one match over the summer.

From 2013-14, Krotee competed for the Pennsylvania Roar of the Major Indoor Soccer League. In nine games with the Roar, he posted a .706 save percentage in 346:34 to earn MISL All-Rookie Team accolades.

In 2012, Krotee made appearances with Reading United AC, the MLS's Philadelphia Union player-development partner, in the Premier Development League, with whom he posted a 0.55 goals-against average in 165 minutes in net.

Krotee enjoyed a decorated four-year career as a Division I goalkeeper at Gardner-Webb University from 2008-12. Krotee ranked fifth nationally in total saves (107) and sixth nationally in saves per game (5.94) in his senior season and led the Big South in shutouts as a junior. He graduated with school records for lowest career goals-against average (1.39) and lowest single-season goals-against average (1.10).

A 2012 College Sports Madness All-Big South Preseason Second Team selection, the senior captain was twice named to the Soccer For A Cure All-Tournament Team and earned 2011 Big South Conference Championship All-Tournament Team honors. In 2008, he received the inaugural Wilson Soccer Alumni Association Scholarship and was a member of the Disney Soccer Showcase National Championship squad.

Krotee spent three seasons with Reading United AC U-20 from 2006-09. Prior to that, he was a member of the Olympics Development Program First Team (USA EPYSA) from 2002-04.

Krotee is currently working toward his Master's degree in international marketing at Saint Joseph's. He was recently added to the list of "Top 100 American Goalkeepers Prospects for the 2018 World Cup."

Rob Brown **Director of Soccer Operations - Fifth Year** **Strayer University '09**

Rob Brown enters his fifth season as director of soccer operations for the Saint Joseph's men's soccer program in Fall 2015.

In 2014, Brown helped coach the Hawks to an overall record of 7-7-4 to reach the program's highest single-season win total since 2003. Saint Joseph's jumped out to a 5-1-2 start to kick off the season, which marked the program's best record over its first eight matches since 2002. Over a six-match stretch from September 5-24, the Hawks went 4-0-2, which was the program's longest unbeaten stretch since 1994.

In 2013, Brown helped the Hawks to their first Atlantic 10 postseason appearance since 1994. Saint Joseph's held a scoreless tie with George Mason before the Patriots advanced on penalty kicks. With the draw, the Hawks concluded their season with a 5-8-6 overall record, marking the first time since 2007 that the men's soccer program had notched more than two league wins in one season.

In addition to his duties at Saint Joseph's, Brown is the Conference Services Manager at the Union League of Philadelphia. Brown is responsible for the efficient execution of all banquet event orders assigned or available by creating a warm, friendly, courteous atmosphere for guests and employees. Brown plans and executes a productive shift in all areas of responsibility including room setup and breakdown.

Active in youth soccer, Brown coaches the U-8 Parkwood '07 boys' soccer team. Brown previously guided the FC Bucks United U-12 boys' team to the bronze medal at the 2006 USFF National Championships, among many other tournament championships, as well as an EPYSA State Cup Finals appearance.

Brown previously worked as an assistant coach with the boys' varsity team at William Tennent High School. He also coached the men's and women's soccer teams at Arcadia University and the girls' team at Council Rock South High School, helping the squad to numerous state, district and league titles.

Brown earned an associate's degree in sport management and a bachelor's degree in business management from Strayer University in 2009. He currently resides in Philadelphia with his wife, Tina, and their two children - Max and Julianne.

THE HAWK



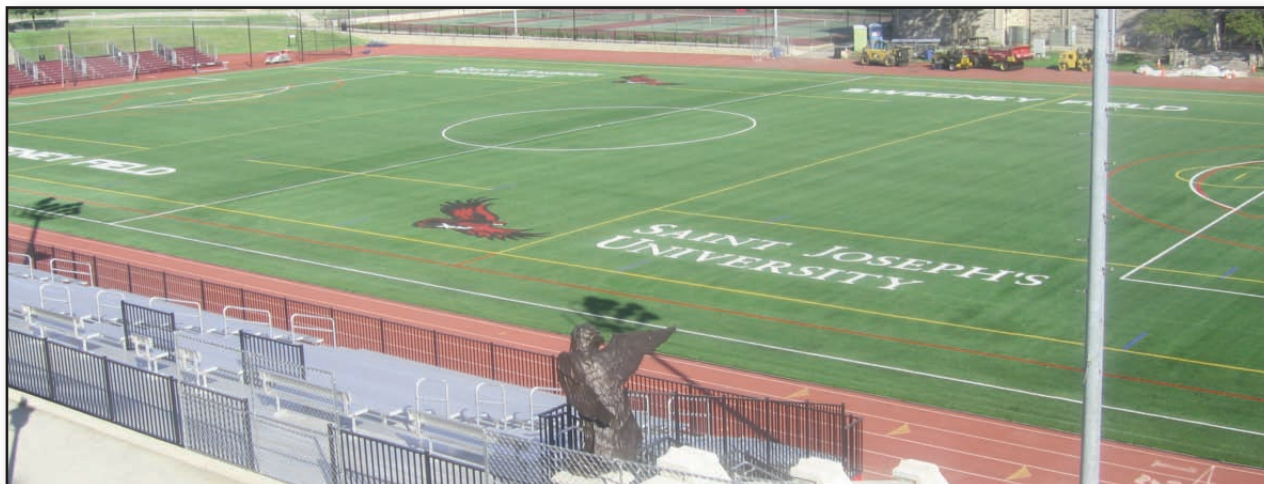
One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk has been flapping its wings for 59 years. The Hawk, which celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06, is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its over 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook*, *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was nominated for the Mascot Hall of Fame in 2008.



SWEENEY FIELD



Sweeney Field, formerly known as Finnesey Field, has been home to 10 different varsity squads at Saint Joseph's University in over 80 years of use. Opened in 1929 as home to the SJU football squad, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years and is the current home of the men's and women's soccer teams and the men's and women's lacrosse teams. The most recent upgrade occurred this summer, as the TigerTurf that was laid down in 2008 was replaced with FieldTurf and Saint Joseph's track was resurfaced.

The field was renamed Sweeney Field in Fall 2013 upon completion of an extensive expansion project. The venue has significantly increased the seating capacity for SJU's varsity lacrosse and soccer programs. The new name recognizes the contributions of Sean S. Sweeney '94 (MBA), a member of the University's Board of Trustees and the lead benefactor to the renovation project. Sweeney Field was blessed in conjunction with Hawktoberfest on October 12, 2013 while a formal dedication will be held this spring

The current expansion includes the addition of 1,200 permanent seats to the hillside nearest to the University's iconic Barbelin Hall as well as the addition of 1,100 portable seats on the opposite side of the field, increasing total seating capacity to 3,000. In addition, the facility includes a new state of the art press box and enhanced sound system.

Opened in 1929 and planned as the centerpiece to a 70,000-seat football stadium, SJU was forced to eliminate the field's original grandstand and hillside seating in

1960 due to the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. Since 1990, the field has undergone a number of upgrades and enhancements designed to expand usage and functionality, including installation of AstroTurf artificial surface prior to the currently TigerTurf surface, lights, and bleachers. Additionally, the track received a new coat of rubber material in 2009 to better suit the athletes who use it for all seasons.

Currently the home of SJU men's and women's varsity soccer and lacrosse teams, Sweeney Field has also served as the home venue for Hawk baseball, field hockey, football and softball, in addition to peripheral usage by the men's and women's track teams, along with countless club, intramural and recreational activities. Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site.

Finnesey Field had been named after the late James T. Finnesey. A native of Wyncote, Pa., parishioner at the Gesu and president of a local auto manufacturer, he was a member of the Saint Joseph's Foundation Committee which was established in 1922 to raise support for the College's relocation to Philadelphia's Wynnefield neighborhood. Finnesey was a lead donor to the stadium project in 1927.

The Saint Joseph's **men's soccer** program was started in 1958 and played every season but one (1960) at Sweeney. The squad has compiled an overall mark of 171-199-37 in 57 seasons at Hawk Hill, the most victories of any program on Sweeney Field. SJU opened its playing grounds with a 6-0 victory over Rutgers-South Jersey in October 24, 1958.

In 1990, artificial turf replaced the grass, making Sweeney a truly multi-purpose facility. In 1994 the installation of lights furthered the use of the grounds, while new bleachers in 2003 on the hill next to Mandeville Hall were another touch of renovation to a historic stadium.

Baseball called Sweeney home from 1947 to 1959. The field hockey team played on Sweeney Field until 2007 and now practices and hosts games on Ellen Ryan Field on the Maguire Campus. The location has also been home to women's soccer since 1996 and the field hockey team wrapped up its last season on Sweeney in 2007. The women's and men's lacrosse squads also call Sweeney Field home.

Overall, the site has seen 1,298 games entering the 2015-16 academic year, and SJU teams put together a total record of 589-650-59

2014 YEAR IN REVIEW



- The Hawks went 7-7-4 overall to post their highest single-season win total since 2003.
- Saint Joseph's jumped out to a 5-1-2 start to kick off the season, the program's best record over its first eight matches since 2002.
- The Hawks concluded their overall road schedule at 4-2-1, scoring 14 of their total 18 goals on the road.
- Over a six-match stretch from September 5-24, the Hawks went 4-0-2, which was the program's longest unbeaten stretch since 1994.
- Seniors **Jake Nelson** and **Mike Glazer** earned Philadelphia Soccer Six All-Star honors while freshmen **Mike Akinkoye** and **Bobby Edwards** were named to the All-Rookie Team.
- Saint Joseph's received Philadelphia Soccer Six weekly honors five times throughout the season as Edwards (3x Rookie of the Week, Defensive Player of the Week) and junior **Mark Colville** (Player of the Week) earned recognition.
- The Hawks went 5-2-3 in the non-conference portion of the season with wins over St. Francis (N.Y.), LIU Brooklyn, Howard, Marist, and Siena. Glazer (St. Francis, Howard) and Nelson (Siena) scored match-winners in the trio of 1-0 victories. Junior **Emmanuel Temeh** scored the 90th-minute equalizer and 104th-minute, overtime match-winner against LIU Brooklyn. The Hawks scored a season-high five goals in their win over Marist, the most goals scored by SJU in a match since 2002.
- The Hawks earned Atlantic 10 wins over UMass (1-0) and St. Bonaventure (2-1). Colville factored into all three scoring plays, scoring the match-winner against UMass and the equalizer against St. Bonaventure and then assisting on the match-winner vs. SBU. The UMass victory marked the first time since 2007 that the program had won its conference opener and marked the first victory over UMass since 1998.

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE



On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country, and is celebrating its 40th anniversary in 2015-16.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 – Davidson College, The University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, George Mason University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University and Virginia Commonwealth University.

The Atlantic 10 was proactive in navigating sweeping conference realignment over the last few years, adding Davidson College, George Mason University and Virginia Commonwealth University. The additions have proven successful with all three institutions winning regular season and tournament championships. The league continues to draw national praise for its decisions during conference realignment in selecting strong academic institutions with basketball-centric, robust athletic programs. The 14 member institutions of the A-10 are united and strengthened by their diversity. Each is extraordinary in its educational mission, whether of a Catholic faith, a private university or a land grant institution. The varied pursuits of each member prove that there are many threads that weave the fabric for a great conference.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of over 76.5 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this year: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving,

men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions, in conjunction with Atlantic 10 Commissioner Bernadette V. McGlade, have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation a successful one. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized 3,029 student-athletes in 2014-15, a record for a 14-team A-10. The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors two student-athletes as the A-10 Scholar-Athletes of the Year. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides \$70,000 in postgraduate scholarships awards to 14 student-athletes, one from each campus.

The Atlantic 10 Conference annually earns high marks in the NCAA Academic metrics. This includes graduating its student-athletes at an 89 percent rate according to the NCAA's most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figures, five percentage points higher than the national average. There were 90 A-10 teams with a perfect 1000 GSR score in the NCAA's 2014 most recent report. The league also had an average Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 985 in 2015, seven points higher than the national average. A record 60 teams were singled out for public recognition for their APR scores by the NCAA this past spring. There were 51 teams with a perfect APR score of 1000 and another 71 teams that scored a 990 in the 2015 report.

Success on the playing field has mirrored the A-10's classroom prowess, with the league earning NCAA postseason bids in each of its 21 sports, including two men's soccer bids and 11 men's and women's basketball bids in 2014-15. Dayton women's basketball made a run to the Elite Eight, challenging eventual national champion UConn in the process, while VCU baseball advanced to the 2015 NCAA Super Regionals.

JACK DUNN

Legendary Jack Dunn, the first-ever coach of the Saint Joseph's soccer team, has done more for the Hawk program than any one individual. The team's head coach from 1958 through 1975, Dunn compiled a career record of 120-57-23 (.658) in his 18 years at the helm, leading SJU to the NCAA Tournament in 1966, 1971 and 1972.

The 76-year-old Dunn played on the 1952 U.S. Olympic team and went on to a long playing career in the old German-American Professional League.

Dunn, who also served as an assistant coach with the Hawks in the mid-90s, was one of 20 inaugural inductees to the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.

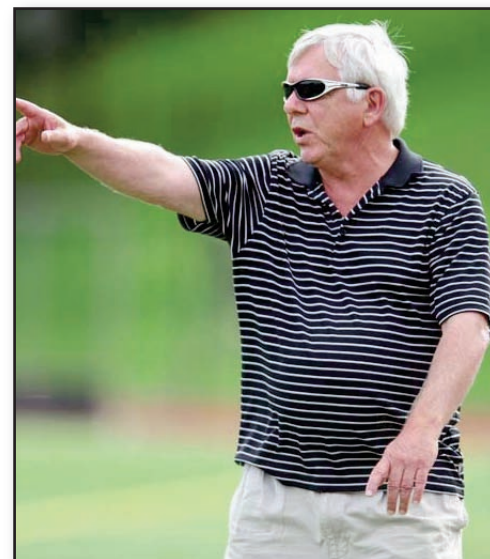

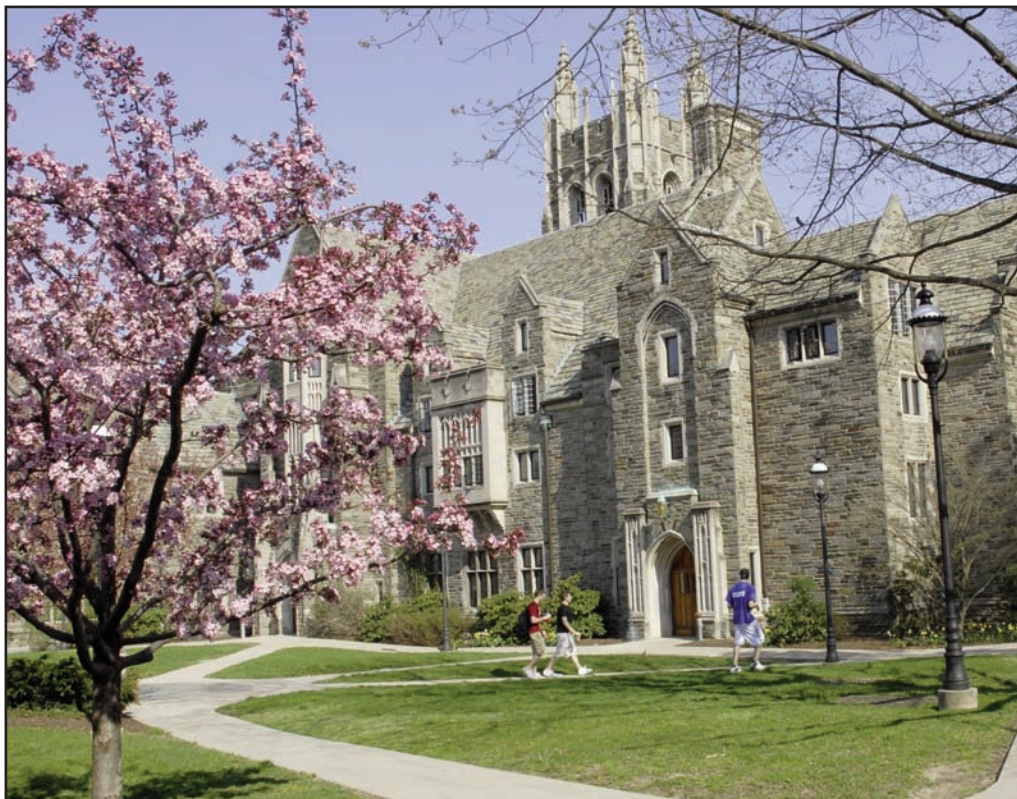
